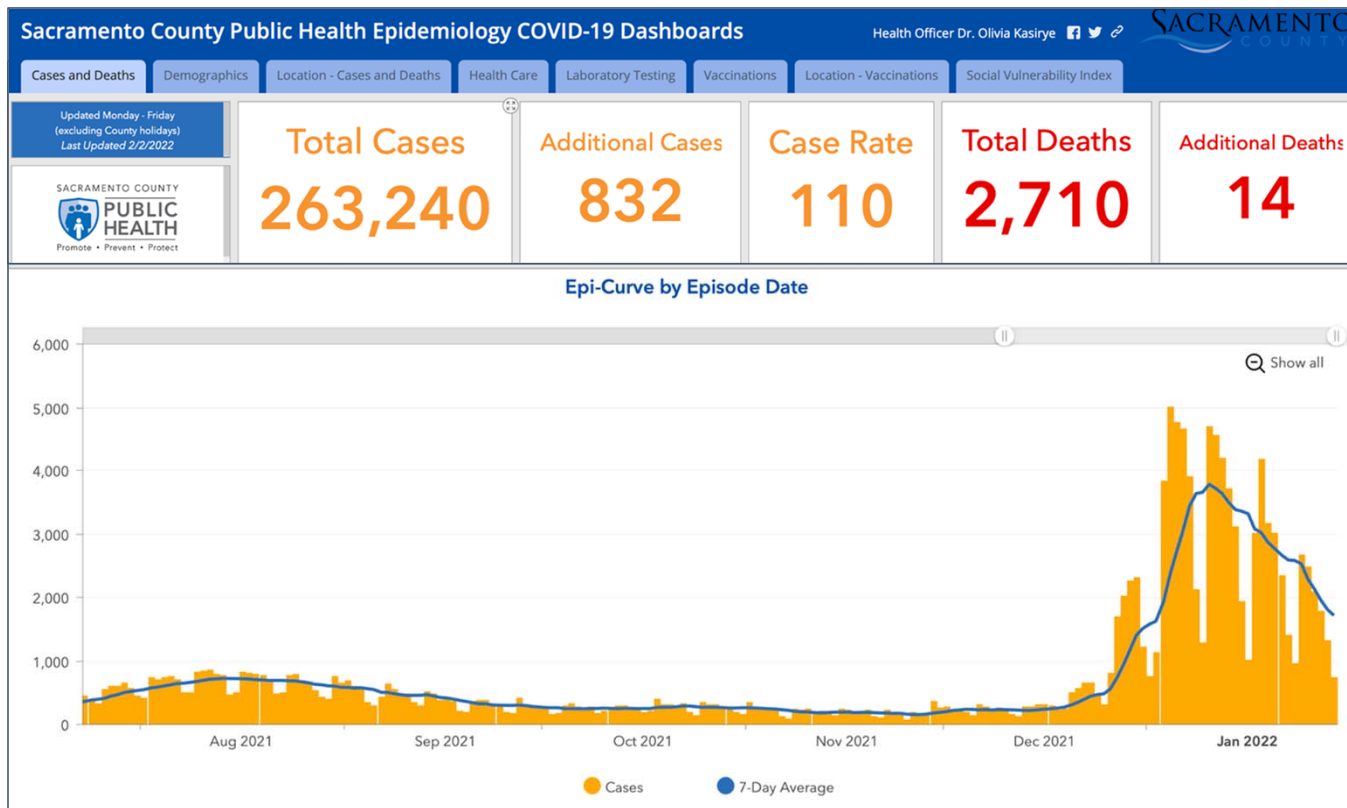

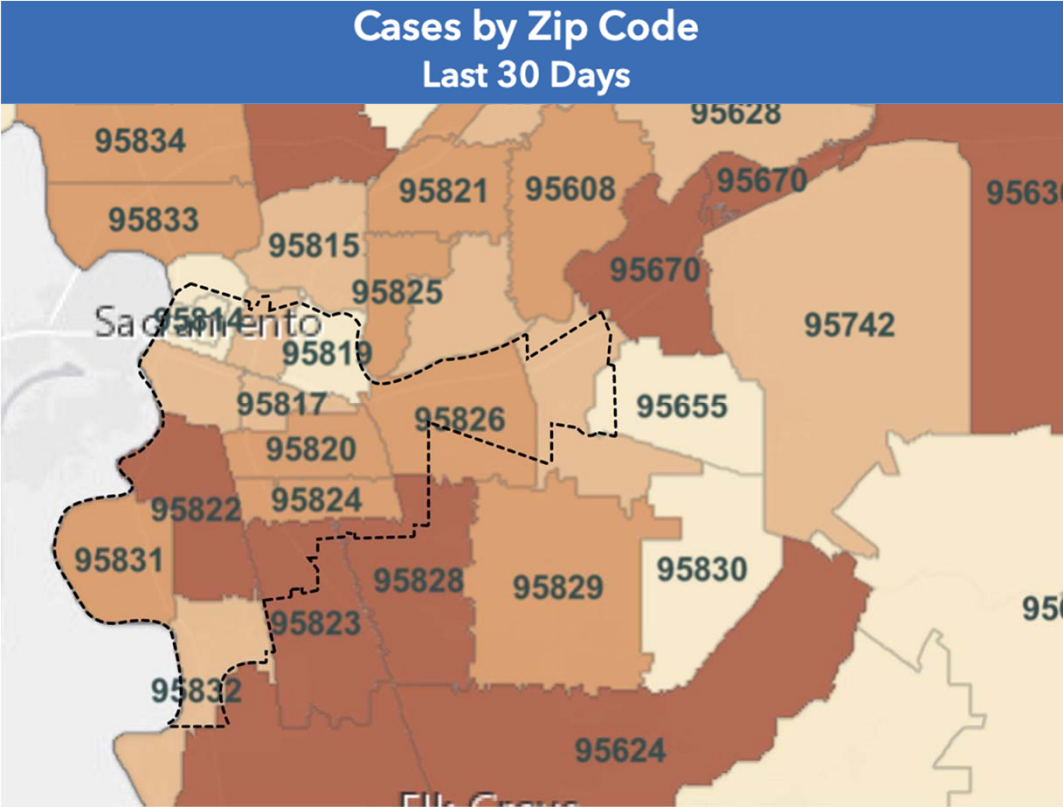


Sacramento County COVID-19 Case Rates

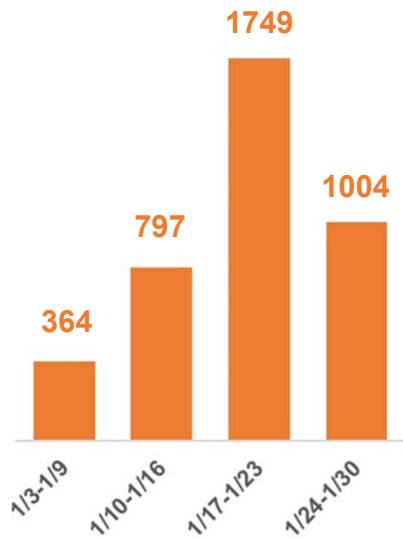

