Enrollment Process Timeline

Projections/High School Specialty Program

Enrollment and budget projections are developed by our Budget team and staffing is allocated accordingly. These allocations are then reviewed by the IAS team and HR

Staffing Adjustments/Open **Enrollment and TK**

Human Resources provides written notification to any staff members impacted by a reduction in FTE as a result of budget development. Principals make tentative staff assignments based on the allocated FTE. These are reviewed by the IAS.

Enrollment Monitoring

The budget, HR, and IAS teams meet weekly to monitor the enrollment at every school and make any needed adjustments to staffing.



Allocations

Principals meet with SSC and leadership teams to discuss allocations. Open Enrollment seats are determined based on enrollment projections and staffing allocated for the following school year during budget development.

Principals determine if seats are available for permits. Permits must have the final approval of the IAS.

Levelina

Final adjustments to staffing based on actual enrollment are made by the 15th day of school.



December-January

- Principals review their enrollment projections/staffing allocations with their leadership teams and School Site Council.
- Principals work with their IAS to carefully consider enrollment/staffing allocations for the next school year to determine if seats will be available for students outside their neighborhood
- Open Enrollment seats posted if:
 - Seats available beyond anticipated neighborhood students and works within allocated staffing

SCUSD Open Enrollment

Parent Option for School Choice

- Programming choice
- Start time, location, extended day
- Parent can make up to 2 school choices
- Priorities: Sibling, parent works at school

Program Choice



Students who live within our district boundaries can apply to up to two open enrollment programs. Students will only be able to enroll in a program with space available for the 2025-2026 school year. <u>Click here</u> to verify space available in a specialty program by grade level and admission requirements. Please select from the list below.

Students who live outside the SCUSD boundaries are ineligible to apply through this application and will not see any choices listed below. Out-of-district students can apply through the <u>inter-district permit transfer process</u> that will be available April 7 – 25, 2025.

SCUSD uses a computerized, third-party lottery system to place students at their school/program of choice. A lottery must be implemented if applications exceed the grade capacity at the requested program. If the student has met all the qualifications to be placed in the lottery and is not chosen, the student will be placed on the waitlist for their first choice only.

Students wishing to attend an Independent Charter School MUST contact the specific school site for application information.



SchoolMint Parent Notification




Guardians receive either email and/or text message notifications after submission and after the lottery publishes with directions on next steps.

TK SchoolMint Application & Lottery

Current TK

- All students who turned 4 by June 2, 2024 (waiver available for 4 by June - September, with lower ratios)
- 12:1 ratio of students to adults, class size of 24
- 37 TK classes, hosted at 36 sites

CDE's changes for TK in 2025-26

- All students who turn 4 by September 1, 2025
- 10:1 ratio of students to adults, class size of 20
- 54 classes, hosted at 45 sites

Space capacity restrictions

- Implementation of 4th-6th grade Class Size Reduction in 2024-25
- Goal is TK at every site for 2026-27
