### **FAMILY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT OFFICE**

California Department of Education

7/1/12 — 6/30/13: Foster Youth Services Core District Program Grant. Foster youth receive direct services, including tutoring, counseling, emancipation and transitional services, and enrollment/placement support. Over 500 youth are served at any given time and approximately 800 over the course of a year. Services are coordinated with other countywide and core district programs to better serve the transient foster youth population.

11/1/12 - 10/31/15: CASEL is the Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning (CASEL) and was founded in 1994 as a national collaborative to make social and emotional learning (SEL) an essential part of every young person's education by advancing the science of SEL, expanding effective SEL practice and improving state and federal policies. NoVo Foundation and CASEL have co-conceived a strategy to advance social and emotional learning at the district-level in eight large U.S. school districts. Funds will be offered as general support as the district begins to implement multi-year organizational strategies, which roll out and scale systemic, evidencebased, effective social and emotional learning throughout the district. The total three year grant is \$750,000.00, with an annual payment of \$250,000.00. Successful progression to the next funding year will be contingent upon meeting the goals of the previous year's plans.

## **INTEGRATED SUPPORT SERVICES**

A13-00067 Mendocino County Office of Education 8/18/12 — 8/18/13: Children's Health Insurance Program Reauthorization Act Grant, in partnership with Mendocino County Office of Education, the California Association of Health Plans, and the California Teachers Association. Funds used to increase enrollment and retention of high risk youth and matriculating students in no or low cost health insurance programs. Focus will be on helping students maintain coverage by further developing school based technology, practices, and other outreach activities.

#### SPECIAL EDUCATION

A13-00070 California Department of Education 7/1/12 – 9/30/14: Local Assistance Entitlements Grant per the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). This is a federal entitlement grant that is distributed to our SELPA (Special Education Local Plan Areas) in order to provide a full continuum of services for our students with special needs. Funds are used to support the sites with special education services in terms of allocations to fund certificated and classified positions that support the district's special education programs.

A13-00071 California Department of Education 7/1/12 – 9/30/14: Mental Health Services Grant. This federal grant is allocated to the SELPA for the specific provision of providing Educationally Related Mental Health Services (ERMHS) to qualified students receiving special education services. This provision of services is pursuant to requirements of the Individuals with Disabilities Act.

A13-00072 California Department of Education 7/1/12 — 9/30/13: Grant for Personnel Development for Special Education Local Plan Areas (SELPA). This grant assists the SELPA in providing personnel development and training to unique groups of staff who need specialized training to assist school site staff in the improvement of their special education services. Assistive Technology professional development and certification for our new Educational Technologist is one example of how the funds might be used.

A13-00073 California Department of Education 7/1/12 – 9/30/14: Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) Grant. Funding for the ADR process to respond to and resolve local complaints and concerns regarding the implementation of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, Part B, Section 611 (IDEA). The ADR process is a desirable and effective practice that supports the positive interaction and collaboration among parents and educators, and promotes the implementation and use of conflict resolution throughout the state.

A13-00074 California Department of Education 7/1/12 – 9/30/13: Special Education Low Incidence Specialized Services Grant for students who have severe disabilities, visually impairments, or are deaf or hearing impaired. This grant supports our companion Low Incidence Grant with provides for specialized equipment that allows students with certain disabilities to receive the additional services to access their educational program. This Specialized Services Grant also provides a fund to pay for repairs to equipment purchased for students, and interpreting services to students who are deaf or hearing impaired.