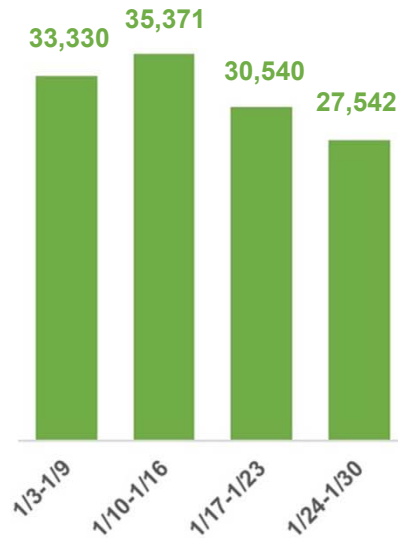

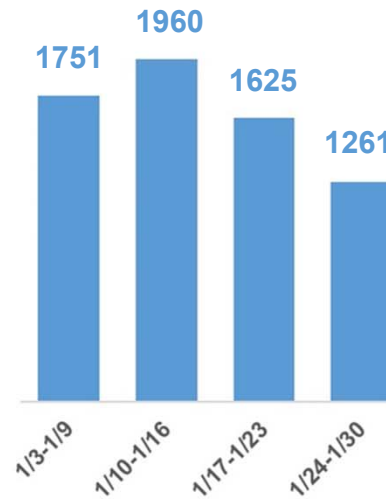
of positive COVID-19 cases present at school/work during infectious period



