Comment:	<p>Dear Sacramento Unified School District Superintendent and Board Members:</p> <p>This letter is in response to the upcoming Board Members Meeting scheduled to discuss COVID-19 vaccines and masking for all students 12 years and older in order to be able to participate in in-person education within the Sacramento City Unified School District (SCUSD).</p> <p>As a resident of Sacramento County, I object, on a legal, scientific, and moral basis, to such a proposed COVID-19 vaccine requirement, and ask SCUSD to reject this proposed resolution immediately.</p> <p>California Health & Safety Codes: First and foremost, SCUSD does not have the legal authority under California law to mandate a vaccine as a condition for in-person school attendance. Specifically, there is a list of ten childhood immunizations required in order for students to gain admittance to public or private schools in California at certain stages of their education, and this list does not include any COVID-19 vaccines. See Cal. Health & Safety Code § 120335(a)(1)- (10). Under California Health & Safety Code § 120335(a)(11), only the</p> <p>California Department of Public Health (CDPH) can add a new vaccine to this childhood immunization schedule, and at this time, CDPH has not done so. California law does not allow individual public schools or school districts to unilaterally decide which additional vaccines its students must take prior to being allowed to enjoy an in-person public education, an education guaranteed by our California Constitution, Article IX.</p> <p>Moreover, even if the CDPH elected to mandate a COVID-19 vaccine under Section 120335(a)(11) for all relevant California public schools, California law also requires that both medical and personal belief exemptions be allowed. See Cal. Health & Safety Code § 120338.</p>

Accordingly, any unilateral COVID-19 mandate that SCUSD purports to impose on its students, and particularly without allowance for medical and personal belief exemptions, is illegal under California law and is also unconstitutional on its face.

Emergency Use Authorization and Liability: Second, while neither CDPH nor our state legislature has mandated any COVID-19 vaccine for public or private school attendance, neither authority can do so while the vaccines are still under emergency use authorization. 21 U.S.C. § 360-bbb-3. This EUA statute explicitly states that anyone to whom an EUA product is administered must be informed of the option to refuse the product, as well as the risks and benefits of receiving it. Although the FDA has purportedly approved one of the mRNA vaccines, in reality, the approved vaccine, the Pfizer Comirnaty vaccine, is not available or in widespread circulation in the United States. Instead, the only COVID-19 vaccines being offered to members of the public in California, including students 12 years of age or older, are still under emergency use authorization, including the Pfizer Biontech COVID-19 vaccine product. There is consequently no full approval of any COVID-19 vaccine that is available for students of any age in California. In addition, all COVID-19 vaccines, including the Pfizer Comirnaty vaccine, remain authorized only under emergency use for ages 5-15, and thus no public entity can mandate such an experimental vaccine for students in that age range. If neither CDPH nor our state legislature can currently mandate these vaccines due to federal EUA law and federal preemption

issues, clearly SCUSD cannot unilaterally mandate an experimental use COVID-19 vaccine for its students either.

Finally, it should be noted that under the Federal Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness (PREP) Act, all COVID-19 vaccine makers are provided immunity from liability for their products. However, SCUSD and any schools attempting to mandate an experimental use vaccine or even an FDA approved vaccine that such school lacks authority to mandate under our Health & Safety code will certainly open themselves up for lawsuits if a student is injured by an unlawfully mandated COVID-19 vaccine.

It is also unclear why SCUSD believes that mandating a COVID-19 vaccine will do anything to prevent the spread of COVID-19 on school grounds. As clearly stated in all COVID-19 vaccine manufacturers' materials, the vaccine clinical trial endpoints for all three vaccines were to reduce hospitalization and death by reducing the symptoms of the disease in the person taking the vaccine product. None of these vaccine products were analyzed for transmission or prevention of SARS-COV-2 infection. The delta variant is now the dominant variant in California.

The CDC has made it clear in recent weeks that vaccinated persons can transmit the delta variant and might even possess higher viral loads than those who were not vaccinated, particularly those who have already naturally recovered from COVID-19. Since none of the

vaccine products prevent infection or transmission, choosing to get a COVID-19 vaccine must remain an individual and personal health choice. There is no clear benefit for

imposing and mandating an experimental vaccine that does not prevent infection or transmission onto otherwise perfectly healthy children.

At this point, those who are vaccinated have presumably protected themselves against severe COVID or death. Those who have made the choice not to get vaccinated are no different from those who are vaccinated, other than if they get the disease, they risk possibly getting sicker than those who are vaccinated who get COVID. As numerous studies indicate, and public health authorities acknowledge, children are at little risk of developing severe COVID-19.

