Current Physical Distancing Guidance 3 feet between students

 CDC, CDPH, SCDPH allow for three feet distancing between students in classroom settings (six feet between adults, adults and students, when eating, etc.) Quoting the CDE,

"an LEA with more than sufficient space, staffing, hygienic supplies, etc. to ensure health and safety of all students should be offering full-day and full-week in-person instruction to all of its students."



Combining of Cohorts Based on Three Feet Distancing Guidance

 Section I.A. of the MOU with SCTA provides the District will comply with guidelines and regulations from CDC, CDPH, CDE, Cal/OSHA, and SCDPH Section A.3 of the MOU with SCTA provides: All revisions and updates to the above health and safety guidelines. If any provision contained in this MOU conflicts with revised or updated guidelines, best practices, recommendations, and considerations from SCDPH or CDPH the Parties agree to meet and confer.



Physical Distancing and Combining Cohorts

- Updated Physical Distancing Guidelines Requires Meet and Confer with SCTA
 - Current MOU relies on outdated physical distancing guidance
- Combining Cohorts Does not require an MOU with labor partners



District efforts to provide more in-person instruction for students

- Combining Cohorts
 Beginning on May 18
 - EK-6 class cohorts where possible
 - 6-feet student-to-student distancing

Led by the work of our school principals

- Analyzed classroom spacing
- Confirmed data on physical distancing/capacity
- Communicated with families on the change



By the Numbers

700 of 1,034

elementary classrooms at <mark>47 sites</mark> able to be combined









Next Steps

- 1. Serving students by need beginning May 25
- Partially combine cohorts to accommodate some students with the most need to attend 4 days per week

- 2. Serving secondary students as soon as possible
- Combining cohorts in grades 7-12, or secondary schools



Concerns/Feedback

- Many students unable benefit from the combining of cohorts (3 feet v. 6 feet)
- Siblings/Transportation and Child care
- Technology Issues (Inventory Challenges)
- Time "Every Minute Counts"
