RESOLUTION NO. 2779

RECOGNITION OF NATIONAL TEEN DATING VIOLENCE AWARENESS AND PREVENTION MONTH

WHEREAS, February has been designated as National Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month to highlight the importance of healthy relationships and to raise awareness of available support services, including services available in the Sacramento community; and

WHEREAS, nearly 1.5 million high school students nationwide experience physical abuse from a dating partner in a single year; and

WHEREAS, 1 in 3 girls in the U.S. is a victim of physical, emotional, or verbal abuse from a dating partner, a figure that far exceeds rates of other types of youth violence; and

WHEREAS, girls and young women between the ages of 16 and 24 experience the highest rate of intimate partner violence, at almost triple the national average; and

WHEREAS, nearly 80% of girls who have been physically abused in their intimate relationship continue to date their abuser; and

WHEREAS, only 33% of teens who are in an abusive relationship tell anyone about the abuse; and

WHEREAS, WEAVE Inc. (WEAVE) is a Sacramento nonprofit corporation which provides a variety of direct service and prevention education programs that enable local teens to recognize healthy relationships; and

WHEREAS, WEAVE continues to work with coaches at area high schools who mentor male athletes through the Coaching Boys Into Men Program; and

WHEREAS, WEAVE, in 2013, provided over one thousand youth with information about healthy relationships through school based efforts within the Sacramento City Unified School District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Sacramento City Unified School District Board of Education does hereby recognize February, 2014 as National Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month and supports the important work and services provided by WEAVE and similar organizations throughout the nation.