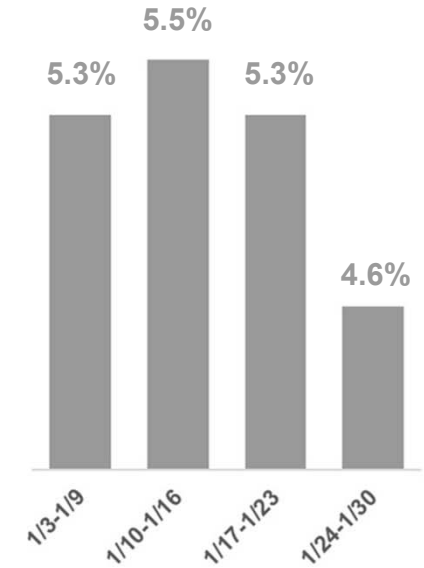
COVID-19 Tests Provided



of positive tests for staff & students

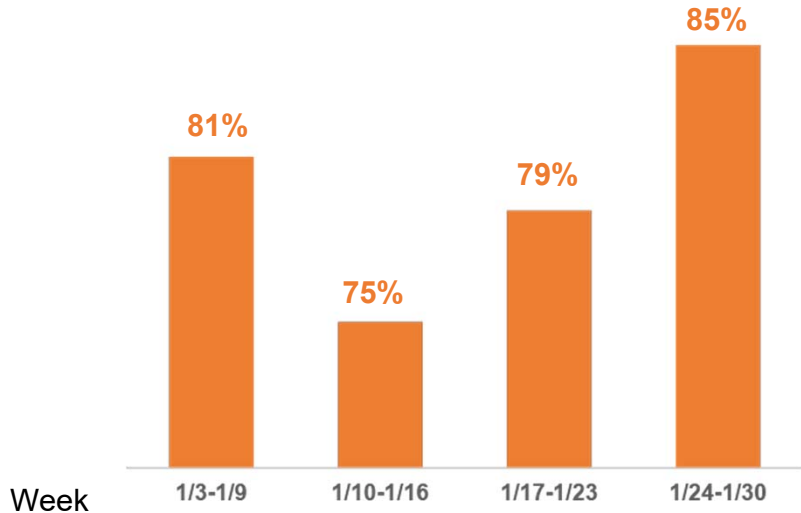


positivity rate for staff and students

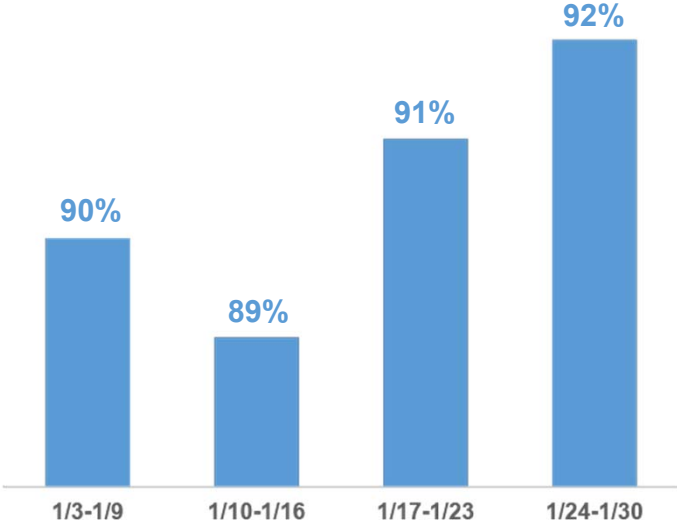

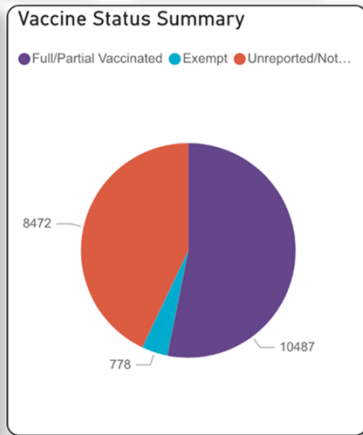

