V. Major Initiatives:

Board Policy 7310 states that a citizen advisory committee shall be appointed to review name suggestions and submit recommendations to the Board for consideration. Community participation in the naming process is encouraged. Below is a list of community engagement efforts that took place in the theater naming process.

March 5, 2018

Kit Carson International Academy PTSO Meeting: Naming of the Joshua Wingert Theater was proposed by a teacher and the PTSO supported the idea.

March 8, 2018

Kit Carson International Academy Staff Meeting: Joshua Wingert Theater suggestion was presented to staff and was unanimously supported.

March 13, 2018

Kit Carson International Academy School Site Council Meeting: Principal Chapa presented the Board Policy for Naming Facilities to the School Site Council. The School Site Council was appointed as the "citizen advisory committee" as it is comprised of students, parents, staff and community members. Members of the School Site Council agreed to discuss the idea of naming the theater after Joshua Wingert with its representative groups, and make a recommendation at the next meeting.

March 24, 2108

Memorial Service for Joshua Wingert: This service was attended by 400-500 friends, family and community members to celebrate the life of Joshua Wingert. Many of the signatures were collected at this event that affirmed that idea to name the building in honor of Josh. Over the next month, signatures were gathered from over 2000 community members in support the name Joshua Wingert Theater. The support came from students, parents, Kit Carson International Academy staff, East Sac Little league and soccer, East Sac Boy scouts, as well as community members who knew Joshua. Not a single person voiced opposition to the suggestion.

April 3, 2018

Open House: Mr. Chapa detailed the theater suggestion to over 100 parents who attended the Open House. Many parents signed a petition in support.

April 24, 2018

School Site Council Meeting: The citizen advisory committee met and unanimously agreed to recommend to the Board that our black box theater be named "The Joshua Wingert Theater."

VI. Results:

Recommendation to the Board of Education is to rename the Kit Carson International Academy Theater to The Joshua Wingert Theater. BP 7310 requires that a student be deceased for at least one year. Joshua passed away in February, 2018. However, the Board may waive this policy requirement. There is no statutory process or requirement regarding the naming of school facilities under California law. BP 7310 is a policy within the sound discretion and control of the Board.

VII. Lessons Learned/Next Steps:

If approved by the Board of Education the theater will formally be known as "The Joshua Wingert Theater".

I. Overview of SAT School Day

Sacramento City Unified School District's (SCUSD) Equity, Access and Social Justice Guiding Principle is to ensure every student has an equal opportunity to graduate with the greatest number of postsecondary choices from the widest array of options. This report focuses on work to increase student participation in the SAT, to actualize this guiding principle.

During the 2017-18 school year, SCUSD took a major step in removing access barriers by administering the SAT to all grade 11 students on April 10, 2018. This was the first year that the district has partnered with the College Board to administer this college entrance examination during the school day. SCUSD adds to the growing list of districts offering an SAT Day. This year, more than 30 districts in California will administer the SAT during the day at no cost to students. By comparison, in 2014-15 four school districts in California administered the SAT at no cost to students during the school day. SAT School Day participation has grown significantly in California and nationally in recent years, just as there is a growing consensus among researchers that offering the SAT at no cost during the school day propels more students into college.

II. Driving Governance

The Equity, Access, and Social Justice Guiding Principle strives to ensure that every student has an equal opportunity to graduate with the greatest number of postsecondary choices from the widest array of options and is the driving force that guides overall district work.

IV. Goals, Objectives and Measures

Participating in college readiness exams such as the SAT and increasing the number of students minimally eligible to attend a California State University is consistent with our guiding principle of ensuring that all students graduate with the greatest number of postsecondary choices from the widest array of options.

V. Major Initiatives

The SAT School Day directly impacts our students' ability to graduate with the greatest number of postsecondary choices from the widest array of options. By offering the SAT during the school day at no cost to our students, students were able to fulfill one of the requirements for

entrance to many four-year institutions of higher education. Additionally, all students who take the SAT have access to free, personalized practice through the College Board's partnership with California-based Khan Academy.

VI. Results

The following results will be highlighted as a result of our coordinated efforts:

- 85% of 11th grade students participated in the 2017-18 SAT School Day
- More than 1,700 additional students entering their senior year will have an SAT score, removing one of the barriers to admission to a four-year college or university
- Approximately 160 incoming seniors now meet the minimum eligibility for CSU admission based on the A-G status, GPA, and results from the SAT School Day

VII. Lessons Learned/Next Steps

As this was the first year of our district's administration of the SAT during the school day, the following are highlights of our lessons learned on our journey of a disciplined cycle of continuous improvement:

- Greater outreach may improve student participation
- Approximately 430 more students who are currently A-G Subject Borderline could become CSU eligible with additional interventions

I. Overview/History of Department or Program:

Developing SCUSD's graduates who are highly prepared to pursue continued educational opportunities and achieve to their potential is an urgent issue for the district. The district's Equity Access and Social Justice Guiding Principle calls for *ALL students to be given an equal opportunity to graduate with the greatest number of postsecondary choices from the widest array of options*. The distance between this goal and the current reality for far too many SCUSD's students is of grave concern.

The disparities in performance in markers such as English Language Arts and Math Achievement, Graduation, A-G and Suspensions are persistent among historically underperforming student groups including students with disabilities, English Learners, Foster Youth, and those who are homeless and socio-economically disadvantaged. This is also true when data on graduation rates are disaggregated by racial and ethnic categories and Latino/a, African American, Native American and certain Asian Pacific Islander groups, namely Hmong and Laotian are the lowest performing groups. However, among the district's diverse racial and ethnic groups, the under performance of African American/Black students on an array of measures is particularly acute especially when viewed in relationship to their percentage in the general population.

The district recognizes that the outcomes it is currently producing are because of the way the system is, and has historically been, designed. Our job is to ensure that Black students and their peers graduate high school ready for whatever they aspire to do next in life this requires that we vigilantly pursue strategies and take action to change the design of the system to support greater student achievement so that all students are able to achieve their personal dreams.

II. Driving Governance:

The overarching governance is the Equity, Access and Social Justice Guiding principle which states that *all students will have an equal opportunity to graduate with the greatest number of postsecondary choices from the widest array of options*.

From an inequity perspective, there is a comprehensive body of research that documents the factors contributing to the underperformance of Black youth and how it can be addressed (Ed Trust West, 2015, Council of the Great City School, 2013, Jobs for the Future, 2012). In the seminal report from The Education Trust West, *Black Minds Matter (2015)*, the authors note that among California's racially and ethnically diverse student groups, Black students are more likely to:

- Be suspended or expelled,
- Be taught by ineffective teachers,
- Be identified for special education, and
- Take remedial or non-credit bearing course work as college students

Conversely, the report concludes that Black students are least likely to:

- be placed in gifted and talented education programs
- have access to and be given a full sequence of college preparatory classes
- graduate high school in four years
- complete a college degree

These troubling conclusions are born out in SCUSD data on African American student access to opportunities and achievement. We are committed to disrupting the predictability and persistence of these outcomes within our system through a strategic and disciplined approach drawing on research and best practice, assessing and monitoring progress, and partnering with Black students, parents/guardians, and community leaders.

III. Budget:

The budget for this item is still to be determined and will take into consideration the district's current fiscal condition. Funding from grants and other external sources will be investigated and pursued.

IV. Goals, Objectives and Measures:

The district has developed and/or identified several measures to assess if its efforts to impact the academic achievement and social emotional well-being of African American and other underperforming student groups are resulting in improvements. Key indicators are comprised of both formative and summative measures and include, but are not limited to, progress towards and rates of grade level readiness, graduation, A-G completion as well as attendance, suspensions, and students sense of connectedness and safety.

V. Major Initiatives:

The district is currently pursuing a number of initiatives focused on closing opportunity and achievement gaps and addressing the needs of African American as well as other underperforming student groups. These include:

Superintendent Meetings with Community Leaders – During the 2017-18 school year Superintendent Aguilar convened two meetings with a group of Black leaders to listen to concerns and proposed strategies for addressing the needs of African American students. These leaders expressed overwhelming support and commitment and are ready to partner with the district to change the educational trajectory for SCUSD's African American students.

Graduation Task Force and Recommendations – Superintendent Aguilar convened a Graduation Taskforce during the 2017 -18 school year comprised of an array of stakeholders including students, site leaders, community members, and district staff. The taskforce met from September -June and completed the task of developing a set of rigorous recommendations that will guide district policy and practice and lead to improvements in graduation rates where all students are fully prepared for any postsecondary option they may choose. It is important to note that the

graduation taskforce called out the need for additional supports for a few at-risk student groups including African American, English Learner, Foster and Students with Disabilities.

Expanded Learning Summer Program (ELSP) – SCUSD hosted its first Expanded Learning Summer Program, a five to six-week summer program that targeted underperforming students in key grade levels (1st, 3rd, 6th, 8th and 9th -12th). The program also included enrichment opportunities for students in grades 7-8.

Development of Data Infrastructure – The district has developed a strong data infrastructure that will allow staff to monitor the progress of student groups disaggregated by race/ethnicity as well as program groups (i.e. Special Education, English Learner, Foster Youth, etc.).

Work Teams - Superintendent Aguilar has tasked staff with analyzing the district's current infrastructure and systems and to research best practice and identify an initial set of clear impact indicators in key areas impacting outcomes for African American students. These work teams will expand to include other stakeholder groups once initial analyses are complete.

Student Bill of Rights

The Board's Policy and Governance Committee is in the process of identifying and reaching out to student groups to develop a Student Bill of Rights that will become a guiding document that outlines core beliefs and desired rights of students. Such core beliefs and rights will be student driven and may include perspectives on school climate, access to resources, and other related elements.

Revision to SRO Contract

The Board Policy and Governance Committee has requested to review and provide feedback on the forthcoming revisions to the School Resources Officer (SRO) contract. The Board approves and updated SRO contract every two years, and the Committee wishes to insure the updated contract includes an increased focus on the District's Safe Haven efforts, alternatives to traditional student discipline, and ongoing SRO training on implicit bias and other relevant topics. In addition to the contract, the Committee will be developing a new district policy in the near future focused on police interactions with students. That policy language will be based off of sample language provided by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP).

VI. Results:

Current results for SCUSD's Black or African American students reveal a troubling trend in several areas previously mentioned. The results for these students are the lowest or one of the lowest performing racial/ethnic groups when data are disaggregated for this factor. Black or African American students in SCUSD have the:

- Lowest or second lowest cohort graduation rate for federal ethnic and racial groups for three consecutive years. In 2016-17, the most recent year for which data are available, the cohort graduation rate for Black or African American students was second lowest at 74.8%. Pacific Islander students had the lowest rate (69.7%) of all federal ethnic and racial groups.
- Lowest or second lowest A-G completion rate for federal ethnic and racial groups for three consecutive years. In 2016-17, the most recent year for which data are available, the A-G completion rate for Black or African American students was second lowest at 26%. Pacific Islander students had the lowest rate (25%) of all federal ethnic and racial groups.
- Lowest percentage of students who met or exceeded ELA and Math standards on the SBAC for three consecutive years. In 2016-17, the most recent year available, 22% and 14% of these students met or exceeded standards in ELA and Math, respectively.
- Third average lowest 2017-18 SAT School Day results in ELA and lowest in Math results of all federal ethnic and racial groups. Pacific Islander and American Indian or Alaska Native students have the second lowest and lowest SAT Math results, respectively.

