- Carver is a public Waldorf high school. Its developmentally based curriculum meets the UC A-G requirements
- Carver is home to 300 students and growing.
- Half of Carver teachers have a Master's degree or higher.
- 50% of 12th graders take one or more college classes during their senior year.
- Carver offers five classes for college (ACE) credit or 15 units.
- 90% of Carver graduates go on to college. 50% go to a four year college or university.
- There are 12 clubs on campus—archery, backpacking, speech and debate and drama, for example.
- Carver is home to the Access Sacramento Cable Studio TV satellite studio.
