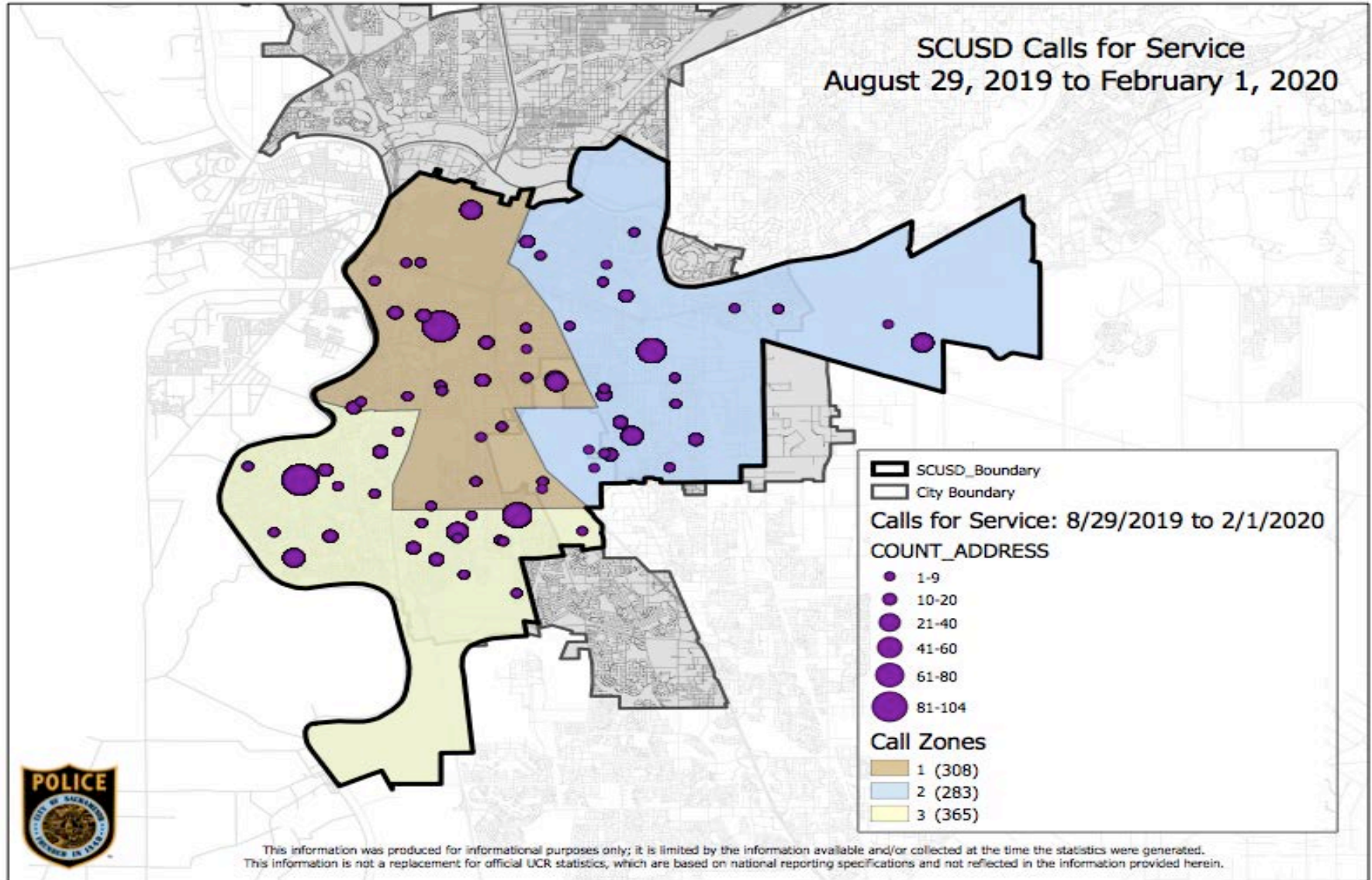

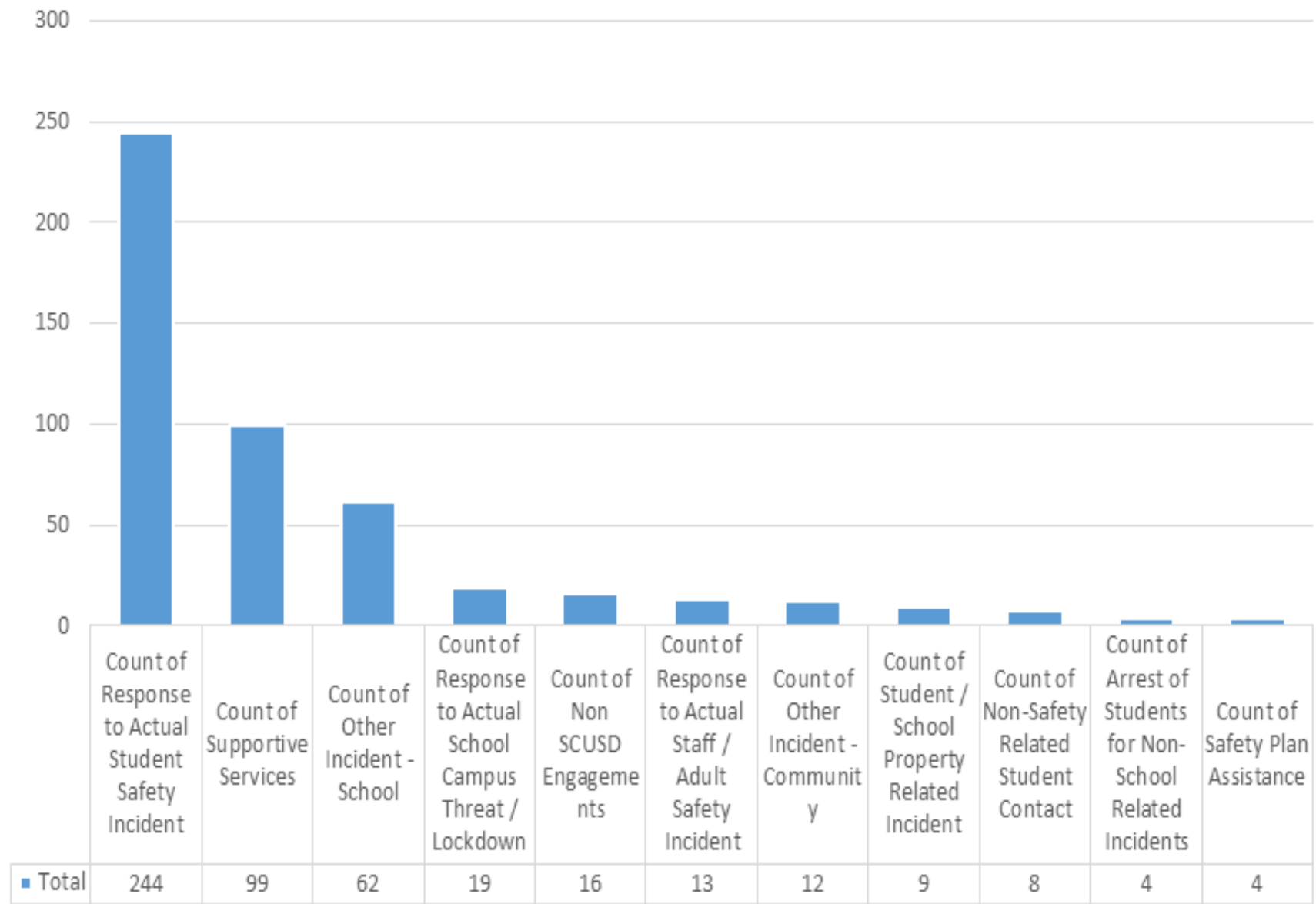
# Background

- Threat Assessment Team
- Opportunity for Restorative Practices / Conflict Mediation and Learning Opportunities





# Active Shooter / Lockdown Drills & Training

- Evidence-based & trauma-informed curriculum, drills, and resources
- **No** images or wording depicting death, guns, killing, blood, etc...
- Empowerment Theory
- Augments existing Social Emotional Learning programs
- Parent Interaction
- Curriculum that encourages students to talk with family about safety in the community
- Strategies to engage with neighboring homes and businesses