VII. Lessons Learned/Next Steps:

It will take a combination of district staff, board leadership and community partners to ensure that all students have an equal opportunity to graduate with the greatest number of postsecondary choices from the widest array of options. Next steps towards this end include the following:

- Research training opportunities focused on implicit bias and trauma informed practice to begin with the governance team in order to set the direction for scaling across the district.
- Continue meaningful engagement with African American community leaders and convene a rapid-cycle task force to develop/review/prioritize a set of recommendations for improving outcomes
- Strengthen and improve district initiatives and monitor them intentionally for impact on African American students and their peers.

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) # 18-D-DJ

Sacramento County Office of Education (SCOE)
and
Sacramento City Unified School District

Term of Agreement – July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2021

I. Purpose and Parties

The purpose of this MOU is to document the relationship and articulate roles and responsibilities between the Capital Adult Education Regional Consortium (CAERC) fiscal agent (SCOE) and each of the CAERC members. This Memorandum of Understanding is entered into between Sacramento County Office of Education (SCOE) and Sacramento City Unified School District. Sacramento City Unified School District and SCOE hereby agree to the following terms of this MOU. Sacramento City Unified School District is a member of CAERC. Sacramento City Unified School District hereinafter referred to as “CAERC Member.”

II. Background

AB 86 Planning Grant

The 2013-14 State Budget, under the auspices of Assembly Bill 86, appropriated \$25 million to the California Community College Chancellor’s Office (CCCCO) to provide funding for two-year adult education planning and implementation grants. AB 86 supported the development of regional adult education consortium plans that focus on expanding and improving opportunities for education and workforce services for adults. From July 1, 2013 to December 31, 2015, AB 86 consortia, consisting of K-12 school districts, community college districts, and other partners developed regional education and workforce service plans for adults.

AB 104 Adult Education Block Grant

On June 24, 2015 Governor Jerry Brown signed AB 104 into law. The 2015-16 year represented the transition period from the planning that took place with AB 86 to the actualization of the Adult Education Block Grant (AEBG). The 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18 State Budgets included \$500 million in new funding for seven authorized adult education program areas. On February 22, 2018, the CCCC and CDE notified all consortia of their intent to award AEBG funding for fiscal years 2018-19 and 2019-20. AEBG Office issued preliminary allocation schedule, which includes a proposed increase in funding at \$20.5 million. The AEBG Office offered the flexibility to allocate the potential new additional overall consortium amount to members in a variety of ways and based on the mutual decision. The January 2018 Governor’s Proposed Budget language refers to AEBG as the “ongoing proposition 98 General Fund”. Adult Education Block Grant Program is defined in California Education Code, Title 3, Division 7, Part 50, Chapter 5, Article 9. [84900 – 84920].

With this potential increase, the members decided to allocate it as an increase on the base funding from 2017-18. Additionally, members decided to apply the same increase to the amounts for professional development and transitions specialists, where applicable.

Role and Function of CAERC

The Capital Adult Education Regional Consortium is comprised of 14 members – 11 K-12 school districts, 2 county offices of education, the Los Rios Community College District (4 colleges) – and 24 partner agencies. For fiscal year 2018-19, a total of \$11,128,458 has been designated for the Capital Region and CAERC members. With the proposed increase, the total would be \$11,584,725.

III. Role of SCOE and CAERC Member

Role of SCOE

As the fiscal agent, SCOE will distribute consortium funds in accordance to the CAERC Governance and Fiscal Allocation Plans and Policies (amended January 10, 2018), AB 104, and Education Code section 84913. SCOE will be responsible for collecting, compiling, and reporting consortium-level fiscal and program information.

Role of CAERC Member

CAERC Member will adhere to the agreements outlined in the CAERC Governance and Fiscal Allocation Plans and Policies (amended May 10, 2017). CAERC Member will be responsible for participating in the consortium decision-making process and reporting member fiscal and program information to the consortium, and learner performance data to the AEBG Office as specified in AB 104 and any associated AEBG Program guidelines.

Role of Both Parties

Both parties will work together to comply with AB 104's reporting requirements. AB 104 requires that each consortium report allocations by participating members, budgets by object code, by program area and objective, and file expenditure and progress reports. Allocations by members should match expenditures, follow CAERC's 2018-19 Annual Plan, and adhere to the expenditure guidelines outlined in the AB 104 Allowable Uses Guide.

IV. SCOE Responsibilities

As the CAERC fiscal agent, SCOE will act as the banker, process expenses and expenditure contracts as agreed upon by the members, and work with the members to implement fiscal decisions per CAERC's 2018-19 Annual Plan and Three-Year Comprehensive Consortium Plan.

As the designated fiscal and program information-reporting agency, SCOE will:

1. Upon SCOE's receipt of AEBG funds from the California Department of Education and California Community College Chancellor's Office, in accordance to Education Code 84912, CAERC members shall receive monthly payments.
2. The AEBG Office is developing in multiple phases a new online fiscal reporting system, NOVA, which requires CAERC members to submit budget and expenditure information directly to the AEBG Office. SCOE will continue to provide member training and support with the reporting system as it is being developed. SCOE will provide the Consortium lead and fiscal staff who will certify member work plans and budgets for the fiscal year.
3. Compile and report members' consortium allocation expenditures and progress to the California Community Colleges Chancellor Office online system for Data and Accountability Fund, which is to be spent by December 31, 2018.

4. Facilitate members' reporting program-area expenditures for consortium allocations.
5. Compile and report consortium-level data required by AB 104 and AEBG as needed.
6. Carry out the consortium-level activities as approved by the members in the annual plan for the current program year.

V. CAERC Member Responsibilities

To enable SCOE's reporting to the AEBG Office, CAERC Member will be responsible for monitoring their own activities and reporting to SCOE all CAERC related fiscal and program activities. This includes any necessary student participation data, expenditure documentation, and any AB104 information necessary for the successful completion of AB104 mandated reports, performance measures, and program outcomes. Expenditures must follow CAERC's 2018-19 Annual Plan, adhere to the expenditure guidelines outlined in the AB 104 Allowable Uses Guide, and follow other guidelines established by the AEBG Office. In addition, all CAERC Members will adhere to CAERC approved policies related to fiscal, program and governance procedure.

CAERC Member will designate a person/persons with proper authority to certify all information submitted to SCOE and NOVA. CAERC Member acknowledges and accepts all responsibility for program related expenditures and certifies that expenditures are in compliance with the approved objectives, rules and regulations that govern the AEBG program. Furthermore, CAERC Member accepts all liability for any disallowed costs, should they arise.

In exchange for a minimum of **\$1,129,465.00**, CAERC Member will:

1. Submit expenditure information.
 - a. Report member expenditures into NOVA as per dates set by the AEBG Office.
 - b. Report final member expenditures to SCOE within 15 days after the close of the fiscal cycle as outlined in **Exhibit A, Shared Fiscal and Budget Agreement Policy**.
 - c. Abide by **Exhibit B, Reallocation of Unspent Funds Policy**. Member has until June 30 2020 to spend any reallocated funds.
 - d. Provide to CAERC Project staff an expenditure summary narrative, progress update narrative and/or other data for the Annual Report as required by the AEBG Office.
 - e. Use the lesser of the California Department of Education approved indirect cost rate for Program Year 2018-19 or the maximum set forth by the AEBG Office.
2. Submit required quarterly and end-of-year student level information via the CASAS TOPSpro Enterprise data reporting systems as specified by the AEBG Office.
3. Conduct professional development activities.
 - a. A minimum of \$5,000 per year is included in the CAERC Member total allocation for Fund D to cover professional development activities.
 - b. The additional funding is specifically allocated to address the following CAERC regional strategy: Offer Professional Development to Support the Regional Strategies
4. Submit other data as required by AB 104 and AEBG guidelines.

5. Submit reports and questions to the CAERC Office by email: caercsubmit@scoe.net
6. Follow Annual Plan General Assurances:
 - a. Participate in planning processes (annual, 3 year).
 - b. Spend funds within the AEBG program areas.
 - c. Participate in public meetings & decision-making.
 - d. Report student data in TOPSpro Enterprise.
 - e. Share information on other resources being used to serve adults.
 - f. Share financial expenditure and progress reports with the regional consortium.
 - g. Provide services that address the needs identified in the adult education plan.

VI. Term

This MOU Agreement shall be effective July 1, 2018 and ending on June 30, 2021. Either party may terminate this MOU with at least a sixty- (60) day written notice of intention to terminate this agreement. This agreement may also be terminated by CAERC officially designated members if it is determined a member is not compliant with the AEBG Allowable Uses Guide or for non-performance with fiscal and/or program reporting or as specified on the CAERC Governance Plan.

VII. Privacy

SCOE and all CAERC members will comply with all state and federal education privacy policies. SCOE and CAERC members will not disclose any personally identifiable information except upon written consent of the participating adult learners or as otherwise permitted by law.

VIII. Indemnity

CAERC Member agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless SCOE (including its directors, agents, officers and employees), from any claim, action, or proceeding arising from any actual or alleged acts or omissions of CAERC Member, its director, agents, officers, or employees relating to CAERC Member's duties and obligations described in this agreement or imposed by law.

SCOE agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless CAERC Member (including its directors, agents, officers and employees), from any claim, action, or proceeding arising from any actual or alleged acts or omissions of SCOE, its director, agents, officers, or employees relating to SCOE's duties and obligations described in this agreement or imposed by law.

It is the intention of the parties that this section imposes on each party responsibility to the other for the acts and omissions of their respective officials, employees, representatives, agents, subcontractors and volunteers, and that the provisions of comparative fault shall apply.

IX. Modification

Any changes to this MOU must be agreed to in writing by both parties. Should changes in legislation or the State budget occur that necessitate revision of this MOU, the CAERC Member and SCOE shall meet to revise accordingly.

X. Independent Agents

This MOU is by and between two independent agents, SCOE and CAERC Member, and is not intended to and shall not be construed to create the relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture and/or association between the two independent agents. The parties shall be expected to independently comply with all relevant laws, including those regarding worker’s compensation.

XI. Nondiscrimination

Any service provided by either party pursuant to this MOU shall be without discrimination based on the actual or perceived race, religious creed, color, national origin, nationality, ethnicity, ethnic group identification, ancestry, age, marital status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sex, or sexual orientation, in accordance with all applicable Federal and State laws and regulations.

XII. Insurance

Both parties shall maintain in full force Commercial Liability Insurance with limits of no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. Such requirement may be satisfied by coverage through a joint powers authority. Evidence of insurance coverage shall be furnished upon request by CAERC Member or by SCOE.

XIII. Execution of Agreement

This MOU may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Photographic copies of such signed counterparts may be used in lieu of the originals for any purpose.



