Sacramento County is one of five counties in California to implement the Voter's Choice Act, expanding voting opportunities for all Sacramento County residents. Beginning with the June 2018 election, all registered voters will receive a ballot in the mail and polling places will be replaced with Vote Centers. Big improvements are coming to elections in Madera, Napa, Nevada, Sacramento, and San Mateo counties in 2018 thanks to the California Voter's Choice Act. In 2018, all registered voters in these counties will automatically be sent a ballot 28 days prior to Election Day. Voters will be able to return their ballot by mail, deliver it to a drop-off location, or cast it in-person at any vote center in the county.