Accordingly, requiring any COVID-19 vaccine, especially among student populations in middle and high school, is not the answer, and it appears to be an unethical and unscientific way to use children as a shield to protect segments of the adult population – who already have the option to be vaccinated.

In conclusion, we ask SCUSD to reconsider any intention to try to mandate experimental COVID- 19 vaccines on our children.

Mandating these vaccines may result in prompt legal action against this school district for exceeding its lawful authority.

CALIFORNIA & US FEDERAL CONSTITUTION: NOTES

Cal. Const. Article 9, Section 5: guarantees a system of free schools to children K-12. The right to a public education in California is a fundamental right fully guaranteed and protected by the California Constitution.

Privacy – All people are by nature free and independent and have inalienable right including the right to enjoying and defending life and liberty, acquiring, possessing, and protecting property, and pursuing and obtaining safety, happiness, and privacy.

- Right to family (or not) – abortion,
- Right to marry – interracial, same sex,
- Right to decline medical treatment or to die,
- Right to dictate the health and education of your children,

Religion – Free exercise and enjoyment of religion without discrimination or preference are guaranteed Equal Protection – that a state may not “deny to any person within its jurisdiction the

equal protection of the laws.”

Due Process – “A person may not be deprived of life, liberty, or property without due process of law or denied equal protection of the laws.” The 14th Amendment protects a parent’s right to direct the educational upbringing of their child. Students have a “legitimate entitlement to a public education as a property right.”

Examples:

- Statute that prohibited the teaching of foreign language, and a state statute that required all students to attend public schools, as opposed to private schools, violated the 14th Amendment. See Meyer v. Nebraska and Pierce v. Society of Sisters.

- Statute that required Amish children to attend school past the eighth grade violated the substantive due process rights, and the religious freedom rights, of Amish parents to direct the educational and religious upbringing of their children. See Wisconsin v. Yoder.