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



In addition to the specific terms of the Grant Award Letter for Grant Number 20660739, Kaiser Foundation Hospital's ("KFH") award of this Grant, managed by the KFH Northern California Community Benefit Programs Division, is contingent upon Grantee's compliance with the following terms and conditions, and Grantee agrees to all these terms and conditions. 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**SAT SCHOOL DAY PROGRAM
FIXED FEE SCHEDULE**

I. BACKGROUND

The College Board will support the Client in administering the SAT exam during a school day. Under this Schedule, 'SAT' will be used to refer to both the SAT (without essay) and the SAT with Essay, as applicable. The scope of services encompasses a Client-sponsored SAT School Day administration and delivery of SAT data and reports through our online data portal (the 'Program'). The College Board supports this initiative by providing Clients with access to additional savings when Clients pay to administer the SAT to at least one entire grade of students ('Participating Grade'). Shifting this financial obligation from the student to the Client provides greater access for students to the SAT. Students who take the SAT exam in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule are herein referred to as 'Participants'.

II. DELIVERABLES

The College Board shall furnish the following SAT School Day deliverables and reports to the schools designated by the Client in Section IV (List of 'Participating Schools').

1. School and Student Deliverables:

- a. SAT test materials (test booklets)
- b. Student Online Score Report, delivered via the College Board website
- c. Access to Official SAT Practice on Khan Academy; students can link their College Board and Khan Academy accounts to receive free personalized practice recommendations based on their performance.
- d. School online access to individual student score reports and aggregate score reports, and downloadable student data file.
- e. Materials to support test administration (copies sent to schools)

2. Client Deliverables:

- a. Client online access to individual student score reports and aggregate score reports, and downloadable student data file, delivered via the College Board website.

3. Delivering SAT Practice Tools and Support. In addition to the free practice tools available at <http://sat.collegeboard.org/practice>, all students will have access to free, personalized, and focused practice resources through the College Board's collaboration with Khan Academy. Practice materials for the SAT exam are available at the Khan Academy website (<http://satpractice.org>). Client and participants shall use the Khan Academy practice tool and materials in accordance with Khan Academy's guidelines.

Additional SAT Readiness products (e.g., publications) and services (e.g., Professional Development Workshops) are not included as part of the Program. The Client may purchase these products and services separately.

4. Providing Accommodations to Participants with Disabilities. Accommodations for Participants with disabilities will be granted and administered according to the College Board's standard eligibility and administration procedures. Participants must apply for accommodations under the College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) program and must follow the SSD program's published procedures, which can be found at collegeboard.org/SSD. Only College Board-approved accommodations are permitted. Any provided accommodations not previously and explicitly approved by the College Board's SSD program will result in scores that are not valid, and that cannot be reported to colleges, scholarship programs and other designated score recipients. Client will be responsible for ensuring that an appropriate accommodations coordinator ('SSD Coordinator') is designated for each school to facilitate the application for and administration of approved accommodations. The 'SSD Coordinator Form' (used to establish an SSD Coordinator) is available at the above-referenced websites. Participants with accommodations previously approved by the College Board, and who have a College Board-issued SSD code, do not need to reapply for accommodations under this Program.

5. Required Information. The Client shall furnish the College Board with: (i) a list of participating schools as prescribed in Section IV (List of Participating Schools); (ii) a review of estimated student enrollment from a public data source as prescribed in Section V (Fee Calculation for Service and Deliverables); and (iii) the Client's contacts as prescribed in Section VI (Client Contact Information). The Client will review the pre-populated enrollment data from public data sources and send any adjustments as prescribed in Section V (Fee Calculation for Service and Deliverables).

Changes to the list of participating schools must be submitted by the deadline as noted below. Schools without a valid six-digit College Board school code must submit a request for one by the deadline noted.

In the event that any of the Client's schools are omitted from the List of Participating Schools or listed without valid school codes, such schools shall not be covered under this Schedule. Additionally, information relating to Participants who incorrectly enter a grade or fail to enter a grade on their answer sheets, will be incorrectly depicted in reports furnished under this Schedule, and Client acknowledges that no adjustments can be made.

6. **Communications.** The College Board will create and send a series of customized communications to support the Program. Communications will be organized and delivered in three phases: (1) Announcement and Awareness, which covers pre-test communications to inform Students, parents, districts and schools about the general purpose and goals of the SAT School Day initiative as well as key 'what to expect' information to help all Participants complete the necessary activities before test day; (2) Readiness and Preparation, which covers communications that school personnel will need to prepare and deliver the actual School Day experience, including important reminders from the College Board to Participants and their parents to make sure they know what to expect on test day; and (3) Post-Test Activity Reminders and Updates, which covers important information for school personnel, Participants and parents, as well as communications to all those who contributed to the success of the Program.
7. **Training of Designated Personnel at the Participating Schools.** The College Board will provide all necessary training and/or instructional materials to designated Client personnel who will act as SAT School Day Test Supervisors and Coordinators, SSD Coordinators, Associate SAT School Day Coordinators, Proctors, and Hall Monitors (collectively 'Designated Personnel'). The required training and/or instructional materials will be made available by the College Board to the Client and **must be completed two weeks before the test administration date.**

Designated SAT School Day Test Supervisors and Coordinators are required to adhere to all of the College Board's procedures, policies, and protocols related to test administration as specified in the SAT School Day Supervisor training and instructional materials, and may be required to complete SAT School Day staff agreements. Client is responsible for ensuring compliance with all required Designated Personnel training. College Board reserves the right to cancel the administration of the Program at any participating school where any Designated Personnel fail to complete such training prior to the scheduled test administration.

8. **SAT Student Guide distribution to Students.** Client shall ensure that copies of the SAT Student Guide are distributed to all Students **at least one week before test administration date.**
9. **SAT School Day Customer Service for Educators:**
The College Board will provide the Client with telephone customer service support for educators. Specifically the College Board will provide:
- Step-by-step assistance with College Board online tools (SSD System)
 - Assistance with completing required forms (AI Request Form)
 - Assistance with obtaining additional materials (Publications)
 - Feedback mechanism for counselors

III. SAT SCHOOL DAY TERMS AND CONDITIONS

SAT Program

1. **SAT Ownership.** The Client agrees and acknowledges that the SAT exam, SAT with Essay exam, and all items (questions) contained therein, including all copies thereof, all examination materials and all data, including but not limited to student scores derived from the exam, collected under this Agreement are at all times exclusively owned by the College Board, who is the exclusive owner of all rights therein, in and to the SAT examination including, without limitations, all copyrights, trademarks, trade secrets, patents and other similar proprietary rights, and all renewals and extensions thereof. Nothing in this Agreement should be interpreted to indicate that the College Board is passing its proprietary rights in and to the SAT exam, and/or SAT with Essay exam, to the Client or that its normal security procedures will be altered in any way. SAT is a registered trademark of the College Board.

SAT Data License

2. **SAT Data and Reporting.** For the April 10, 2018 administration, SAT question content and answer explanations will be provided in the online system, for the Primary Test Date only.

In accordance with College Board policies, any test irregularity, including mis-administrations or security breaches, will be thoroughly investigated and may result in score cancellations. SERVICES AGREEMENT

Date: July 1, 2018 **Place:** Sacramento, California

Parties: Sacramento City Unified School District, a political subdivision of the State of California, (hereinafter referred to as the "District"); and Lozano Smith, LLP (hereinafter referred to as "Attorney").

Recitals:

A. The District is a public school district in the County of Sacramento, State of California, and has its administrative offices located at the Serna Center, 5735 47th Avenue, Sacramento, CA 95824.

B. The District desires to engage the services of the Attorney and to have said Attorney render services on the terms and conditions provided in this Agreement.

C. California Government Code Section 53060 authorizes a public school district to contract with and employ any persons to furnish to the District, services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal, or administrative matters if such persons are specially trained, experienced and competent to perform the required services, provided such contract is approved or ratified by the governing board of the school district. Said section further authorizes the District to pay from any available funds such compensation to such persons as it deems proper for the services rendered, as set forth in the contract.

D. The Attorney is specially trained, experienced and competent to perform the services required by the District, and such services are needed on a limited basis.

In consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1. SERVICES.

The Attorney hereby agrees to provide to the District the services as described below ("Services"):

Legal Counsel with respect to matters District specifically refers to Attorney; Legal services as reasonably required to represent District in such matters as may arise through the course of the school year; Take reasonable steps to keep District informed of significant developments and respond to District's inquiries regarding those matters.

ARTICLE 2. TERM.

This Agreement shall commence on July 1, 2018 and continue through June 30, 2019, unless sooner terminated, as set forth in Article 10 of this Agreement, provided all services under this Agreement are performed in a manner that satisfies both the needs and reasonable expectations of the District. The determination of a satisfactory performance shall be in the sole judgment and discretion of the District in light of applicable industry standards, if applicable. The term may be extended by mutual consent of the parties on the same terms and conditions by a mutually executed addendum.

ARTICLE 3. PAYMENT.

District agrees to pay Attorney for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this Agreement as follows:

Fee Rate: Attorney will be paid for services rendered based upon the attached rate schedule (Exhibit B) with a not to exceed amount of one million dollars (\$1,000,000). Agreements for legal fees on other-than-an-hourly basis may be made by mutual agreement for special projects.

Payment shall be made within 30 days upon submission of periodic invoice(s) to the attention of Raoul Bozio, Legal Services Manager, Sacramento City Unified School District, P. O. Box 246870, Sacramento, California 95824-6870.

ARTICLE 4. EQUIPMENT AND FACILITIES.

District will provide Attorney with access to all needed records and materials during normal business hours upon reasonable notice. However, District shall not be responsible for nor will it be required to provide personnel to accomplish the duties and obligations of Attorney under this Agreement. Attorney will provide all other necessary equipment and facilities to render the services pursuant to this Agreement.

ARTICLE 5. WORKS FOR HIRE/COPYRIGHT/TRADEMARK/PATENT

The Attorney understands and agrees that all matters specifically produced under this Agreement that contain no intellectual property or other protected works owned by Attorney shall be works for hire and shall become the sole property of the District and cannot be used without the District's express written permission. The District shall have the right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the District.

As to those matters specifically produced under this Agreement that are composed of intellectual property or other protected works, Attorney must clearly identify to the District those protected elements included in the completed work. The remainder of the intellectual property of such completed works shall be deemed the sole property of the District. The completed works that include both elements of Attorney's protected works and the District's protected works, shall be subject to a mutual non-exclusive license agreement that permits either party to utilize the completed work in a manner consistent with this Agreement including the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose in any medium.

ARTICLE 6. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR.

Attorney's relationship to the District under this Agreement shall be one of an independent contractor. The Attorney and all of their employees shall not be employees or agents of the District and are not entitled to participate in any District pension plans, retirement, health and welfare programs, or any similar programs or benefits, as a result of this Agreement. The Attorney and their employees or agents rendering services under this agreement shall not be employees of the District for federal or state tax purposes, or for any other purpose. The Attorney acknowledges and agrees that it is the sole responsibility of the Attorney to report as income its compensation from the District and to make the requisite tax filings and payments to the appropriate federal, state, and/or local tax authorities. No part of the Attorney's compensation shall be subject to withholding by the District for the payment of social security, unemployment, or disability insurance, or any other similar state or federal tax obligation.

