The attached information provides the 2020-21 Title I final allocations and the 2019-20 Carryover Balances. Please note that the last column on the Title I final allocations, *Total School Allocation*, reflects carryover balance. There are no changes for Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), Free/Reduced (F/R) and LCFF – Limited English Proficiency (LEP).

The funding per pupil allocated to the schools increased by approximately \$20.40 as of the latest data available in comparison to the funding amount from the initial projections. The maximum carryover for Title I will be ten percent (10%) of the final allocation per school for all schools. The school sites are expected to spend their current allocation on their current students.

The 2019-20 Carryover Balances shows the total amount of carryover, less purchase orders brought forward that must be covered by the carryover amount and a final available balance. The funds will be set up in your site account by Friday, March 5, 2021.

Please review this data with the appropriate school site committees. Funds need to be allocated for school improvement activities as indicated in your School Plan for Student Achievement.

Please Note: There will be no carryover for Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) from the 2020-21 school year into the 2021-22 school year.
