Pathways Toward Graduation

BP 6146.12 Instruction

Courses of study for secondary grades shall prepare students to meet the requirements and prerequisites for admission to California public colleges and universities and or attain entry-level employment skills in business or industry upon graduation from high school. (Education Code 51228)

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all otherwise qualified students have a timely opportunity, within the four years before graduation, to enroll in each course necessary to fulfill the requirements and prerequisites for admission to California public colleges and universities. (Education Code 51228)

In order to meet individual student needs and encourage all students to complete their high school education, pathways toward graduation will be available to provide flexibility in completing the graduation requirements.

In addition, the course of study for high school students shall include instructions in skills and knowledge for adult life and career technical training. (Education Code 51224)

Guidance services shall be available to help students select courses relevant to their academic needs and future goals.

(cf. 6164.2 - Counseling/Guidance Services)

Any course of study adopted pursuant to this division shall be designed to fit the needs of the students for which the course of study is prescribed. In order to meet individual student needs and encourage all students to complete their high school education, the Governing Board desires to provide flexibility in the completion of prescribed courses in accordance with law. This opportunity will permit a student to enroll in a course of study that best suits his/her educational objectives.

Parents/guardians shall receive information about the learning opportunities offered by the district and their benefits for both the community and the student. (Education Code 51204)
