The attachments provide the projected school site entitlements for No Child Left Behind, Title I and Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), Free/Reduced (F/R) and LCFF - Limited English Proficiency (LEP).

Please note that under California's Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), Economic Impact Aid (EIA), which included State Compensatory Education (SCE) and Limited English Proficiency (LEP) programs no longer exist. EIA funds are now included in LCFF. In order to meet the requirements of LCFF, we created two resources 0007 (LCFF –F/R) and 0009 (LCFF – LEP). Even though these resources are considered unrestricted they must be used to provide services to students that get Free and Reduced meals and/or are English Learners. These funds must be spent based on the Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) that the district is currently developing and the Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA) which must align with the district's plan.

The allocation formulas for **Title I** are the same as 2014-15. Schools that have fifty percent (50%) or more F/R students qualify for Title I funds. Final revenues are not known until the following November and adjustments will be made as needed at that time. As in previous years, one percent (1%) must be used for parent involvement activities.

The total LCFF allocation for all schools is \$9,800,000. Schools must spend funds according to their SPSA. The distribution between F/R and LEP programs is eighty percent (80%) of the school site funding is allocated for F/R and twenty percent (20%) of the school site funding is allocated for bilingual programs.

The attached documents outline the allocations for each program.

Title I and LCFF- F/R allocations are based on 2014 CBEDS Enrollment and Free/Reduced Priced Lunch (Ages 5-17 Only).

LCFF-LEP allocations are based on the 2014 Spring R-30 Language Census Counts.

Please Note: At this time, there will be ten percent (10%) carryover for Title I (based on final allocation) from the 2014-15 school year into the 2015-16 school year. Sites are expected to spend their current allocation on their current students.
