



March is dedicated to PI Day (March 14) and is also a celebration of all the brilliant mathematicians and physicists who have tirelessly worked on PI. What is PI? Pi is the most studied number in mathematics, and for good reason. The number pi is integral to our understanding of geometry. Pi has uses in physics, astronomy, and mathematics. Pi is used in architecture and construction as well, and has been a vital part of everything from arches and bridges t teamo the Pyramids of Giza. Last year, a Swiss physicist team set the world record for calculating the PI number to 62,831,853,071,796 digits

In honor of PI Day we want to celebrate our local organization MESA (Math, Engineering and Scientific Achievement) groups who are in SCUSD. MESA (Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement) is nationally recognized for its innovative and effective academic development program. MESA engages educationally disadvantaged students so they excel in math and science and graduate with math-based degrees. MESA partners with segments of higher education as well as K-I2 institutions. MESA USA is a consortium of statewide MESA programs representing IO states across the country. MESA USA operates collaboratively to broaden participation and improve academic outcomes for underrepresented students in STEM education. MESA programs combine to serve over 50,000 K-I6 students annually.