The Attorney agrees to defend, indemnify and hold the District harmless from any and all claims, losses, liabilities, or damages arising from any contention by a third party that an employer-employee relationship exists by reason of this Agreement.

The District assumes no liability for workers' compensation or liability for loss, damage or injury to persons or property during or relating to the performance of services under this Agreement.

ARTICLE 7. FINGERPRINTING REQUIREMENTS.

Education Code Section 45125.1 states that if employees of any Attorney providing school site administrative or similar services may have any contact with any pupils, those employees shall be fingerprinted by the Department of Justice (DOJ) before entering the school site to determine that they have not been convicted of a serious or violent felony. If the District determines that more than limited contact with students will occur during the performance of these services, Attorney will not perform services until all employees providing services have been fingerprinted by the DOJ and DOJ fingerprinting clearance certification has been provided to the District.

District has determined that services performed under this Agreement will result in limited contact with pupils. Attorney is required to comply with the conditions listed in Exhibit A, Certification of Compliance. If the Attorney is unwilling to comply with these requirements, the Attorney's employees may not enter any school site until the Attorney provides the certification of fingerprinting clearance by the DOJ for employees providing services. These requirements apply to self-employed Attorneys.

ARTICLE 8. MUTUAL INDEMNIFICATION.

Each of the Parties shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the other Party, its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims, liabilities and costs, for any damages, sickness, death, or injury to person(s) or property, including payment of reasonable attorney's fees, and including without limitation all consequential damages, from any cause whatsoever, arising directly or indirectly from or connected with the operations or services performed under this Agreement, caused in whole or in part by the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of the Parties or its agents, employees or consultants.

It is the intention of the Parties, where fault is determined to have been contributory, principles of comparative fault will be followed and each Party shall bear the proportionate cost of any damage attributable to fault of that Party. It is further understood and agreed that such indemnification will survive the termination of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 9. GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE.

Prior to commencement of services and during the life of this Agreement, Attorney shall provide the District with a certificate of insurance reflecting its comprehensive general liability insurance coverage in a sum not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence naming District as an additional insured. Such insurance as is afforded by this policy shall be primary, and any insurance carried by District shall be excess and noncontributory. If insurance is not kept in force during the entire term of the Agreement, District may procure the necessary insurance and pay the premium therefore, and the premium shall be paid by the Attorney to the District.

ARTICLE 9(a). PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE

Prior to the commencement of services under this Services Agreement, the Attorney shall furnish to the District satisfactory proof that the Attorney has purchased professional liability coverage, on a claims made basis, extending protection to Attorney in an amount no less than Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) per claim, and Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) in the annual aggregate.

Each of Attorney's consultants shall, to the extent available, have errors and omissions insurance for their services as required or approved by the District. The District may, at its discretion and according to the circumstances, approve a variation in the foregoing insurance requirement, upon a determination that the coverage, scope, limits, and/or forms of such insurance are not commercially available.

ARTICLE 10. TERMINATION.

The District may terminate this Agreement without cause upon giving the Attorney thirty days written notice. Notice shall be deemed given when received by Attorney, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

The District may terminate this Agreement with cause upon written notice of intention to terminate for cause. A Termination for Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this Agreement by the Attorney; (b) any act by the Attorney exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) the Attorney confirms its insolvency or is adjudged a bankrupt; Attorney makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors, or a receiver is appointed on account of the Attorney's insolvency.

Ten (10) calendar days after service of such notice, the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, or this Agreement shall cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the District may secure the required services from another Attorney. If the cost to the District exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, the excess cost shall be charged to and collected from the Attorney. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to the District. Written notice by the District shall be deemed given when received by the other party or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

ARTICLE 11. ASSIGNMENT.

This Agreement is for personal services to be performed by the Attorney. Neither this Agreement nor any duties or obligations to be performed under this Agreement shall be assigned without the prior written consent of the District, which shall not be unreasonably withheld. In the event of an assignment to which the District has consented, the assignee or his/her or its legal representative shall agree in writing with the District to personally assume, perform, and be bound by the covenants, obligations, and agreements contained in this Agreement.

ARTICLE 12. NOTICES.

Any notices, requests, demand or other communication required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given on the date of service if served personally on the party to whom notice is to be given, or on the third day after mailing if mailed to the party to whom notice is to be given, by first class mail, registered or certified, postage prepaid, or on the day after dispatching by Federal Express or another overnight delivery service, and properly addressed as follows:

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ARTICLE 13. ENTIRE AGREEMENT.

This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior understanding between them with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement. There are no promises, terms, conditions or obligations, oral or written, between or among the parties relating to the subject matter of this Agreement that are not fully expressed in this Agreement. This Agreement may not be modified, changed, supplemented or terminated, nor may any obligations under this Agreement be waived, except by written instrument signed by the party to be otherwise expressly permitted in this Agreement.

ARTICLE 14. CONFLICT OF INTEREST.

The Attorney shall abide by and be subject to all applicable District policies, regulations, statutes or other laws regarding conflict of interest. Attorney shall not hire any officer or employee of the District to perform any service covered by this Agreement. If the work is to be performed in connection with a Federal contract or grant, Attorney shall not hire any employee of the United States government to perform any service covered by this Agreement.

Attorney affirms to the best of their knowledge, there exists no actual or potential conflict of interest between Attorney’s family, business or financial interest and the services provided under this Agreement. In the event of a change in either private interest or services under this Agreement, any question regarding possible conflict of interest which may arise as a result of such change will be brought to the District’s attention in writing.

ARTICLE 15. NONDISCRIMINATION.

It is the policy of the District that in connection with all services performed under contract, there will be no discrimination against any prospective or active employee engaged in the work because of race, color, ancestry, national origin, handicap, religious creed, sex, age or marital status. Attorney agrees to comply with applicable federal and California laws including, but not limited to, the California Fair Employment and Housing Act.

ARTICLE 16. SEVERABILITY.

Should any term or provision of this Agreement be determined to be illegal or in conflict with any law of the State of California, the validity of the remaining portions or provisions shall not be affected thereby. Each term or provision of this Agreement shall be valid and be enforced as written to the full extent permitted by law.

ARTICLE 17. RULES AND REGULATIONS.

All rules and regulations of the District’s Board of Education and all federal, state and local laws, ordinance and regulations are to be strictly observed by the Attorney pursuant to this Agreement. Any rule, regulation or law required to be contained in this Agreement shall be deemed to be incorporated herein.

ARTICLE 18. APPLICABLE LAW/VENUE.

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. If any action is instituted to enforce or interpret this Agreement, venue shall only be in the appropriate state or federal court having venue over matters arising in Sacramento County, California, provided that nothing in this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of immunity to suit by the District.

ARTICLE 19. RATIFICATION BY BOARD OF EDUCATION.

This Agreement is not enforceable and is invalid unless and until it is approved and/or ratified by the governing board of the Sacramento City Unified School District, as evidenced by a motion of said board duly passed and adopted.

EXHIBIT A

CERTIFICATION of COMPLIANCE

Fingerprinting: Education Code section 45125.1 provides that any contractor providing school site administrative or similar services to a school district must certify that employees who may come into contact with pupils have not been convicted of a serious or violent felony as defined by law. Those employees must be fingerprinted and the Department of Justice (DOJ) must report to the Contractor if they have been convicted of such felonies. No person convicted may be assigned to work under the contract. Depending on the totality of circumstances including (1) the length of time the employees will be on school grounds, (2) whether pupils will be in proximity of the site where the employees will be working and (3) whether the contractors will be working alone or with others, the District may determine that the employees will have only limited contact with pupils and neither fingerprinting nor certification is required.

The District has determined that section 45125.1 is applicable to this Agreement, and that the employees assigned to work at a school site under this Agreement will have only limited contact with pupils, provided the following conditions are met at all times:

1. Employees shall not come into contact with pupils or work in the proximity of pupils at any time except under the direct supervision of school district employees.
2. Employees shall use only restroom facilities reserved for District employees and shall not use student restrooms at any time.
3. Attorney will inform all employees who perform work at any school or District site of these conditions and require its employees, as a condition of employment, to adhere to them.
4. Attorney will immediately report to District any apparent violation of these conditions.
5. Attorney shall assume responsibility for enforcement of these conditions at all times during the term of this Agreement.

If, for any reason, the Attorney cannot adhere to the conditions stated above, the Attorney shall immediately so inform the District and shall assign only employees who have been fingerprinted and cleared for employment by the Department of Justice. In that case, the Attorney shall provide to the District the names of all employees assigned to perform work under this Agreement. Compliance with these conditions, or with the fingerprinting requirements, is a condition of this Agreement, and the District reserves the right to suspend or terminate the Agreement at any time for noncompliance.

Agreement for Professional Expert/Consultant Services

This agreement made and entered into this July 1, 2018, by and between the Sacramento City Unified School District, Health Services, hereinafter referred to as "SCUSD", and Action Supportive Care Services, hereinafter referred to as "Consultant".

This agreement shall commence on July 1, 2018, and shall continue until and including June 30, 2019.

WHEREAS, SCUSD is desirous of having certain special services performed: and

WHEREAS, Consultant, is willing to perform such services.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises and agreements herein

Contained, IT IS AGREED by and between the parties hereto as follows:

1.0 Scope of Work

The parties agree that consultant is to provide nursing services, under the terms and conditions of this agreement and in accordance with any applicable requirements of federal or state special education regulations, local laws, rules and/or regulations, third party reimbursement sources (public or private) or other reimbursement sources covering Consultant's services. The nursing/health instruction aide services are to be provided in the students' school of attendance, or in certain circumstances, at agreed field trip locations. Consultant agrees that all services will be rendered with regard to conditions of participation and reimbursement coverage required by governmental and third party reimbursement sources.

In the event that a Special Education Student(s) does not attend school, whether due to illness or any other reason, the scheduled, skilled nurse, that has previously been assigned to also care for a General Education student, would continue to provide care for the duration of time needed, no less than 4 hours, by that General Education Student(s) Skilled Nurse. Should a General Education Student not need the entire 4 hours, the Skilled Nurse would assist with any other Skilled Nursing needs on any campus. Consultant will notify Health Services via email to Rebecca-Wall@SCUSD.edu and this care would be billed to the SCUSD, Health Services.

In the event that the General Education student has a fieldtrip, Consultant will provide care for the duration of time needed, no less than 4 hours. Consultant will notify Health Services via email to Rebecca-Wall@SCUSD.edu and this care would be billed to the SCUSD, Health Services.

In the event that Consultant is unable to provide service, whether due to illness or any other reason, **Consultant will notify the Lead School Nurse, Paula Kuhlman, and School Nurse for the school as soon as possible.** Action Supportive Care Services will make every effort to offer a replacement.

Such services shall, at times, include travel and may be performed at other locations, specifically authorized by SCUSD.

