Recommendation: Approve revisions to Board Policy 5125.1

Background/Rationale: The California Education Code provides the District "shall adopt a policy identifying those categories of directory information . . . that may be released." Directory information includes the student's name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, honors and awards, and dates of attendance.

In order to maintain the confidentiality of directory information and regulate the release of such information in accordance with law revisions are necessary. No prior updates to the Board Policy has occurred since 2005. Such updates include language in the CSBA Gamut model policy.

Revision to Board Policy (BP) 5125.1: Release of Directory Information August 11, 2022



I. Overview/History of Department or Program

The District may disclose directory information from education records without consent as long as it has notified parents/guardians and eligible students of the types of information the school or district has designated as directory information and the right of parents/guardians and eligible students to opt out of disclosure of directory information. Directory information can include the student's name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, honors and awards, and dates of attendance. The District recognizes the importance of maintaining the confidentiality of directory information and therefore the release of such information is made only in accordance with law and this Board Policy.

The current version of this policy was last revised in 2005. The proposed revisions to the policies are based on the updates provided by the California School Boards Association (CSBA).

The revised board policy provides directory information may be released to representatives of public or private schools or colleges, branches of the military, offices of public officials for purposes of certificates or awards of recognition, the news media, and/or nonprofit organizations. The District may limit or deny the release of specific categories of directory information to any public or private nonprofit organization based on its determination of the best interests of students.

II. Driving Governance:

California Education Code section 49073 provides:

(a) School districts shall adopt a policy identifying those categories of directory information as defined in subdivision (c) of Section 49061 that may be released. The school district shall determine which individuals, officials, or organizations may receive directory information. However, no information may be released to a private profitmaking entity other than employers, prospective employers, and representatives of the news media, including, but not limited to, newspapers, magazines, and radio and television stations. The names and addresses of pupils enrolled in grade 12 or who have terminated enrollment before graduation may be provided to a private school or college operating under Chapter 8 (commencing with Section 94800) of Part 59 of Division 10 of Title 3 or its authorized representative. However, no such private school or college shall use that information for other than purposes directly related to the academic or professional goals of the institution, and a violation of this provision is a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not to exceed two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500). In addition, the privilege of the private school or college to receive the information shall be suspended for a period of two years from the time of discovery of the misuse of the information. Any school district may limit

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or deny the release of specific categories of directory information to any public or private nonprofit organization based upon a determination of the best interests of pupils.

(b) Directory information may be released according to local policy as to any pupil or former pupil. However, notice shall be given at least on an annual basis of the categories of information that the school district plans to release and of the recipients. Directory information shall not be released regarding a pupil if a parent of that pupil has notified the school district that the information shall not be released.

(c) Directory information shall not be released regarding a pupil identified as a homeless child or youth, as defined in paragraph (2) of Section 725 of the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. Sec. 11434a(2)), unless a parent, or pupil accorded parental rights, as identified in the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (20 U.S.C. Sec. 1232g), has provided written consent that directory information may be released.

III. Budget:

This proposed policy is intended to address the District's release of directory information. There is no direct budget impact from the revisions to this policy.

IV. Goals, Objectives and Measures:

Pursuant to the District's LCAP Goals, these Board Policies meets "Operational Excellence." The goal is to maintain the confidentiality of directory information and regulate the release of such information in accordance with law.

V. Major Initiatives:

This Board Policy critical to improve access to an exchange of while maintain the confidentiality of student records.

VI. Results:

Approval of revision to Board Policy 5125.1. Ensure compliance with state and federal law.

VII. Lessons Learned/Next Steps:

Adoption of revised Board Policy concerning the release of directory information. Information and correspondences concerning this matter have previously been shared with the District. Further updates will be provided as necessary.

Policy 5125.1: Release Of Directory Information

The <u>Superintendent or designee may authorizeGoverning Board recognizes the importance of maintaining the</u> <u>confidentiality of directory information and therefore authorizes</u> the release of <u>such information only in accordance</u> with law, Board policy, and administrative regulation.

<u>The Superintendent or designee may release</u> student directory information to representatives of public or private schools or colleges, branches of the military, offices of public officials for purposes of certificates or awards of recognition,

the news media, prospective employers, governmental agencies and/or nonprofit organizations as provided by law. Unless prohibited by the parent/guardian in accordance with law, directory information which school officials may disclose consists of the following: student's name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight<u>in accordance with Board policy</u> and height of athletic team members, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, and most recent previous school attended.

The Superintendent or designee may limit or deny the release of specific <u>categories of</u> directory information <u>to any</u> <u>public or private nonprofit organization</u> based on his/her <u>determinationsdetermination</u> of the best <u>interest of the</u> <u>student in accordance to state law.interests of district students.</u> (Education Code 49073)

Military services representatives

OPTION 1: Colleges and prospective employers, including military recruiters, shall have access to directory information. Military recruiters shall have access to a student's name, address, and telephone number, unless the parent/guardian has specified that the information not be released in accordance with law and administrative regulation. (20 USC 7908; 10 USC 503; Education Code 49603)

Directory information shall not be released regarding any student whose parent/guardian notifies the district in writing that such information may not be disclosed. The district shall not release information that is private or confidential as required by law, Board policy, or administrative regulation. No other access to student records or personally identifiable student information may be provided without parent/guardian permission. (Education Code 49073)

OPTION 2: Colleges and prospective employers, including military recruiters, shall not have access to directory information. (10 USC 503; Education Code 49603)

OPTION 2 ENDS HERE

<u>Under no circumstances shall directory information be disclosed to a private profit making entity, except for</u> representatives of the news media and prospective employers, in accordance with Board policy. Private schools and colleges may be given the names and addresses of 12th grade students and students who are no longer enrolled provided that they use this information only for purposes directly related to the institution's academic or professional goals. (Education Code 49073) These references are not intended to be part of the policy itself, nor do they indicate the basis or authority for the board to enact this policy. Instead, they are provided as additional resources for those interested in the subject matter of the policy.