COVID-19 Testing Status Dashboard



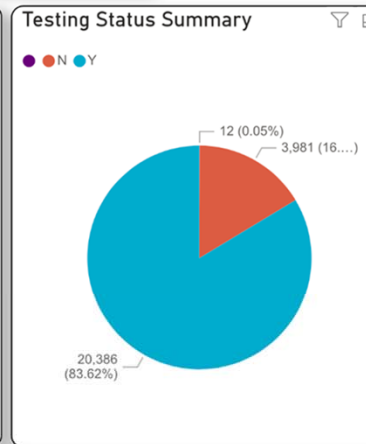
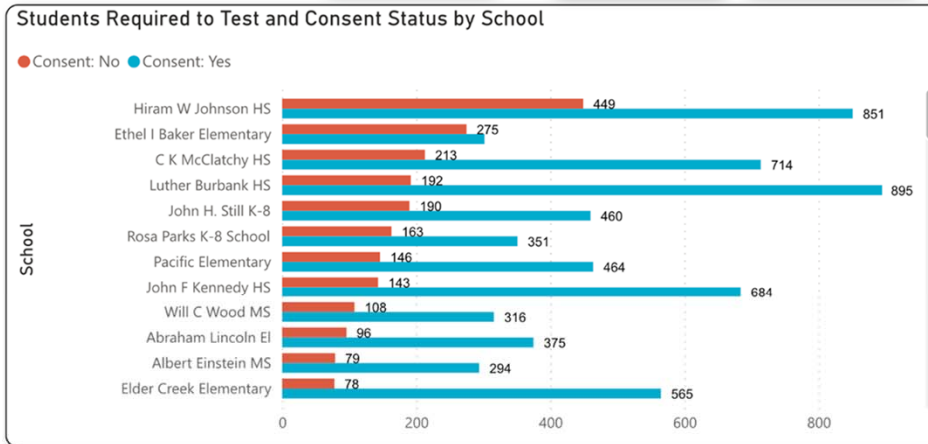

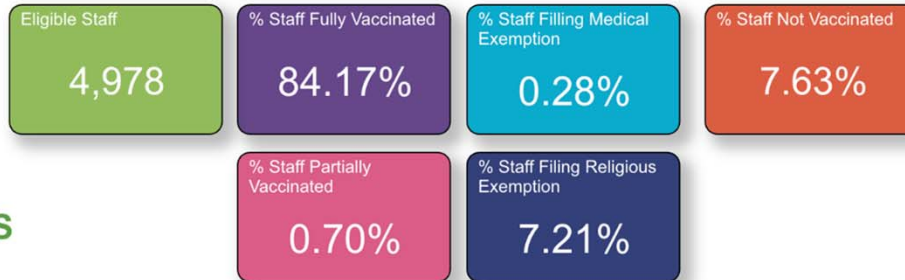

Staff Vaccination Requirement Dashboard

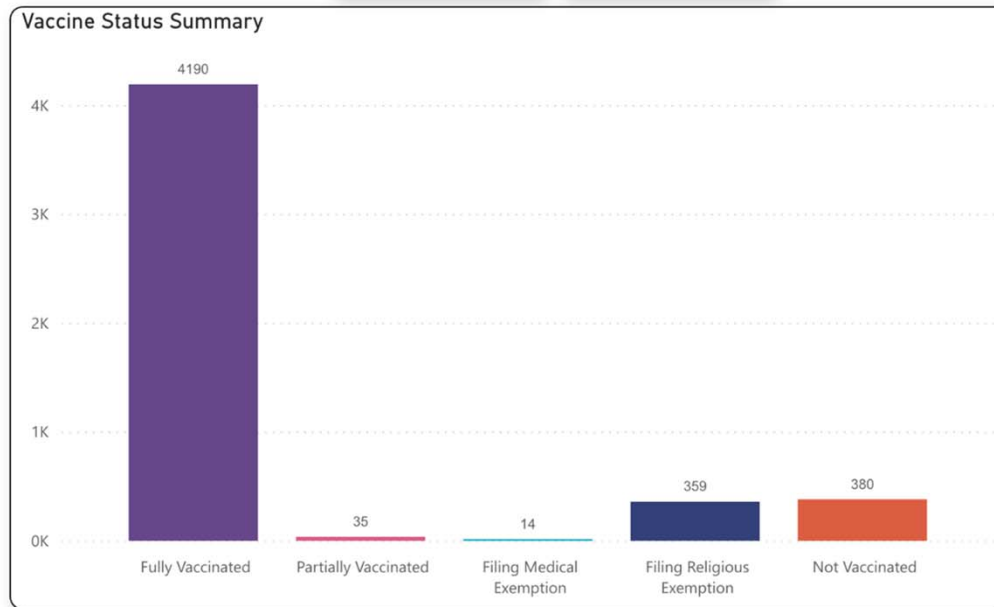


COVID-19 STAFF VACCINATION STATUS

Dear (name)