2.0 Independent Contractor

This agreement does not constitute a hiring of consultant by SCUSD. It is the parties' intention that so far as shall be in conformity with the law the consultant shall be an independent contractor and not an SCUSD employee. In conformity therewith the Consultant shall retain sole and absolute discretion and judgment in the manner and means of providing consulting services to the SCUSD. This agreement shall not be construed as a partnership and SCUSD shall not be liable for any obligation incurred by the Consultant. However, Consultant shall comply with all policies, rules and regulations of the SCUSD in connection with the provision of the Consultant's services. All services rendered by the Consultant shall be rendered in a competent, efficient and satisfactory manner and in strict accordance with the currently approved methods and practices in the Consultant's professional specialty. The Consultant assumes professional and administrative responsibility for the services rendered only to the extent that:

- a. The SCUSD is responsible for assuring itself that the Consultant is qualified by education and/or experience to render the services contract for; and
- b. The Consultant is satisfying all of the obligations herein set forth.

3.0 Amendment of Scope of Work

Said scope of work may be amended with the written approval of both Consultant and SCUSD.

4.0 Payment Schedule

Consultant will be compensated by SCUSD for services rendered on a fee-for-service basis from the first day of a month to the end of the same month (hereinafter referred to as the "billing period") according to invoices submitted to SCUSD via email to Rebecca-Wall@scusd.edu no later than five (5) days following the end of the billing period in which said services were rendered.

- \$50.00/hour will be charged for the following services:
 - Skilled nursing services performed by an RN/LVN, including administration of medications
- \$30.00/hour will be charged for the following services:
 - Health/Instruction Aide
- \$52/hour will be charged for the following services:
 - Out of Area/Overnight Field Trips

(Travel time and/or mileage at the current business mileage reimbursement rate as defined by the IRS at <https://www.irs.gov/tax-professionals/standard-mileage-rate> may be charged for field trips greater than or equal to 30 miles from the downtown Sacramento area, if the nurse is required to drive his or her own vehicle)

Invoices will include:

- The Name of the Contractor
- Services Dates, Hours of Services rendered, charges applicable.

Any amendments or changes to the schedule of fees hereinabove stated shall be effective thirty days (30) following the date upon which the parties hereto agree to such amendment or change in writing. Upon parties' mutual acceptance in writing, the amended schedule of fees shall become part of this agreement.

5.0 Records

Consultant shall maintain at all times complete detailed records with regard to work performed under this agreement in a form acceptable to SCUSD, and SCUSD shall have the right to inspect such records at any reasonable time. Notwithstanding any other terms to this agreement, no payments shall be made to Consultant until SCUSD is satisfied that work of such value has been rendered pursuant to this agreement.

6.0 Non-Assignability

This agreement and the rights and duties there under shall not be assigned in whole or in part without the express written consent of SCUSD.

7.0 Compensation Insurance

SCUSD shall not provide worker's compensation insurance coverage for Consultant.

Consultant shall maintain general liability insurance, including automobile coverage with limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage. Where requested, the coverage shall be primary as to SCUSD and shall name SCUSD as an additional insured. Copies of all policies or certificates of worker's compensation and liability insurance shall be provided to the SCUSD within ten (10) days of signing this Agreement.

8.0 Background Check/DOJ Clearance

Consultant must submit or have submitted their fingerprint live scan to DOJ for clearance: All of the Consultant's employees or independent contractors who may come in contact with pupils must also have this clearance. All of the Consultant's employees or independent contractors who may come in contact with pupils must also have current TB clearance.

The Consultant shall certify in writing to the SCUSD that none of its employees who may come in contact with pupils have been convicted of a violent or serious felony (Penal Code § 667.5(c), 1192.7 (c). (Attach Certification Letter)

9.0 Cancellation

This agreement may be cancelled by SCUSD or Consultant upon the giving of ten (10) days advance written notice. Such notice shall be personally served or given by United States Mail. In the event of cancellation, Consultant shall be paid for all work performed to the date of cancellation.

In Addition, SCUSD may terminate this Agreement for cause should Consultant fail to perform any part of this Agreement. In the event of a termination for cause, SCUSD may secure the required services from another Consultant. If the cost to SCUSD exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, Consultant shall pay the additional cost.

10.0 Hold Harmless and Indemnification

The Consultant agrees to hold harmless and to indemnify the SCUSD for:

Any injury to person or property sustained by the Consultant or by any of the individuals participating in or associated with him/her, however, caused; and

Any injury to person or property sustained by any person firm or corporation, caused by any act, neglect, default or omission, of the Consultant, or of any person, firm, or corporation directly or indirectly employed by the Consultant upon or in connection with this agreement, or any other persons/parties services arising out of the or in the course of the term of this agreement, and the Consultant at his/her own cost, expense and risk, shall defend any, and all actions, suits or other legal proceedings that may be instituted against the SCUSD for any such claim or demand, and pay or satisfy any judgment that may be rendered against the SCUSD in any such action, suit or legal proceedings or result thereof.

11.0 Attorney's Fees

In the event of the commencement of suit to enforce any of the terms or conditions in this agreement, the prevailing party in such litigation shall be entitled to recover such sum as the court may fix as attorney's fees.

12.0 Notice

Any notice required to be provided to any party to this agreement shall be in writing and shall be considered effective as of the date of deposit with the United States Postal Service by certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, return receipt and addressed to the party as follows:

Each party hereto agrees to notify its employees, agents or subsidiaries of any notice given under this agreement which materially affects the duties of the parties to this agreement. Any changes in the above addresses for notice shall be provided to the other party to this agreement with five (5) days of such change.

13.0 Severability

In the event that any portion of this agreement is finally determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, such provision shall be deemed void and the remainder of this agreement shall continue in full force and effect.

14.0 Civil Rights

Consultant agrees to comply with Title VI of Civil Rights Act of 1964 and all requirements imposed pursuant to the regulation of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare (45 C.F.R. Part 80) issued pursuant to that Title, to the end that, no person in the United States shall, on the ground of race, color or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity from which Federal funds are used in support of the Consultant's activities.

15.0 Miscellaneous

Each party to this agreement acknowledges that no representation, inducement, promises or agreements, orally or otherwise, have been made by any party, or anyone acting on behalf of any parties, which are not embodied herein, and that no other agreement, statement or promise not contained in this agreement shall be valid or binding.

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the Sacramento City Unified School District (the "Board") on January 27, 1992 duly adopted Resolution No. 1588 (the "Resolution") establishing Sacramento City Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 2 (the "Community Facilities District," or "CFD No. 2") for the purpose of providing for the financing of certain facilities in and for CFD No. 2 and providing for the levy of a special tax in and for CFD No. 2.

WHEREAS, the Sacramento City Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 2 Tax Report, Fiscal Year 2018-19 (the "Tax Report") has been submitted to the Board and the Board has determined to approve the Tax Report to levy the special tax at the rates specified in the Tax Report and to apportion them in the manner specified therein.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board, acting on behalf of CFD No. 2, resolves as follows:

Section 1. The Sacramento City Unified School District CFD No. 2 Tax Report, Fiscal Year 2018-19, in the form submitted to this meeting and on file with the Board is hereby approved and adopted.

Section 2. Pursuant to section 53340 of the Government Code of the State of California, the special tax is hereby levied at the rates specified in the Tax Report and is hereby apportioned in the manner specified in the Resolution (and as more particularly described in the Tax Report).

Section 3. Pursuant to section 53340 of the Government Code of the State of California, the special tax shall be collected by the Tax Collector of the County of Sacramento in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem property taxes are collected and shall be subject to the same procedure, sale, and lien priorities in case of delinquency as is provided for ad valorem taxes, subject to all other conditions set forth in the Resolution.

Section 4. In order to have the tax levied hereby collected in the next tax collection period and thus available to finance the facilities approved by the electors of CFD No. 2, the Superintendent shall deliver the Tax Report together with a certified copy of this Resolution to the tax collector of the County of Sacramento no later than August 10, 2018.

Section 5. The Superintendent and his designees are hereby authorized to make changes to the Tax Report in response to appeals from taxpayers or otherwise in order to correct errors that may, from time to time, arise in the application of the special tax to particular parcels. Claims for refund of the tax shall comply with the following and any additional procedures as established by the Board:

(a) All claims shall be filed with the Superintendent of the Sacramento City Unified School District no later than one year after the date the tax was paid. The claimant shall file the claim within this time period and the claim shall be finally acted upon by the Board as a prerequisite to bringing suit thereon.

(b) Pursuant to Government Code section 935(b), the claim shall be subject to the provisions of Government Code sections 945.6 and 946.

(c) The Board shall act on a timely claim within the time period required by Government Code section 912.4.

(d) The procedure described in this Resolution, and any additional procedures established by the Board, shall be the exclusive claims procedure for claimants seeking a refund of the tax. The decision of the Board shall be final.

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SUMMARY

The Sacramento City Unified School District formed Sacramento City Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 2 (CFD #2) for the purpose of financing new and improved school facilities for students generated by new development within the District. CFD #2 was formed after receiving over two-thirds support (on an acreage voting basis) from property owners included within the Community Facilities District. The special tax proceeds from this CFD are being used to finance school construction bonds and / or provide public school facilities. This Report summarizes the fiscal year 2018-19 Special Tax, Method of Apportionment, and other related data.

There are currently 1,382 parcels in CFD #2, which includes both subdivided and non-subdivided parcels. As of June 30, 2018 1,330 building permits for new homes within the Community Facility District have been issued, 17 parcels have prepaid their CFD #2 tax obligation in full. The total annual special tax to be collected within CFD #2 for fiscal year 2018-19 is \$1,758,944. Table 1 summarizes the current and historical Special Tax data by year.

ADMINISTRATION OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT

GENERAL ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

The Mello-Roos Community Facilities District Act of 1982 (the Act) requires that a Special Tax Report be prepared annually to identify the Special Tax Rate for all parcels to be assessed in the upcoming fiscal year. The levy data must subsequently be filed with the County Auditor before August 15 for inclusion on property tax bills.

After submission of the Special Tax levies, the final levies should be confirmed with the County Auditor prior to the preparation of tax bills, which typically occurs in October. The Special Tax is collected in two equal installments on the tax bills that are due on December 10 and April 10.

DELINQUENCY PROCEDURES

The District participates in the "Teeter Plan" whereby the Counties pay all delinquent special taxes to the District and in return the Counties institute collection proceedings and, when collected, keep all delinquent payments with interest and penalties. This plan allows the District to maintain reliable special tax revenues and reduces the cost of collection.

The District reviews the Tax Collector's public records annually by June 30 to determine the amount of special tax revenues and delinquencies during the fiscal year. If the amount of collections is less than 95% of the amount of special tax levy in such fiscal year, the School District has covenanted with bondholders to institute foreclosure proceedings no later than October 31 to enforce the lien against delinquent installments. The District is also obligated to institute foreclosure proceedings in the case of a single property owner who is delinquent by more than \$2,000. No property owner is currently delinquent by such amount and the delinquency rate on the special taxes is below 5%, so there is no requirement to commence foreclosure proceedings at this time.

