### Note to Parents:

Studying point of view can help students develop compassion and empathy. In class, students are looking at how two characters in the same story experience things differently. This will help students realize that in the real world, their feelings and experiences in a given situation may be different than someone else's in the same situation. You can help your child better understand this concept by discussing characters' points of view and having students consider how they would feel in that character's shoes and why.

### Assignment: Differing Views

In class, we looked at how characters' points of view can be different in the same story. This is true in real life, too. Talk to a parent or family member about a favorite memory you share. Maybe you took a trip together or something exciting happened at home. Tell the story of that memory from your point of view and then have your parent tell the story of that day from his or her point of view.