On three separate occasions (December 1, 2021, December 15, 2021, and January 13, 2022), the District sent you notifications relaying that you had not met requirements under [Resolution Number 3233](#), which requires that you submit proof of your COVID-19 vaccination status, or exemption status with regular, routine testing, and that continuous failure to do so would result in an unpaid leave of absence. The Human Resources Department was notified by the Health Services Department and Risk Management that you have not yet submitted proof of your vaccination status or exemption status.

Non-compliance with this requirement will result in placing you on unpaid leave of absence effective March 1, 2022.

If you have been vaccinated you may submit proof of vaccination by going to the District's vaccine portal at <https://www.scusd.edu/reportvaccine>. For assistance in submitting your vaccination proof, please contact Compliance@scusd.edu

If you are a certificated or classified employee and require a medical or religious exemption, the application can be found here: <https://www.scusd.edu/vaccineexemption>. Any documentation regarding a medical or religious exemption must be submitted to Amber Pena in Risk Management at Amber-Pena@scusd.edu.

The District must receive notification from you by February 28, 2022 if you intend to comply with [Resolution Number 3233](#). Please note that employees on a leave of absence will not have access to District systems while on leave.

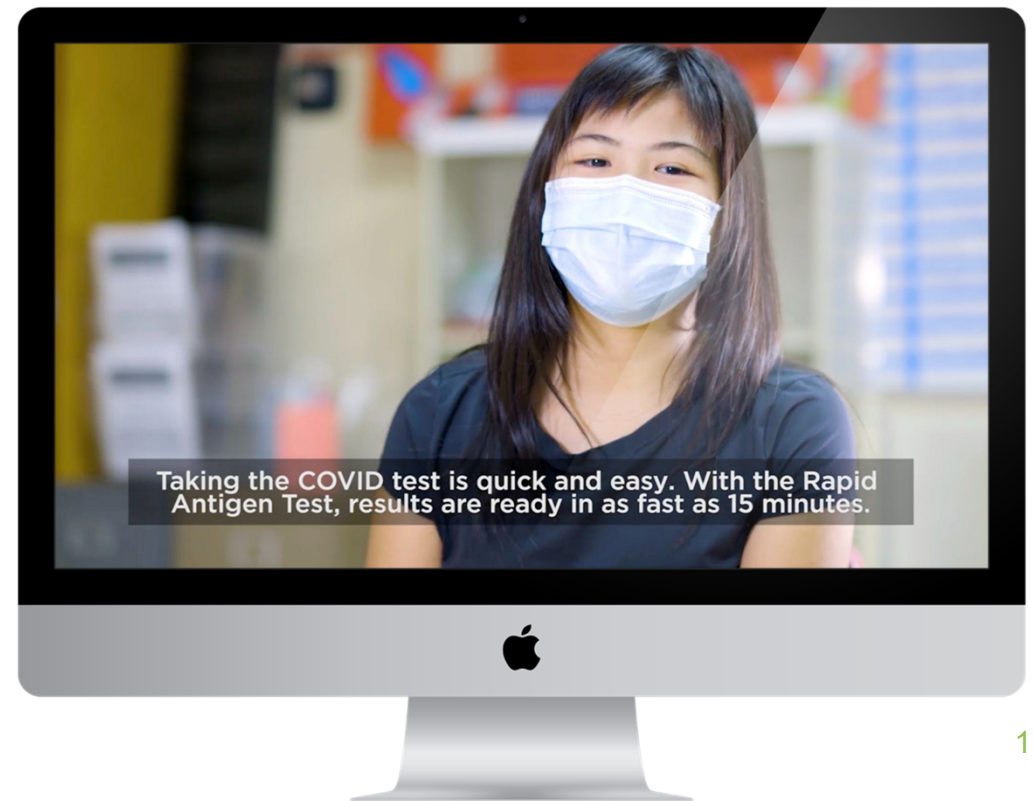

COVID-19 Vaccination Requirement - Video Campaign

- Board Members and local elected officials participated in a series of PSA videos with “We’re Unified Against COVID in Sacramento” message
- Working with Youth Engagement team to create a series of youth written, directed and edited videos for youth social media



