On Wednesday, June 13<sup>th</sup>, the District held a community meeting to receive input and to share potential options for students desiring to continue a visual and performing arts program next year. Approximately 95 people were in attendance.

Tom Barentson, Deputy Superintendent/CFO chaired the meeting.

Highlights of the meeting are as follows:

At this time, there are four potential options for a visual and performing arts program (listed in no particular order). One option is to develop a dependent charter school at a different site or sites. Another option is to filter the visual and performing arts program into already existing small learning communities located at one or two district schools. A third option would be to admit VAPAC students into various district schools under a regular academic program. A final option, which is subject to negotiations and modifications, is to maintain a VAPAC-like program utilizing District employees and administration.

Another meeting for VAPAC Parents/Guardians and Students has been scheduled for Thursday, June 28th from 6:00 – 7:30 p.m., at the Serna Center Community Room, 5735 47<sup>th</sup> Avenue. A Spanish translator will be available. At this meeting, parents and students will have the opportunity to meet with a counselor and review transcripts, grades and credits. Transcripts will be available at this meeting. Please call 1-888-484-8222 by Tuesday, June 26<sup>th</sup> if you are interested in meeting with a counselor. Please state your child's name and their grade level.

<u>Several parents asked about summer school options</u>. This is a reminder that summer school begins on June 25<sup>th</sup> and ends August 2<sup>nd</sup>.
