#### I. OVERVIEW / HISTORY

Measure R provides funding for the construction of a new Central Kitchen facility. On December 9, 2016 and January 17, 2017 staff presented site design options to the Central Kitchen Taskforce. Following a review and recommendation by the Facilities Committee, the Board was presented with two options. Option #1 includes the construction of a Central Kitchen and a renovation of existing spaces on both the San Joaquin Street and Redding Avenue sites. Option #1 also includes the relocation of Transportation to the San Joaquin property. Option #2 includes the construction of a Central Kitchen on San Joaquin Street. The Board voted on March 16, 2017 to move forward with Option #1.

Staff has completed a financial plan to be presented to the Board.