NOTICES OF SPECIAL TAX LIEN

The Act states "For purposes of enabling sellers of real property subject to the levy of special taxes to satisfy the notice requirements of subdivision (b) of Section 1102.6 of the Civil Code, the designated office, department, or bureau shall furnish a Notice of Special Tax to any individual requesting the notice or any owner of property subject to a special tax levied by the local agency within five working days so receiving a request for such notice. The local agency may charge a reasonable fee for this service not to exceed ten dollars." A copy of this notice is included as Exhibit A.

In addition, any developer, subdivider or his or her agent or representative shall not sell or lease any property subject to the Special Tax until the prospective purchaser or lessee has been furnished with and signed a written notice of Special Tax Lien.

This notice is designed to clearly and accurately provide information about the special tax and the levy for the subject property.

SCI Consulting Group has developed a custom software system that will locate any property in the District and, among other functions, print customized notices of special tax lien. This software is included as a standard component of our administrative services.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

PUBLIC INFORMATION

Property owners and other interested persons can obtain information regarding special tax levies and other information by contacting the District or SCI Consulting Group at telephone number (800) 273-5167. The telephone number for SCI Consulting Group is also included with property tax bills.

ASSESSOR AND AUDITOR FILING AND REPORTING

Pursuant to the Act, the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Annual Report along with all special tax levies for the upcoming fiscal year must be filed with the County Auditor by August 10. The report and special tax levies will be submitted and confirmed for the fiscal year 2018-19.

CDIAC REPORTING

Article 53359.5 of the Act stipulates that any bonds sold on or after January 1, 1993 must provide the California Debt and Investment Advisory Commission (CDIAC) with annual reports not later than October 30, including the following information:

1. The principal amount of any bonds outstanding.
2. The balance in the bond reserve fund.
3. The balance in the capitalized interest fund, if any.
4. The number of parcels which are delinquent with respect to their special tax payments, the amount that each parcel is delinquent, the length of time that each has been delinquent, and when foreclosure was commenced for each delinquent parcel.
5. The balance in any construction funds.
6. The assessed value of all parcels subject to the special tax to repay the bonds as shown on the most recent equalized roll.

RATE AND METHOD OF APPORTIONMENT OF SPECIAL TAX

EXHIBIT B - THE SPECIAL TAX FORMULA

SACRAMENTO CITY UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO.2 RATE AND METHOD OF APPORTIONMENT

A Special Tax, determined as described below, shall be levied each Fiscal Year by the Sacramento City Unified School District (the "District") within the boundaries of Community Facilities District No.2 ("CFD No. 2") to pay the Authorized Costs of the CFD No. 2, in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein.

1. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply:
 - A. "Assessable Space" means a quantity equal to the area (expressed in square feet) within the perimeter of a residential structure, not including any carport, walkway, garage, overhang, patio, enclosed patio, detached accessory structure or similar structure. This quantity shall be determined by the Superintendent in accordance with the standard practice used by the building department of the city or county issuing the building permit when calculating structural perimeters.
 - B. "Assessor's Parcel" ("Parcel") means a parcel of land designated on a map of the Sacramento County Assessor and assigned a discrete identifying number.
 - C. "Authorized Costs" means all authorized costs and expenses of the CEO set forth by law, and all costs necessary to administer the bonds, collect and administer the special taxes, and administer the CFD, including but not limited to funds to pay current debt service on the bonds, to accumulate funds for future debt service, to pay amounts delinquent on the bonds (or to become delinquent based upon past special tax delinquencies), to replenish the reserve fund to its proper level (or to reimburse payment to be made from the reserve fund based upon past special tax delinquencies), to pay directly for any authorized facilities or to accumulate funds for that purpose.
 - D. "Board" means the District's and CFD's Governing Board.
 - E. "CFD" or "CFD No. 2" means the Community Facilities District No. 2 of the Sacramento City Unified School District.
 - F. "District" means the Sacramento City Unified School District.
 - G. "Escalation Factor" means a rate of not more than 4.75 % per annum to be annually determined by the Board at the time taxes are levied and to be used to

calculate the Mitigation Rate.

- H. "Fiscal Year" means the period starting on July 1 and ending on the following June 30, except that the first Fiscal Year shall commence on the date the Board adopts the Resolution of intention to form CFD No. 2 and shall end on the next succeeding June 30.
 - I. "Mitigation Rate" means, for calculations of the Special Tax payable in the first Fiscal Year, with respect to Multifamily Residential Property, \$2.42 per square foot of Assessable Space and, with respect to Single Family Residential Property, \$4.15 per square foot of Assessable Space and, for calculations of the Special Tax payable in each Fiscal Year thereafter, such amounts increased each Fiscal Year by the Escalation Factor and otherwise adjusted as provided in Section (B) hereof.
 - J. "Multifamily Residential Property" means Residential Property for which a building permit for multifamily dwelling units is expected to be issued.
 - K. "Residential Property" ("Property") means an Assessor's Parcel within CFD No. 2 that is zoned for residential use.
 - L. "Single Family Residential Property" means Residential Property for which a building permit for a single family detached dwelling unit is expected to be issued.
 - M. "Special Tax" means the special tax or special taxes authorized to be levied within CFD No. 2.
 - N. "Superintendent" means the District Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee.
 - O. "Tax Collection Schedule" means document to be prepared annually by the Superintendent for use by the Sacramento County Auditor in collecting the annual installments of the Special Tax each Fiscal Year.
 - P. "Tax-Exempt Property" means any property within CFD No. 2 that in accordance with Section 2 hereof will not be taxed.
 - Q. "Territory to be Annexed" means any territory that is within District boundaries but not included within the boundaries of CFD No. 2 upon formation.
2. Tax-Exempt Property:

Governmental property owned by the state, federal or other local governments will not be taxed except:

- A. If a public agency owning property including property held in trust for any beneficiary, that is exempt from a special tax pursuant to Government Code Section 53340 grants a leasehold after January 1, 1988, or other possessory interest in the property to a nonexempt person or entity, the Special Tax shall, notwithstanding Government Code Section 53340, be levied in the leasehold or possessory interest and shall be payable by the owner of the leasehold or possessory interest.
- B. If property not otherwise exempt from a special tax is acquired by a public entity other than the District through a negotiated transaction, or by gift or devise, the Special Tax shall, notwithstanding Government Code Section 53340, continue to be levied on the property acquired and shall be enforceable against the public entity that acquired the property.
- C. If property subject to a special tax is acquired by a public entity through eminent domain proceedings, the obligation to pay the Special Tax shall be treated as if it were a special annual assessment. For this purpose, the present value of the obligation to pay the Special Tax to pay the principal and interest on any indebtedness incurred by the CFD prior to the date of apportionment determined pursuant to Section 5082 of the Revenue and Taxation Code shall be treated the same as a fixed lien special assessment.

Parcels that are not Residential Property shall not be taxed

- 3. Classification of Property. Determination of Tax Rates and Levy of Special Tax.
 - A. At the beginning of each Fiscal Year, the Superintendent shall classify each Assessor's Parcel in CFD No. 2 as Tax-Exempt Property or as either Multifamily or Single Family Residential Property by reference to the standard practices of the city or county issuing building permits (or similar authorizations) for such Parcel.
 - B. At the time taxes are levied each Fiscal Year, the Board shall determine the Escalation Factor and calculate the Mitigation Rate applicable for such Fiscal Year.
 - C. At the beginning of each Fiscal Year, the Board shall levy the Special Tax as follows:
 - (1) For Tax-Exempt Property, no tax shall be levied.
 - (2) For each parcel for which a building permit issues during such Fiscal Year, the Board shall levy the Special Tax in an amount equal to the product of the Mitigation Rate and the Assessable Space of such Parcel.

If, after the annual levy and before a building permit is issued, a Parcel ceases to be or becomes Tax-Exempt Property or changes its classification from Single Family Residential Property to Multifamily Residential Property or from Multifamily Residential Property to Single Family Residential Property, then the Board shall revise the Special Tax to be levied against such Parcel.

4. Payment of the Special Tax.

- A. The Special Tax is due upon the issuance of a building permit, or similar authorization for mobilehomes, for any Residential Property. Payment shall be made to the Superintendent by cashier's check or certified check payable to the CFD, and the Superintendent shall issue a receipt for payment showing the date and amount. If the Special Tax is not paid in Full, or if the owner elects (in accordance with the requirements of subsection B below) to pay all or part of the amount due in annual installments, the amount of the Special Tax that remains unpaid (the "Carryover Amount") shall be payable in annual installments (with interest) over a thirty-year period, calculated as described in subsection C below.
- B. A Parcel owner may elect to pay the Special Tax in annual installments. Such election shall be made at the time a building permit or similar authorization for the Parcel is issued, shall be in writing on a form provided by the Superintendent, and shall be accompanied by payment of any part of the Special Tax that such owner elects to pay immediately.
- C. If all or part of the Special Tax will be paid in annual installments, the amount payable in each year after the Special Tax has become due shall be the product of the Carryover Amount and the installment factor listed in the table below for such year:

- D. At the beginning of each Fiscal Year, beginning in 1992-93, the Superintendent shall prepare a Tax Collection Schedule that includes the amount of annual installments of Special Taxes to be collected in such Fiscal Year. The Superintendent shall present the Tax Collection Schedule to the Board for its approval. The Superintendent shall deliver the Tax Collection Schedule, as approved by the Board, to the Sacramento County Auditor and request the Auditor to place the annual installments on the secured property tax rolls for the current Fiscal Year. The Superintendent shall deliver the Tax Collection Schedule to the Auditor not later than the date required by the Auditor for such inclusion.

5. Collection of Installments of the Special Tax

Installments of the Special Tax that are to be collected annually shall be collected upon the applicable Assessor's Parcels in the CFD in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem property taxes are collected and in accordance herewith; provided, however, that the CFD may collect installments at a different time or in a different manner if necessary to meet its financial obligations. All annual installments of Special Taxes shall be subject to the same penalties and lien priorities in the case of delinquency as is provided for ad valorem taxes. The Board shall cause the actions required above to be done for each Fiscal Year in a timely manner to assure that the Tax Collection Schedule is received by the Auditor of the County of Sacramento for inclusion with billings for ad valorem taxes for the applicable Fiscal Year.

6. Termination of the Special Tax.

The owner of a Parcel for which the Special Tax was not paid in full when due may, at any time thereafter, pay and permanently satisfy the Special Tax levied against such Parcel by paying to the Superintendent, by cashier's check or certified check payable to the CFD, an amount equal to the product of the Carryover Amount and the prepayment factor for the Fiscal Year in which such payment is made as shown in the table under paragraph 4(C) above.

In the event the Special Tax has been paid and permanently satisfied with respect to a Parcel, the Board shall record a Notice of Cancellation of Special Tax Lien as to that Parcel pursuant to Section 53344 of the Government Code. The Notice of Cancellation of Special Tax Lien shall identify with particularity the Special Tax that has been paid and permanently satisfied, shall contain the book and page number in the records of the county recorder where the Notice of Special Tax Lien being canceled is recorded, shall contain the legal description and assessor's parcel number of the particular Parcel of land subject to the lien, and shall contain the name of the owner of record of the Parcel. The Board may specify a charge payable by the owner of record for the preparation and recordation of this notice.

