**RESOLUTION NO. 3011**

**RECOGNITION OF NATIONAL BIKE MONTH, MAY 2018**

**WHEREAS**, National Bike Month is a chance to showcase the many benefits of bicycling and encouraging communities to give biking a try; and

**WHEREAS**, National Bike to School Day 2018 will be held on May 9; and

**WHEREAS**, National Bike Month is an opportunity to celebrate the unique power of bicycles and an opportunity to come together with diverse stakeholders to raise awareness and inspire new riders; and

**WHEREAS**, The number of bicyclists is growing rapidly from coast to coast. The National Household Travel Survey showed that the number of trips made by bicycle in the U.S. more than doubled from 1.7 billion in 2001 to 4 billion in 2009; and

**WHEREAS**, More than two-thirds of the U.S. adult population is overweight or obese, costing the United States more than \$68 billion in health care and personal costs annually. More than one in four children are also overweight. Researchers found that bicycle commuting is a great way to incorporate regular exercise into a hectic schedule; and

**WHEREAS**, With growing cultural awareness around health, wellness, sustainability, and economic savings, bicycling is seen as a simple solution to many complex problems. The visibility of bicycling and interest in riding is undeniably on the rise; and

**WHEREAS**, The City and County of Sacramento, as well as local nonprofit organizations, are focused on developing more bike-friendly and walkable safe routes to help promote this increasingly popular form of transportation; and

**WHEREAS**, Safe Routes to Schools are a critical step in developing a more robust biking climate within our District.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Sacramento City Unified School District Board of Education does hereby call upon our schools to promote events, programs, and other efforts to encourage more students and families to bike or walk to school; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Sacramento City Unified School District Board of Education directs staff to partner with the City's Vision Zero, WalkSacramento, and other leading partners in the Sacramento region to develop safe, walkable and bikeable routes to school that promote healthy lifestyles and economic growth; and


**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Sacramento City Unified School District Board of Education does hereby call upon our staff to develop and implement a Safe Routes to School policy, and a subsequent Administrative Regulation, to illustrate the District's commitment to this effort.
