I. Overview of 2011-2012 Assessment and Accountability Results:

The information presented in the Elementary and K-8 Schools data report reflects information collected for 58 schools, which included Freeport and John Still Elementary and John Still Middle.

Sacramento City Unified School District currently operates 49 elementary schools; A.M. Winn, Abraham Lincoln, Bowling Green McCoy, Bowling Green Chacon, Bret Harte, Camellia Basic, Caroline Wenzel, Cesar E. Chavez, Clayton B. Wire, Collis P. Huntington, Crocker/Riverside, David Lubin, Earl Warren, Edward Kemble, Elder Creek, Ethel I. Baker, Ethel Phillips, Fruit Ridge, Golden Empire, H. W. Harkness, Hollywood Park, Hubert H. Bancroft, Isador Cohen, James Marshall, Jedediah Smith, John Bidwell, John Cabrillo, John Sloat, Joseph Bonnheim, Maple, Mark Hopkins, Mark Twain, Matsuyama, Nicholas, Oakridge, O.W. Erlewine, Pacific, Parkway, Peter Burnett, Phoebe A. Hearst, Pony Express, Sequoia, Susan B. Anthony, Sutterville, Success Academy, Tahoe, Theodore Judah, Washington, William Land, Woodbine and eight K-8 schools Alice Birney Waldorf-inspired, Caleb Greenwood, Fr. Keith B. This report provides an overview of Elementary and K-8 schools data on the following indicators: The California Standards Tests (CST) are designed to assess students' achievement of California's academic content standards in English Language Arts, mathematics, science and history/social science. California Modified Assessments (CMA) allow students who have an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) and are receiving grade level instruction and are not likely to achieve grade level proficiency within the year covered by the IEP to demonstrate their achievement of the content standards in core areas. These tests, along with the California Alternate Performance Assessment (CAPA), designed for students with significant cognitive disabilities, and the Standards-based Tests in Spanish (STS), designed for Spanish-speaking English Learners in U. S. schools for less than 12 months, form the basis of the California Standardized Testing and Reporting program (STAR). Students are expected to meet the California standards in English Language Arts, Math, Science and History/Social Science performance levels are used to measure student achievement. These are Advanced, Proficient, Basic, Below Basic and Far Below Basic. The expectation for meeting standards is that students achieve Advanced or Proficient levels.

II. Driving Governance:

Pillar I (College and Career Ready Students) of the Districts Strategic Plan 2010-2014 requires that we continue to raise the achievement bar for all students in the district. "We will provide students with a relevant, rigorous and well-rounded education that includes 21st-century career exploration, visual and performing arts and that meets four-year college and university requirements. Our goal is for all schools to hold students to the Elementary and K-8 academic expectations."

III. Results:

In 2012, in the area of English Language Arts at the K-8 level, overall students scored 60% in ELA an increase of 4%. Schools showing the highest gains from 2011 to 2012 include: Alice Birney Waldorf-Inspired 5% gain and John Still with a 3% gain. All other K-8 schools remained flat or increased by 1%. At the elementary schools the following showed the highest gains: Yav Pem Suab (15%), William Land (13%), Theodore Judah (13%), Edward Kemble (10%), Collis P. Huntington (9%), A.M. Winn and Father Keith B. Kenny (8%), and Freeport 6%). Schools showing the greatest decline include: John D. Sloat (-13%), Susan B. Anthony (-8%), O.W. Erlewine (-6%), Mark Twain (-6%) and Mark Hopkins (-5%).

In the area of mathematics for students at the K-8 level, overall students scored 62% an increase of 4%. Schools showing the highest gains from 2011 to 2012 include: Alice Birney Waldorf-Inspired (9%), and Language Academy (8%). Schools showing the largest declines include: Leonardo Da Vinci (-9%), Genevieve F. Didion (-2%), and Caleb Greenwood (-2%). At the elementary level students scored 59% in mathematics, a 2% decreased from 2011. Schools showing the largest gains include: Yav Pem Suab (14%), Woodbine (10%), Freeport (9%), Success Academy (9%), Language Academy (8%), Fr. Keith B. Kenny (6%), and Edward Kemble (6%). Schools showing the largest declines include: John Sloat (-22%), Mark Hopkins (-17%), Washington and O.W. Erlewine (-15%), Susan B Anthony (-13%), Pacific (-10%), Nicholas (-8%), Isador Cohen (-8%), Elder Creek (-7), and Golden Empire (-6%).