COVID-19 Vaccination/Testing Requirement - January Outreach

- Intensive outreach to families whose students required to test AND are not registered for regular testing
 - Visiting middle/high school sites with high numbers of students not registered to test
- New resources for school site toolkit: targeted messaging to families of non-compliant Students
 - English, Spanish, Vietnamese, Hmong, Chinese and Farsi
- Targeted testing registration flyer in multiple languages mailed to all families' homes
 - Sent to students who are required to test AND are not registered for regular testing

N95 and KF94 Staff and Student Mask Distribution Communications

- Staff received first shipment and every staff member got 20 N95 masks
- Two-phase distribution for students based on deliveries of masks and every student got 5 masks
 - Phase 1: All middle (grade 7+) and high school students (N95 masks)
 - Phase 2: All preK-grade 6 students (KF94 and N95 masks)
- Principal email and bulletin
- Family email, phone call and eConnection



At-Home Testing COVID-19 Kits Communications

- We've ordered 88,000 At-Home Testing Kits but are not sure if we will receive all of what we've requested or whether shipments may be delayed.
- Once we know how many we have to distribute, we will communicate our distribution plan to staff and families.
 - Email, phone call, eConnection, social media, press release
- If we do not receive enough tests for distribution district-wide, we will prioritize sending at-home test kits to the 15 schools sites/9,000+ staff/students who have surveillance testing on Mondays.

At-Home COVID-19 Testing Before Returning to School from Break

Students and staff might be exposed to COVID-19 during the break. Testing at home helps prevent the spread of COVID-19 and keep schools open

Step 1: Get the following materials:

- Two iHealth COVID-19 Antigen Rapid Tests (with instructions).
- A device with internet access for submitting your results at the link provided by your school. (If you do not have a device or internet, call Primary at (650) 275-5419.

Step 2: Test your student (or yourself if you are a staff member)

NO SYMPTOMS? Students and staff members with NO COVID-19 symptoms and NO known exposure to someone with COVID-19 should TEST TWO TIMES:

- Test #1: Three (3) days before returning to school
- Test #2: The day before returning to school

SCAN the QR code (see below) to WATCH a video on how to test.

ANY SYMPTOMS? KNOWN EXPOSURE? If you HAVE ANY COVID-19 symptoms and/or you know you were exposed, CALL YOUR SCHOOL for next steps before you return.

Step 3: Share your test results on Primary.Health. (DO NOT use the iHealth app.)
If not already registers, go to Primary.Health by December 29 <https://my.primary.health/#/scusd-edu>
A message will be sent to you from Primary Health on 12/30 and 1/2 to report your results.
NO INTERNET? Call your results in at (650) 275-5419

Step 4: Understand your test results

POSITIVE TEST?

- Stay home and contact your doctor, your school and email covidreport@scusd.edu right away for further guidance.

NEGATIVE TEST?

- If your student feels well and has no COVID-19 symptoms, RETURN TO SCHOOL!
- If your student has SYMPTOMS or has been in contact with someone with COVID-19, please stay home and CALL THE SCHOOL before they return—even if the test is negative. More testing may be needed.

UNCLEAR TEST RESULTS? Contact the school for next steps, to find the next in-school testing date, or find a local testing site to retest. Make sure you have a photo of your test.

Next Steps

- Continue balancing our response to Omicron surge while continuing targeted efforts to increase vaccination rates
- Continue consulting with SCPH on fluidity of public health guidelines
- Continue focus on increasing COVID testing registration rates for students who are not yet fully vaccinated and required to test
- Actively target outreach efforts to the 3,981 number of students and staff not yet vaccinated or registered
- Monitor vaccination mandate impact on staffing and services to students and families
- Continue monitoring data and provide another update at the next board meeting on February 17
