## Phase 1 – Student Placement

#### Open Enrollment Lottery – April 23, 2013 – 99% placement

- 464 students placed in 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> choice
- 3 students on 1<sup>st</sup> choice waiting list
- 2 students did not meet criteria for school of choice

#### **Registration** - May 13, 2013 – May 24, 2013

- On site registration at current school
- Extended outreach, if necessary



## Phase 1- Student Placement

Maple	100%	Phone calls
M Hopkins	100%	Notice, Phone calls, Mail
Washington	100%	Phone calls, Mail
Fruit Ridge	60%	Notice
J Bonnheim	50%	Notice
CB Wire	29%	Survey

### Phase 1 – Student Placement

#### **Special Education**

- Resource students will receive support at new home school
- Special Day Class students move intact with teacher to new home school- notified April 23
- All equipment and supplies (including technology) will follow the student



# Phase 2 - Planning

#### **Transportation Timeline**

March 2013 Transportation Data collected

April 2013 Evaluate Safe Routes and Stops

May 2013 Student ridership determined

June 2013 Proposed Safe Routes and Stops

Aug. 2013 Parents notified of stops/times

Sept. 2013 Adjustments made based upon actual ridership

All students transported 30 minutes before school for breakfast program

Sept. 2013 Safety Assemblies – receiving sites
