Note to Parents:

Students can use clues in their reading to determine the points of view of all of the characters, not just the main character. In class, students are practicing considering how a story would be different if told from another point of view. For instance, what if the story of Cinderella was told from the prince's perspective? How would it be the same? How would it be different? Help your child think about this concept by reading together and noticing the clues that give you insight into how another character is feeling.

Assignment: Flipped Perspectives

Read a story aloud with a parent or family member. Think about the main character's point of view. Discuss the following: What is the main character's point of view, and how do you know?

Look for clues that tell you another character's point of view. With your parent or family member, try to retell the story from this character's point of view. What would be the same? What would be different?
