**7.1 The Committee toured the Mark Hopkins site.**

**7.2 Staff Presentation by Mary Hardin Young from former Mark Hopkins Principal inquiries:**

Ms. Hardin Young spoke with two of the previous principals. Organizations that have previously supported the school are as follows: 100 Black Men, Delta Sigma Theta, True Passion, Southgate Plaza, Shari's Restaurant, Walgreens, Vision 2000, Roberts Family Development, and Centers for Fathers and Families. There were 100 volunteers from various organizations that came to the school's reading day.

Needs expressed by the community: Affordable childcare, parenting classes and a food bank type program.

**7.3 Community Forum: Keith Dent** wants to see the school turned into a tutoring center.

**Patricia Gentle** would like to see the facility benefit everyone in the community or an afterschool program.

**Rolanda Wilkins** submitted a Request for Usage form. She is part of a full service community center. She would like three or four classrooms. She would like to create more cultural events. She is working with others to create a full service center and will be presenting at the December 5<sup>th</sup> meeting.

**Mr. King** wants the needs of the community met. He would like a full service community center at the site.

**Cha Vang**, as a part of the group Hmong Innovating Politics, canvassed the community and surveyed 215 families. Members of the community volunteered to help. Assembly member Dr. Richard Pan, Councilmember Bonnie Pannell, and SCUSD Board Member Diana Rodriguez all participated.

**Wendie Skalen** works at the trauma center at the South Sacramento Kaiser. She believes that the site location is perfect for food services, health care, a free clinic, an after school program and could create a strong collaboration that would make a difference in the community.

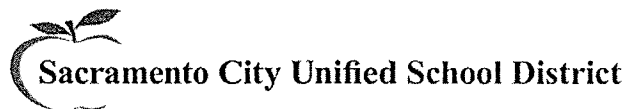