7. Appeals and Interpretation Procedure.

Any taxpayer subject to the Special Tax claiming that the amount or application of the Special Tax or an annual installment thereof has not been properly computed may file a notice with the Superintendent appealing the levy or collection of the Special Tax or annual installment. The Superintendent will promptly review the appeal and, if necessary, meet with the applicant and decide the appeal. If the findings of the Superintendent verify that the tax should be modified or changed, the Tax Collection Schedule shall be corrected if necessary and, if applicable, a refund shall be granted in accordance with Section 8 hereof. Any dispute over the decision of the Superintendent shall be referred to the Board, and the decision of the Board with respect to the Special Tax or annual installment shall be final.

Interpretation may be made by resolution of the Board for purposes of clarifying any vagueness or uncertainty as it relates to the application of the Special Tax rate, the calculation of the amount of any annual installment or prepayment amount, the application of the method of apportionment, the classification of Parcels, or any definition applicable to the CFD.

8. Claim for Refund.

All claims for refund of Special Tax (or annual installment thereof) collected on behalf of the CFD shall be filed with the Superintendent not later than one year after the date the Special Tax (or annual installment) has been paid to the County or to the Superintendent on behalf of the CFD in cases where the tax is not collected by the County. The claimant shall file the claim within this time period, and the claim shall be finally acted upon by the Board as a prerequisite to the claimant's bringing suit thereon. Pursuant to Government Code section 935(b), the claim shall be subject to the provisions of Government Code sections 945.6 and 946.

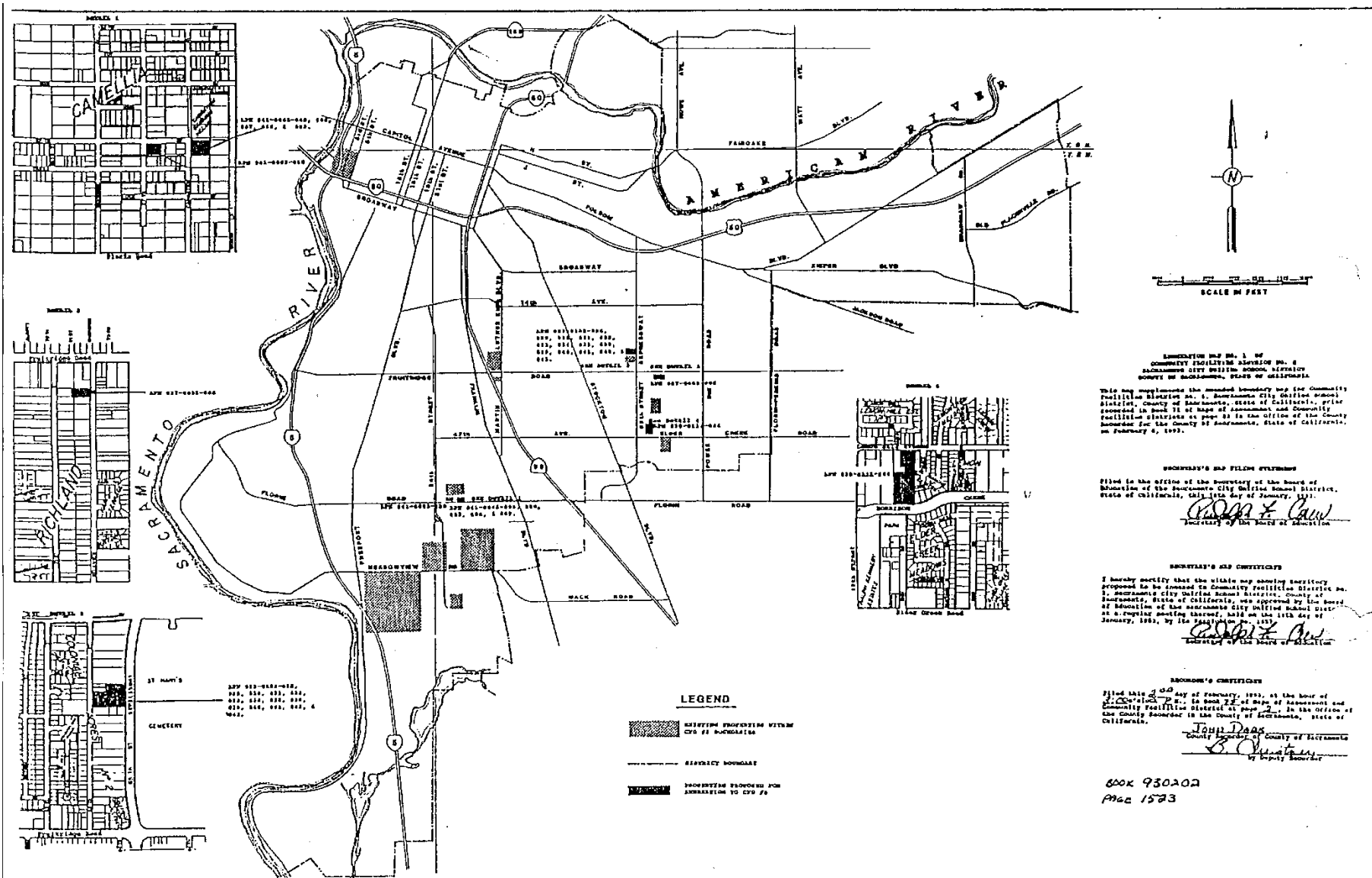
The Board acting on its own behalf and on behalf of the CFD shall respond to a timely claim within the time period required and in the manner specified by Government Code sections 912.4 and 912.6. Should said sections be amended or repealed, they shall apply according to their terms in effect on July 1, 1991.

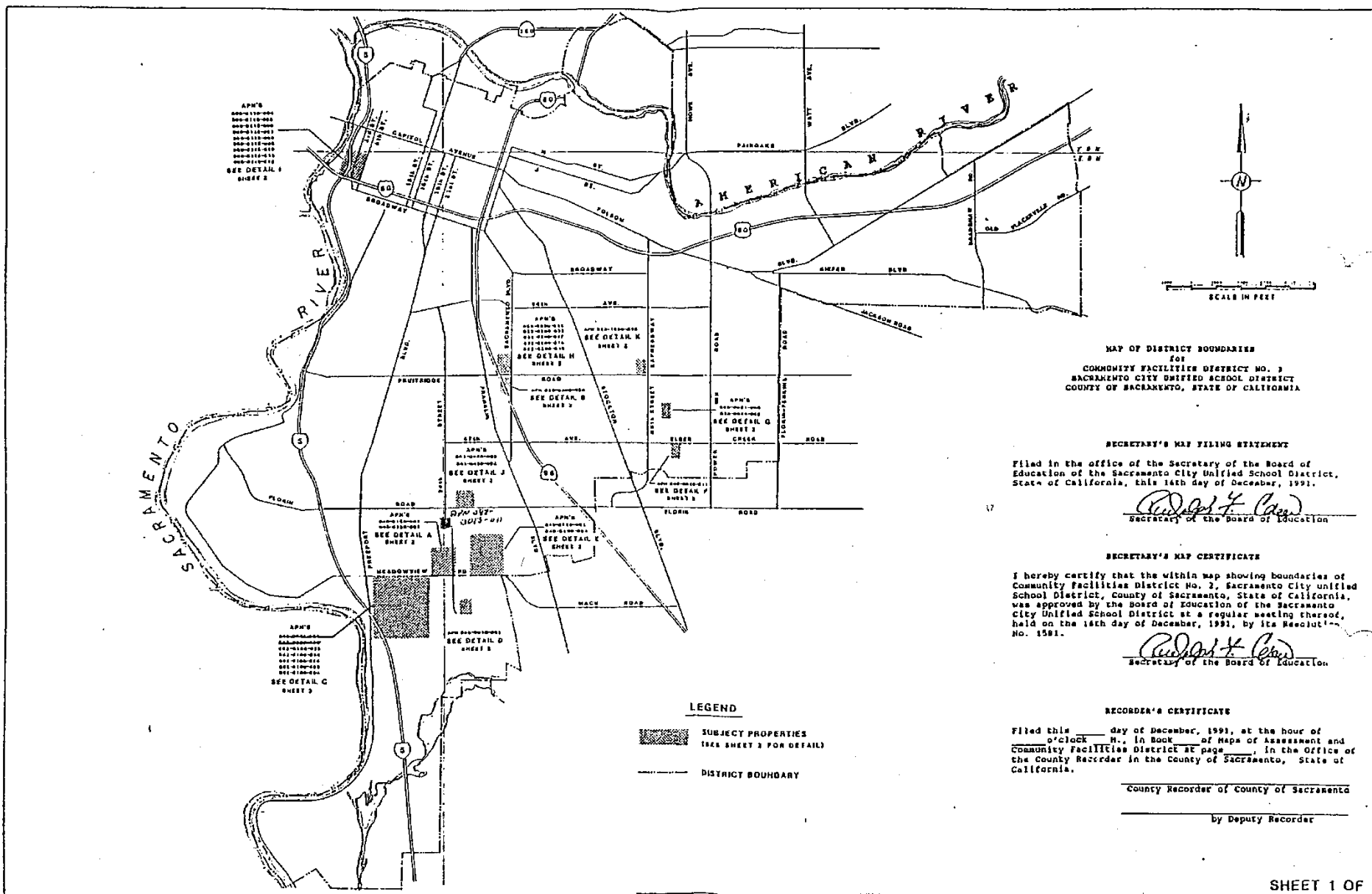
The procedure described herein shall be the exclusive procedure for claimants' seeking a refund of Special Tax (or annual installments thereof). The decision of the District in response to any claim for refund shall be final.

9. Annexation of Territory.

Any territory to be annexed to the CFD shall, in addition to payment of Special Taxes at the rates set forth above, be subject to payment of any costs incurred by the CFD and District in conducting the annexation process and such additional tax within the territory to be annexed as may be necessary to compensate for the interest and principal previously paid by the existing community facilities district; provided that in no event shall the additional tax authorized herein be allowed to exceed the Special Tax applicable to the Parcels being annexed.

