Re: Budget Presentation and Resuming Successor Contract Negotiations

Dear Mr. Fisher:

I am in receipt of your May 22, 2020 letter in which you agree to meet with the District for a budget presentation and resume successor contract negotiations. You indicated SCTA is not available on the dates offered by the District, but is available on June 9, 2020. This letter is to confirm that the District agrees to meet with SCTA on June 9, 2020, beginning at 4:00 p.m.

The District's team will be prepared to provide a budget presentation during the first hour of the meeting. The budget presentation will be led by the District's Chief Business Officer, Rose Ramos, with participation of John Gray and Matt Phillips from School Services of California, Inc. Following the portion of the session reserved for the budget presentation, the District looks forward to resuming negotiations with SCTA over the successor contract and to receiving SCTA's responses to the proposals the District shared with SCTA on Articles 5, 6, 8, 11, 12, 13, 17, 18, 21 and the school calendar, between August 2019 and December 2019. These proposals were also shared in hard copy and reviewed with SCTA during the previous negotiation session held on March 3, 2020. Representatives from the District's negotiations team will reach out via email by June 2, 2020 to propose potential options for conducting this session virtually.

We look forward to resuming successor contract negotiations with SCTA and receiving SCTA's responses to our previous proposals. The District continues to believe that together, with SCTA and our other labor partners, and through the collective bargaining process, solutions to our budget challenges that are acceptable for the District and our employees will be identified and agreed to, thereby allowing the District and its employees to continue the shared goal of enhancing educational opportunities for all students.
