<u>Recommendation</u>: Conduct a public hearing of the receipt and use of Tier III funds for fiscal year 2013-14.

Background/Rationale: Assembly Bill (AB) 189 (Chapter 606/2011) modified Education Code Section (E.C) 42605 (c) to require a public hearing separate from the annual adoption of the budget by June 30th of each year. Prior to adoption of the budget, the Board must conduct a public hearing on Tier III programs. There are no new reductions proposed to Tier III programs for 2013-14. In order to have a balanced budget, the same reductions that occurred in fiscal year 2012-13 are maintained for 2013-14.

As a condition of the receipt of Tier III categorical program funds, the Education Code requires that a public hearing be held, before and independent of a meeting where the Governing Board adopts a budget. The external auditors will verify that the public hearing was held in compliance with this statute.

Financial Considerations: The penalty for noncompliance is significant, up to and including the loss of all Tier III funds (\$32.59 million).

I. Overview/History:

Starting in 2008-09, the state provided complete flexibility of approximately 26 formerly restricted state-funded programs. The projected revenue for these programs was \$32.59 million. In balancing the 2010-11 budget, \$15 million was reduced from several Tier III programs. (List of programs attached). Further reductions of \$3.83 million were made in 2011-12 and \$7.375 million in 2012-13. Further reductions and/or eliminations of Tier III programs will not be recommended for fiscal year 2013-14. The reductions from prior years continue for 2013-14.

Assembly Bill (AB) 189 (Chapter 606/2011) modified Education Code Section (E.C.) 42605(c) to require a public hearing separate from the annual adoption of a district's budget. Even though Governor Jerry Brown has proposed a school finance reform model that would eliminate existing categorical programs and flexibility provisions, local educational agencies (LEAs) should follow the provisions of current law until they are actually changed.

The Education Code specifically requires, as a condition of the receipt of Tier III categorical program funds, that a public hearing be held, before and independent of a meeting where the Governing Board adopts a budget. This hearing allows the Board to take testimony from the public, to discuss, and to approve or disapprove the proposed use of funding.

II. Driving Governance:

Education Code Section (E.C.) 42605(c)

III. Budget:

\$26.675 million of formerly restricted programs will transfer to unrestricted resource 0000 for fiscal year 2013-14.

IV. Goals, Objectives and Measures:

Comply with Education Code Section (E.C.) 42605(c) to require a public hearing separate from the annual budget adoption. Promote transparency by providing additional information to the Board and public on expenditures made by the district throughout the last three fiscal years.

Receipt and Use of Tier III Funds Fiscal Year 2013-14

- Education Code Section (E.C) 42605 (c) requires a public hearing on the use of Tier III funds separate from the annual adoption of the budget by June 30th of each year.
- There is a slight increase proposed to Tier III programs for 2013-14.
- The penalty for noncompliance is significant, up to and including the loss of all Tier III funds (\$32.59 million).
