





On track for Graduation	12th grade students on track to complete 225 credits for high school graduation	August
On-Track for A-G (Eligibility)	12 <sup>th</sup> grade students are on track to complete 15+ A-G courses	August
SAT/ACT	12 <sup>th</sup> grades students have taken the ACT/SAT by or before December of their 12 <sup>th</sup> grade year	March (11 <sup>th</sup> Grade) -December
Outreach	12 <sup>th</sup> grade students have attended at least one workshop and understand the CSU/UC application submission process	August – November
CSU/UC Application	12 <sup>th</sup> grade students have been given the opportunity to receive hands on support with the submission of the CSU/UC application	October – November
FAFSA	12 <sup>th</sup> grade students submit their Federal Application for Student Aid (FAFSA)	October 1 – March 2 (Priority Deadline) June 30 - (Final Deadline)
Admission	12 <sup>th</sup> grade students begin to receive admit notifications	December – March







**EAOP:** Help more students meet requirements for college. In addition, they provide weekly academic advising. (120 Students 9th-12th Graders) **Cal-Soap:** Provides tutoring services to students and delivery college and financial aid advising. (All Seniors and Juniors)

**College Track:** College Track is a free college completion program that empowers students to graduate from a 4 year college. Student recruitment begins in 9th grade

**Jr RISE:** College preparation and retention program, starting with 11th and 12th grade and extends to 1st year in college (Every Tuesday and Thursdays)
