Note to Parents:

An important part of learning to capture point of view in the stories we tell is being able to share our own points of view with the world. In class, students practiced writing stories from their own lives, capturing their feelings and experiences in those moments. We did this using the “sketch to stretch” method. First, students sketched a scene, adding characters, facial expressions, and speech bubbles to tell the story. Then they wrote out their stories during independent reading. This is a great way to get students’ minds thinking about the details before having them worry about the language.

For homework, keep practicing telling your own stories by drawing another scene from your own life in the box below.
