We do this thru WISEE Queen Dream Institute for the empowerment and leadership enrichment of girls and women. We provide empowerment and leadership enrichment programs year round such as **My Dream Academy and Wii (We Inspire) Girls**. The goal of these programs decrease risky behavior among youth by encouraging participants to have good performance in school, create positive plans for the future, and develop strong connections to family, school, and faith community. **MotherLove** is an empowerment program that provides support and guidance to pregnant and parenting youth.
