CORE BELIEF



Each Charter School receives its own dollars based on state/federal apportionment. Each Charter School's expenses are paid out of their own "bucket".


The Charter School pays the district for oversight, Special Education, and Purchased Services

a specific cost.


Explanation of Contributions

Recent Fiscal History

George Washington Carver



^{*}Non-Discretionary Expenses = All expenses that site leader has limited ability to impact (personnel costs, facility, utilities, and fees to the district)



Corrective Steps:

- FTE and cost reduction
- ADA increases
- Improved ADA projections
- Additional funding
- Improved District-Charter Collaboration

Approval

On District Budget

- Reduced Overall Ending Fund Balance by ~\$221,000
- o SELPA receives all expected revenue

On District Staff

 District staff are fully compensated for 2024-25 and remain in their positions for 2025-26

On Community

- School will remain open (pending renewal) for 2025-26
- Community is on notice of need to balance the budget through increased revenue and decreased costs
- Board may request regular fiscal updates

Denial - May trigger immediate school closure

On District Budget

- District responsible for unpaid costs to SELPA (~\$97,000)
- District responsible closure costs, unused facility expenses, and unplaced personnel costs

On District Staff

 District staff would be relocated to vacant positions where possible. Overall FTE would likely be reduced.

On Community

- Community is in suspense as to if school will remain open in 2025-26 school year
- Closure could occur with limited to no community engagement

Decision Impacts



Request for Approval of Contribution

- In collaboration with District staff, Carver is requesting Board approval for the transfer of up to \$221,000 from the District's general fund to the Charter School's budget location in Fund 09. Staff recommend approval.
- That amount comprises
 - \$97,000 to cover remaining
 SELPA contribution to District
 - \$124,000 to establish minimum required reserve for 2025-26.