Comment:	<p>Here is the message I was sent yesterday by my college district: “As regional public health conditions continue to improve, it is encouraging to see local and state public health agencies begin to ease COVID-19 restrictions. The latest changes come in the area of masks and face coverings, where both the California Department of Public Health and the Sacramento County Public Health Department have ended mask mandates and instead are now “strongly encouraging” everyone to wear masks, particularly those who are at a higher risk of contracting or becoming seriously ill from COVID-19.</p> <p>Throughout the pandemic, we have made policy decisions based on guidance provided by public health experts, and as such effective Monday, March 14, 2022, masks will be strongly recommended, but not required in all district facilities, regardless of your vaccination status. Los Rios strongly supports any student or employee’s choice to continue wearing masks if it makes them more comfortable.”</p> <p>Throughout the pandemic, I have advocated for policy decisions to be based on guidance by public health experts. We can’t pick and choose only the parts of the guidance that make us comfortable. Fear is subjective. If we start to make decisions based on emotions, ignorance, or politics, all of our sacrifices have been lost. If the guidance changes, the masks may come back. My children will initially remain masked because that is what makes me comfortable, but I don’t want to impose my comfort level on other families. I also wish the district would enforce the vaccine for those that do not have medical exemptions. Again, it is not new to require vaccines before entry in to public school and it is disappointing that this is not being enforced.</p> <p>I know these are difficult decisions. Please base SCUSD policy on the advice of public health experts, including epidemiologists. Our daily case rate is now in the green according to the CDC. This is great news. I know many people are stuck emotionally in the early days of the pandemic and they will need help to get unstuck. They may even need mental health supports. I hope the district can ramp up advertising any mental health supports for students and staff, and provide more targeted education on the reality of the risks. I also hope the district can offer robust independent studies for those families who can’t or don’t want to enter public spaces where people will not be masked . I remember what it felt like when my children couldn’t be vaccinated. I have close friends that can’t be vaccinated, and many family members who don’t trust the vaccine, refused to mask and almost died when they got COVID. Some did not make it. Personally, if my children weren’t vaccinated, I would still be sending them to school masked because the benefits far outweigh the actual risks. That would be our choice, based on the research and public health guidance. I am not a public health expert and neither are any of you, so the best we can do is follow the science and make decisions based on the guidance of scientists and public health experts. Comment:	<p>Last week there was an NPR interview with several epidemiologists about when they would feel comfortable unmasking. Answers varied; some will feel comfortable unmasking in public when the case rate is at 10/100000, others will feel better when it's 1-5/100000. One was more concerned about a test positivity rate of about 1%.</p> <p>Sacramento's test positivity rate last week, according to the Sacramento County Public Health Epidemiology COVID-19 Dashboards, was 22.4. The case rate in Sacramento County is 10.4.</p> <p>While the ZIP code where my own kids go to school is among the lowest transmission ZIP codes in the area, and I can see why parents might be ready for a change, I also feel compelled to advocate for my students, who live and attend school in the highest transmission ZIP code. There have been over 450 new transmissions in the last 30 days. It is still spreading where my students live, work, and go to school.</p> <p>If you make the decision I think you are about to make, you are going to ONCE AGAIN put poor, Black and brown students' health at risk because the risk to rich white kids is lower.</p> <p>I hope you can feel good about that. Comment:	<p>It is time to remove the mask requirements for students.</p> <p>There is no justifiable reason to keep it.</p> <p>Transmission at schools and between students is extremely low.</p> <p>COVID risk to children is extremely low in general (in fact lower than a vaccinated senior).</p> <p>The omicron variant is the most contagious, and traditional cloth masks being worn by the majority of students (and staff) provide little to no benefit to the wearer or others.</p> <p>If we are not willing to both require and provide high quality masks (N95 or KN95) and the proper fit testing and instruction on use, we have no justification in continuing to ask students to wear a mask. This sends our children the message that science and research (which in these cases show cloth masks are ineffective, and that risk to children is extremely low) are not useful tools, but rather that emotions and feelings should be valued more in important decisions even if they suggest we ignore facts.</p> <p>The beauty of masks being recommend but not required is that families and students can make their own decisions and represent their own values as they would like. Children with autism, neurodevelopmental disorders or sensory processing disorder are prone to agitation and severe anxiety; covering up their face puts them in a fight-or-flight zone. Therefore, they don’t have full access to their education, and their rights under IDEA are denied. 4. Masks are ineffective. Children are touching their faces and the masks all day long with dirty hands, or even worse, drop them on the floor, pick them up and wear them again. Can you please explain the protection a dirty mask offers to anyone? 5. Data shows that covid19 virus is less dangerous to children than the flu. The survival rate for 0-14 years old is 99.9998%? My son; like so many others now, has naturally-acquired immunity to COVID. Natural immunity should not be ignored and should be treated the same as those who've been vaccinated. Have the same amount of virus as those who are unvaccinated, and 3. Can likely to transmit the virus as easily as those who are unvaccinated. But the biggest takeaway from this news is not just that we should stop treating vaccinated people different from unvaccinated people. It's that we can finally admit that the virus isn't going away, and that restrictions like masks are pointless. Amesh Adalja, an infectious disease expert at John Hopkins, stated: "And to what end are we wearing masks for? COVID is not a disease that can be eradicated or limited, and we will always have cases. The goal was to make it a manageable respiratory illness, and it is so in many places where enough high-risk individuals have been vaccinated." We're told our kids have to wear masks because they are at risk from COVID, but the data shows their risk is less than from other respiratory viruses like influenza: 1. The CDC estimates 332 children have died from COVID-19 in 18 months. 2. The CDC also estimates 434 children died from influenza during the 12 month 2019-20 flu season 4 and 600 children died from influenza during the 2017-18 season5 – more deaths despite a widely administered vaccine and lower case rates. 3. The New York Times found children are about 10 times more likely to die in a car accident than from COVID. 4. The Financial Times found children at less risk from COVID-19 (0.0002%) than vaccinated adults. So please explain why are we forcing our children to wear masks, kicking them out of school for weeks and testing them for dead virus when they have no symptoms to avoid a virus no worse than influenza? We're told they must wear masks to slow the spread of COVID-19, but numerous studies show that schools without mask requirements foHave you read these studies? Have you asked the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) why, of all the safety measures they recommend – symptom screening, ventilation, spacing, hand hygiene and testing – the only one they require is the one with the least evidence to support it? Do you wonder why at least 40 states in the US don't require masks in school?13 Or perhaps you remember that California was 50th in the US in reopening schools,14 so you already know that California does not follow the science. So again, our question to you is when will these restrictions end? CDPH says kids must wear masks even if there are 0 community cases and 100% vaccination rates. For them, this will never end. Your job is to tell them that it's over and not engage with them in this pointless war against a virus that will never go away.
