In Sacramento City Unified, we use:         Moving into English (K-3), Avenues (4-6), English to a Beat (Newcomers in K-6), Open Court English Learner Support Guide (K-6), High Point (7-8) and Visions (9-12)</li> <li>With the new system, integrated ELD and Designated ELD are both used to help students in their respective needs. Examples of Integrated ELD and Designated ELD were shown.</li> <li>SCUSD has already created a 3-year implementation plan and begun providing professional learning for teachers, principals and district leaders</li> <li>SCUSD plan to expand professional learning and revise the SCUSD EL Master Plan to reflect recommended changes for the instructional and professional development programs</li> <li>We need parent/community committee's participation in helping to revise the master plan</li> <li>You can find out how the ELAC at your child's school can help with the transition to the new model of ELD.
