
SCUSD Masking Approach

- When Sacramento County falls to the <u>"low community level" per Center for Disease Control</u> (CDC) category, and remains there for four consecutive weeks, SCUSD will align with the CDPH guidance to strongly recommend masking, but not require masks to be worn in school settings.
- Until that category is met, the mask requirement remains in effect for all staff, students and visitors.
- A return to the "high" community COVID transmission level per CDC metrics would trigger a required return to indoor masking. SCUSD would also consider resuming the masking requirement if Sacramento County entered "medium" community level depending on global/national/local trends.
- SCUSD's masking requirement would also resume if state or local public health officials issue a future order for school masking.



SCUSD Masking Timeline

Sacramento County could move into the CDC's "low community level" tier on March 10. If Sacramento County remains in the "low community tier for four weeks, ending on April 7, SCUSD will align with the State of California's strong recommendation for masking effective Monday, April 18 (upon return from the Spring Break).

When deciding on masking, the AAP recommends families consider


- whether their child is vaccinated,
- whether their child is immunocompromised or at high risk for severe COVID-19,
- whether family members are unvaccinated or at high risk for severe disease and
- whether they live in a community with a high level of COVID-19.

Based on these factors, families may choose to continue wearing masks in indoor public places even if they are not required, and that decision should be supported.


Schools also should have the flexibility to reinstate masking as needed.

Next Steps

- Continue to monitor case rates, including school-based surveillance testing case rates
- Update community on potential shift in masking policy
- Continue actively targeting outreach efforts to the 2,048 students not yet vaccinated or registered for testing
- Update families on their students vaccination or testing status
- Maintain the integrity of the onboarding process for all newly hired staff to ensure vaccination/exemption compliance prior to employment