In the area of science, 5th grade students at the K-8 level scored overall 52% an increase of 5%. Schools showing the highest gains from 2011 to 2012 include: Language Academy (26%), Leonardo de Vinci (5%), and Alice Birney (3%). Schools showing the largest decline include: Genevieve F. Didion (-11%), Martin Luther King Jr. (-8%), and Caleb Greenwood (-4%). At the elementary level, the following schools showed the largest gains: Washington (22%), Abraham Lincoln (20%), Maple (21%), Earl Warren and James Marshall (17%), Sutterville (16%), William Land (15%), Mark Hopkins (14%), David Lubin (13%), Ethel Phillips (12%) and Bret Harte (10%).

IV: Sample District Initiatives:

ELA Common Core

SCUSD began implementation of the ELA Common Core State Standards intended to better prepare students for college/career. Using an inquiry-based methodology, 177 teachers engaged in two series of high-quality professional learning. Participants in the first series focused on developing interim assessments aligned to the ELA Common Core State Standards. The second series consisted of 19 Early Implementation schools, whose work helped to inform scalability and sustainability.

The content of the professional learning focused on understanding the ELA standards for reading informational and literary texts, writing, and the three writing genres (narrative, expository, and argumentation).

Evidence and Results

Student work samples, instructional plans, teacher reflection and CST data were used to determine the impact of implementation and revealed the following:

- Teacher continuous analysis of student work reflected an increase in the volume and quality of student writing in response to reading. Students were better able to support their responses to open-ended questions with evidence from texts, as well organize their ideas with topic sentences and conclusions.
- Teachers grew in their ability to develop standards aligned tasks and instructional plans.
- Written reflections by teachers participating in the project revealed that the work is having a significant and profound impact on their beliefs about what their students can do; expectations of their students and their own teaching practice.
- 2011-12 CST results indicated that the work had a positive impact on student performance. Seventeen of 19 early implementation schools demonstrated gains on the ELA CST. For example CP Huntington improved by 9.2%, Rosa Parks showed a gain of 12.7%, and Fern Bacon increased by 15.7%. School leaders attributed the increases to their teachers' engagement in the Common Core implementation.

EL Focus Schools:

Seven elementary schools were selected to be English Learner (EL) Focus schools due to the large percentage of ELs they serve. The schools participated in specialized professional development focused on building teachers' understanding of how to scaffold rich interactions in content area classes to accelerate students' acquisition of academic English and of subject matter content. The sessions were designed to improve teacher capacity to serve English learners with excellence and rigor.

V. Next Steps:

- Continue to monitor, disaggregate and discuss data with site staff in order to inform instruction, interventions and programmatic changes.
- Continue the adoption of the ELA Common Core State Standards wherein sites will examine the standards and design rigorous instructional plans including classroom based assignments.
- Pilot benchmark assessments that are aligned to the ELA Common Core State Standards.
- Begin the implementation of the Mathematics Common Core State Standards by building teacher and leadership capacity to strategically provide meaningful learning experiences that support students' acquisition of deep conceptual mathematical understanding.
- Create models of practice for Inclusive Practices at the Early Implementation sites.
- Continue to provide ongoing professional development and support to the Early Implementation and expanded sites as related to Inclusive Practices.
- Continue the work of the Attendance office in addressing chronic truancy.

- Continue extended learning opportunities at the Priority Schools both during the school day, and after school opportunities.
- Continue to support the implementation of the School Improvement Grant (SIG) grant at Oak Ridge Elementary School.
- Continue to support the City year program at the Priority Schools and ensure that City Year personnel support the academic programs, as well as, in the after school programs.
- Ensure that instructional initiatives at the Priority Schools are deeply embedded in the teaching practices of the school, and ensure that the professional learning opportunities further develop and support the instructional initiatives.
- Working through the Principal Networks dialog with other principals about Best Practices currently being implemented at priority schools.
- Using the Principal Network model, provide opportunities for principals to observe priority schools in an effort to begin replication of Best Practices.
