# **COVID-19 Updates**

- Omicron variant spreading widely in Sacramento County
- Pfizer booster dose recommendation changed to 5 months past the second dose
- 12-15 year olds approved for Pfizer booster dose
- CDPH Masking Mandate extended into February
- SCPH Public Health Order for virtual public meetings
- SCPH COVID-19 Symptom & Quarantine INTERIM K-12 Decision Forest
- CDPH Revised K-12 Guidance issued 1/12/22



# **SCUSD** Revisions

- Temporary pause on field trips, extra-curricular activities, and non-essential tournaments
- The following structured activities will continue:
  - Activities that include fixed cohorts of students, such as athletics, band/orchestra, or other club activities
  - Competitions that are part of the essential function of an activity
- Martin Luther King Jr. holiday Serna Center Testing Location open Mon, Jan 17, 2022 from 8 am - 4 pm





# Revised CDPH K-12 Guidance

"The foundational principle of this guidance is that all students must have access to safe and full in-person instruction and to as much instructional time as possible" - CDPH

SCUSD Revised Contact Tracing Procedures (1/4/22)	CDPH Revised K-12 Guidance (1/12/22)
SCUSD Health Services team made temporary changes to our contact tracing protocols to maintain efficiency, responsiveness and the ability to document cases as quickly as possible.	"The framework outlined below allows for a quicker and broader response to cases identified in school settings, accomplishable through prompt notification, testing, and isolation protocols"
Exposure notices will be sent to the entire classroom/activity and staff, notifying parents/guardians and staff of their options for quarantine.	Group Contact Tracing: Notification should occur to "groups" of exposed students (e.g., classmates, teammates, cohorts, etc.) rather than contact tracing to identify individual "close contacts" (e.g., those within 6 feet).
Weekly Surveillance Testing and Care Room testing will be utilized for modified quarantine testing requirements	Exposed students, regardless of COVID-19 vaccination status or prior infection, should get tested for COVID-19 with at least one diagnostic test obtained within 3-5 days after last exposure

# Sacramento County COVID-19 Case Rates





- 189.5 new cases per 100k residents
- 42.6% positivity rate



# **COVID Cases in SCUSD**



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# Vaccination Mandate summary

#### Students 12+


- Fully Vaccinated OR
- Exemption + registered for COVID-19 testing
- Focus on testing registration for all non-compliant students as long as students are consented for testing, we may continue pursuing exemption or vaccine records

#### Students 5-11

- Register for COVID-19 testing OR
- Fully Vaccinated (submit records)
- Not required to submit an exemption at this time
- Focus on testing registration for all non-vaccinated students





# COVID-19 Vaccination/Testing Requirement -January School Site Outreach

- New resources: Board Member PSA video
  - TK: Local Government Officials PSA video
- Provided schools with scripts, resources and dates for multi-tiered outreach including:
  - Recorded tutorial video on how to submit records
  - PowerPoint slide deck for optional virtual meetings with their student's families
  - Backpacking letters and forms in multiple languages home
  - Pulling reports from Infinite Campus to identify their students not yet in compliance
    - Targeted emails and phone calls to these families



# COVID-19 Take Home Test Kits News Coverage

- Heavily covered by local and national news
- Overall sentiment was positive
  - SCUSD was one of the only districts in CA to take advantage of free tests from CDPH prior to Winter Break
    - Did not receive enough for every student (distributed 38,000)
    - Focused distribution on less vaccinated student population (ages 5-12, K-8 schools)
- 20,000+ test results recorded through Primary Health
  - Prevented 500+ positive cases from going to school

## COVID-19 Vaccination/Testing Requirement Communications Summary

- Omicron is driving more people to get vaccinated, boosted or tested
- Despite our best efforts, January 31 deadline is approaching quickly and we're at 53% for students 12 + reporting and 86% for staff reporting
- Post-Winter Break with Omicron rapidly spreading impacted Health Services staffing levels as well on top of the required shifting that had to take place on additional testing due to Omicron surge



### **Next Steps**

- Continue balancing our response to Omicron surge while continuing targeted efforts to increase vaccination rates
- Report back to Board on outcome of scheduled January 27th mediation with SCTA on Independent Studies MOU to determine availability of independent studies for families
- Continue consulting with SCPH on fluidity of public health guidelines
- Monitor vaccination mandate-related lawsuits
- Continue focus on increasing COVID testing registration rates for students preschool-aged+ who are not yet fully vaccinated and required to test

## Recommendation

- Pause enforcement of Vaccination mandate for students slated to take effect on February 1, 2022 through at least February 28, 2022
  - Pause will allow staff to focus on:
  - Continuing rigorous testing protocols to keep schools open due to health safety
  - Continuing focusing on vaccination rates with an explicit emphasis on increasing COVID testing registration among ALL students regardless of vaccination status
