What is the Consolidated Application?

The Consolidated Application (ConApp) is used by the California Department of Education (CDE) to distribute categorical funds from various state and federal programs to county offices, school districts, and direct-funded charter schools throughout California. Program entitlements are determined by formulas contained in the laws that created the programs.

Parts of the Consolidated Application (ConApp)

- Assurances
- Submission of program and fiscal data

- Spring: (June 30th)
 - Application for funding for upcoming year
 - Fiscal data for Title I, II & III end of year and end of funding cycle
 - Title I Part A Program Improvement Information end of year
 - Title I Parent Involvement Assurances
 - Projected Student Counts
 - Plans for Title I & EIA funding in upcoming year

ConApp Submission Timeline

- Fall: (October)
 - Student data (actuals)
- Winter:
 - Final district allocations with required and allowed budgeting
 - Final school data with distribution of funds to schools
 - Mid year fiscal reports



Consolidated Application Spring 2013

Annually, in June, each local educational agency (LEA) submits the Spring release of the application to document participation in these programs and provide assurances that the district will comply with the legal requirements of each program.

Application to Receive Supplemental Federal and State Funding

- **Title I Part A - to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach minimum, proficiency.**
- **Title I Part D - To improve educational services for children and youth in local and throughout state institutions for neglected or delinquent children and youth so that such children and youth have the opportunity to meet the same challenging state academic content standards and challenging state student academic achievement standards that all children in the State are expected to meet.**

Application for Funding

- **Title II Part A: to increase the academic achievement of all students by helping schools and district (1) improve teacher and principal quality through professional development and other activities and (2) ensure all teachers are highly qualified.**
- **Title III: to ensure English learners in California, attain English proficiency, develop high levels of academic attainment in English, and meet the same challenging state academic standards as all other students.**

Application for Funding

- **Economic Impact Aid (EIA):** provides supplemental funds to support (1) additional programs and services for English learners (EL) and (2) compensatory education services for educationally disadvantaged students.

EIA will be eliminated if the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) is passed by State Legislature
