<u>Background/Rationale</u> : WellSpace Health, a California nonprofit corporation, in partnership with SCUSD received a federal grant under the Affordable Care Act and intends to use the grant to establish a school-based health center at Hiram Johnson High School because there are no health care services readily available to students and families in the school's neighborhood.

## **RESOLUTION NO. 2778**

## RESOLUTION REGARDING ESTABLISHMENT OF A SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTER AT HIRAM JOHNSON HIGH SCHOOL AND EXEMPTION FROM DIVISION OF STATE ARCHITECT (DSA) APPROVAL

WHEREAS, WellSpace Health, a California nonprofit corporation ("WellSpace") has received a federal grant, under the Affordable Care Act, for modular building improvements and equipment, including medical and dental equipment; and

WHEREAS, WellSpace intends to use the federal grant to establish a school-based health center (the "health center") at Hiram Johnson High School; and

WHEREAS, the health center will provide primary medical care, oral health care and mental health services for school age children living in the neighborhoods surrounding Hiram Johnson High School, regardless of insurance status and ability to pay; and

WHEREAS, because there are no health care providers within a two-mile radius of Hiram Johnson High School, students and families in the neighborhood are unable to access health care services because of lack of transportation or lack of health insurance; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 17296 of the Education Code, the establishment of the health center facilities may be exempted from review and approval by the Division of State Architect (DSA) provided the facilities meet the requirements with all local building codes and licensing requirements for providing services at the health center.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Sacramento City Unified School District Board of Education as follows:

- 1. Adopts the foregoing recitals as true and correct.
- 2. Exempts, pursuant to section 17296 of the Education Code, review and approval by the Division of State Architect, provided that the facilities described above meet the requirements with all local building codes and licensing requirements for providing services at the health center.
