

# Individualized Analysis of Student Academic Data to Identify College Eligibility Matches for each Sac City Unified 12th grade Student

<b>HS Graduation Credits Completed</b>	240	Students need 225 credits in specific subject areas to graduate. Review your current course schedule and expected spring semester course enrollment to ensure graduation requirements will be met by the end of the academic year.
<b>On-Track for Graduation</b>	Yes	Review your academic records to confirm that you are on track for graduation. On track status for Graduation considers all courses passed with a D or better. Continue to focus on your academic excellence.
<b>UC/CSU GPA</b>	3.71	In calculating the GPA for admission consideration, UC uses all UC-approved "a-g" courses a student took between the summer before 10th grade through the summer following 11th grade. In calculating the GPA for admission consideration, CSU uses all approved a-g courses completed after grade 9.
<b>A-G Units* Completed</b>	22.0	To be considered for UC/CSU admission, you must complete 15 yearlong high school courses with a grade of C or better by the end of senior year; for UC specifically, at least 11 of them prior to your senior year. Units completed include current A-G course enrollment with the assumption that A-G coursework will be passed with a grade of C or better.
<b>SAT/ACT</b>	Math: 400 EBRW: 470	Consider retaking the SAT/ACT by December to improve your score and increase the probability of admission to private colleges / universities. Although UC's and CSU's no longer require the SAT and ACT for admission, private colleges / universities may use SAT and ACT for admission and competitive eligibility.  For UC Freshman applicants, ACT or SAT test scores may be used as an alternative method of fulfilling minimum requirements for eligibility or for course placement after you enroll. <b>AP/IB/Honors Units* Completed</b>	2.5	Passing Honors/Advanced Placement/International Baccalaureate courses with a "C" or better may add weight to the overall UC/CSU GPA calculation. UC and CSU grants credit for Advanced Placement examinations on which a student scores a 3 or higher, and International Baccalaureate examinations with a score of 4 or higher.

\* One unit is considered the equivalent of one year-long course (two semesters).

# SCUSD College Application Fee Waiver

- In response to our Students' advocacy efforts, we are making available funds to subsidize the cost of one four-year college application fee up to \$100 for every eligible 12th grade student.
- Status as of 11/15/22
  - 120 students have made a request
  - 51 students have received CSU college waivers
  - 27 students have registered for reimbursement for a UC or a private school
- Deadline for request set for Nov. 18th but may be extended to meet student needs as many need to submit application status document



## Guest Speakers

Guest speaking occurs when a volunteer from the business or community is invited to speak with a group of students during the school day.

- Discuss educational paths to specific careers in the industry
- Students ask questions about personal and career choices
- Share their path to industry