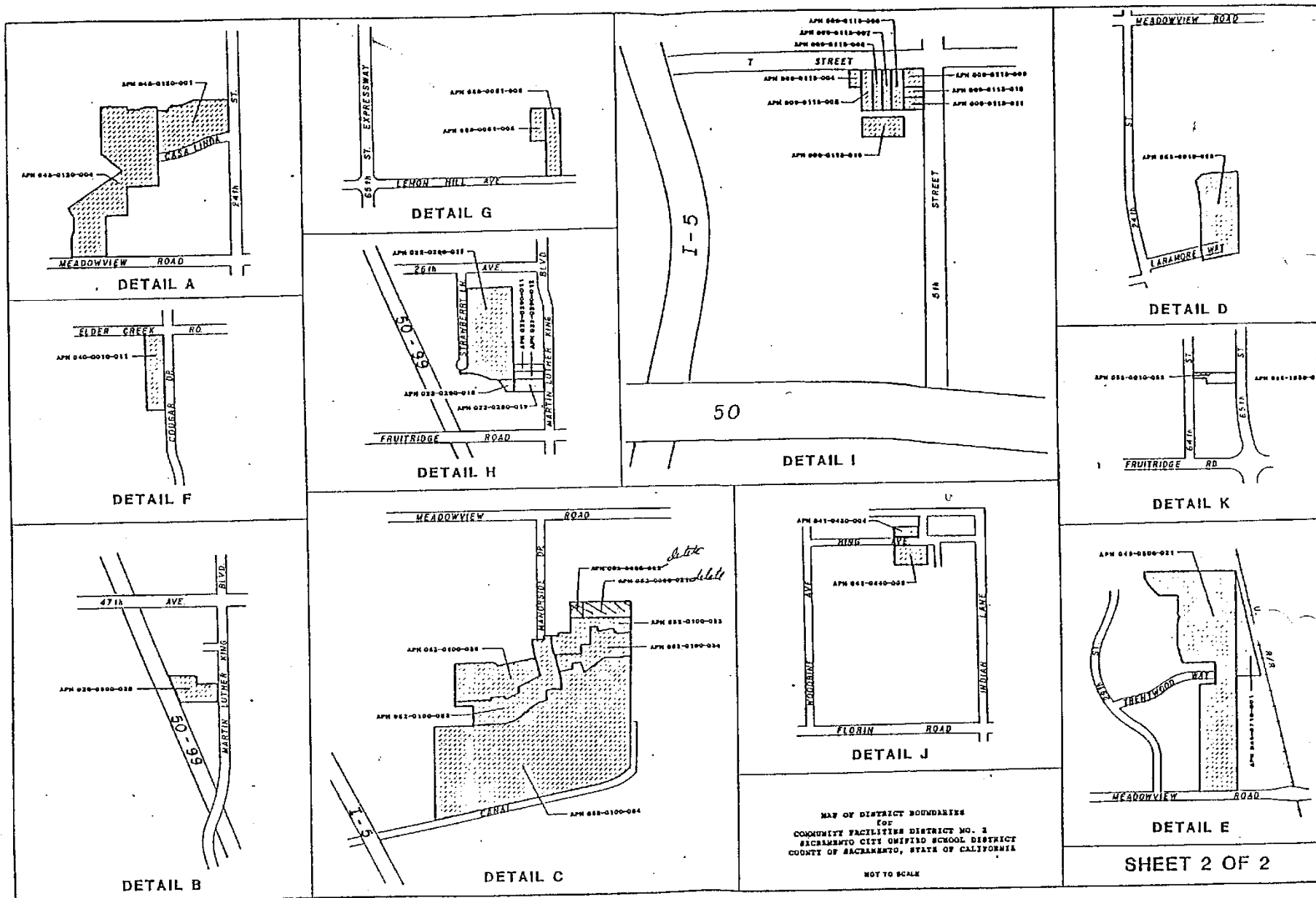

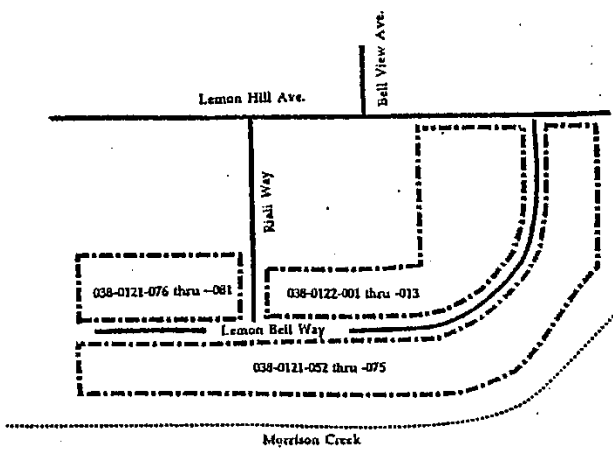

Recommendation: Approve Facility Use Agreement between Sacramento City Unified School District and Success Skills, Inc.: NorCal Trade and Tech.

Background/Rationale: The District approved the initial charter petition for NorCal Trade and Tech on January 18, 2018 for a term of five years effective July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2023. NorCal Trade and Tech intends to operate in numerous locations with private leases and one district-owned property for the charter school's operations and educational programs. The mutually negotiated Facility Use Agreement is not within the auspices and requirements of Proposition 39, where districts are obligated to provide facilities to charter schools. Per the Board's direction, the District may provide the facility located at 2401 Florin Road to the charter school only with no costs to the District. NorCal Trade and Tech will pay the District "Facility Use Fees" based on a pro rata share facilities cost for the use of District facilities as described within the agreement.

FACILITIES USE AGREEMENT

This Facilities Use Agreement (“Agreement”) is made by and between Sacramento City Unified School District (“District”) and Success Skills, Inc., a California non-profit public benefit corporation (“Non-Profit”), which operates NorCal Trade and Tech, a charter school (“Charter School”). The Non-Profit and District are collectively referred to as the “Parties.”

RECITALS

- A. WHEREAS, the District and its charter schools are partners in the public education of students and it is the District’s intent to ensure that its facilities are shared equally with all of its students, including those students who attend its charter schools housed in District facilities.
- B. WHEREAS, District is the owner of certain real property located at 2401 Florin Road, Sacramento, California, 95822 (“Site”).
- C. WHEREAS, the Charter School is a charter school duly formed and approved by the District under the laws of the Charter Schools Act of 1992 (Education Code §§ 47600, *et seq.*) serving adults and high school age students in the 2018-2019 to 2022-2023 school years.
- D. WHEREAS, the Charter School desires to use certain District facilities (“Facilities”) located on the Site for its public charter school program.

AGREEMENT

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and conditions of this Agreement, the Parties hereby agree as follows. All obligations imposed hereby on the Charter School are equally imposed on the Non-Profit.

- 1. Recitals. The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made part of this Agreement.
- 2. Facilities. Use of the Facilities shall be for the purposes set forth in the Charter School’s charter, and on the terms and conditions set forth herein. The District grants use of the following Facilities located on the Site, as described and/or depicted in Exhibits A and B, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, to the Charter School under the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement. The District reserves the right to use facilities, or assign facilities, at the Site that have not been designated or assigned to the Charter School.
- 3. AS IS Condition. Except as set forth in this Agreement, District makes no representations of any kind as to the conditions of, on or under the Facilities or Site. Charter School has inspected the Facilities and Site and takes the Facilities and Site in

their “as is” condition. District has no responsibility to make any modifications to the Facilities or Site that may be required to prepare the Facilities or Site for Charter School to carry its public charter school program. Furthermore, District makes no representations or warranties regarding the fitness or suitability of the Facilities or Site for Charter School’s intended use of same.

4. Term. The term of this Agreement shall be from September 1, 2018 to June 30, 2023 (“Term”), unless earlier terminated as provided herein.
5. Facilities Use Fee. Each and every school year during the Term, Non-Profit shall pay District a Facilities Use Fee. Facilities Use Fees shall be paid out in equal installments each month throughout the respective school year within the Term. Beginning on September 1, 2018, payments shall be payable on or in advance on the first day of each month (“Due Date”) in lawful money of the United States.

The calculation for the 2018-2019 school year Facilities Use Fee and the terms of Facilities Use Fee payments are described with more particularity in Exhibit C, attached hereto and incorporated herein. These Facilities Use Fees will be calculated and adjusted annually by the District. The Facility Use Fee shall be based on a pro rata cost estimate per square foot for the Facilities provided. To calculate the fee, the District must determine actual facilities costs and total space figures in the year preceding the fiscal year in which the Facilities are provided. Such amounts may only become available to the District after each fiscal year ends. Therefore, within ninety (90) days of the beginning of each fiscal year, or as soon as the actual facilities costs and total space figures for the prior fiscal year become available, whichever is later, the District shall provide notice to the Non-Profit of any amended Facilities Use Fee calculations based on the actual data for the prior fiscal year. Amounts owed to or by the Non-Profit due to this calculation will be credited or added to subsequent remaining monthly installment payments of the Facilities Use Fees.

If any payment is made more than fifteen (15) days after the Due Date, a late fee of one percent (1%) shall apply and interest shall accrue thereafter on such late payment commencing thirty (30) days after the Due Date, provided however that no interest shall accrue on said late fee. The interest charged shall be computed at the then-current discount rate established by the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco plus five percent (5%), or the maximum rate permitted by law. The payment by the Non-Profit of any late fees or interest shall in no event excuse or cure any default by the Non-Profit nor waive District’s legal rights and remedies with respect to such default.

Actual costs for out-of-District students shall be paid at the Facilities Use Fee rate or up to market rate, whichever is greater. The Parties agree to and shall meet at least annually, on or about November of each year, and no later than December, and more often if requested by a Party, to determine the number of enrolled out-of-District students. The Facilities Use Fee to be paid for out-of-District students, including, pursuant to Exhibit C, the “Out of District Charge,” may be adjusted by the District on an annual basis. The Non-Profit and the Charter School shall provide all necessary current, accurate and thorough enrollment information for all out-of-District students upon request by District,

to enable District to determine then current out-of-District student enrollment. Failure to comply with these obligations will constitute a material breach of this Agreement. The District is required to provide written notification to Charter School of fee changes for out-of-District students no later than June 30 for implementation following the next school year. When recalculated annually, and upon receiving written notification, Charter School may terminate the Facility Use Agreement, if the Out-of-District Charge increases by 10% or more of the prior school year's Out of District Charge rate, with written notification to the District no later than 90 working days after receipt of the District notification. If this Agreement is terminated, the Charter School shall completely vacate the facility no later than June 30 of the school year in which the Agreement is terminated.

6. Over-Allocation. The District reserves the right to collect over-allocation and other applicable fees and reimbursements from the Charter School, pursuant to Title 5, California Code of Regulations, section 11969.8. The Charter School's projected in-District Average Daily Attendance ("ADA") for the 2018-2019 school year, and upon which the Facilities are provided, is 180.

7. Dispute Resolution. The Parties agree to attempt to resolve all disputes regarding this Agreement, including the alleged violation, misinterpretation, or misapplication of the Agreement, pursuant to the dispute resolution procedures identified in the Charter School's charter. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if any such dispute concerns facts or circumstances that may be cause for revocation of the Charter School's charter, the District shall not be obligated by the terms of any dispute resolution procedures as a precondition to revocation.

8. Use.

(a) Public Charter School. The Facilities shall be used and occupied by the Charter School for the sole purpose of operating a California public charter school and for no other purpose without the prior written consent of the District. The Charter School's enrollment must not exceed the safe and legal limit for the classroom space it occupies.

(b) Insurance Risk. The District shall maintain first party property insurance for the Facilities. The Charter School shall not do or permit anything to be done in or about the Facilities nor bring or keep anything therein which will in any way increase the existing insurance rate or affect any fire or other insurance upon the Facilities, or any of the contents of the Facilities (unless the District gives its prior approval and the Non-Profit pays any increased premium as a result of such use or acts), or cause a cancellation of any insurance policy covering the Facilities or any part thereof or any of its contents, nor shall the Charter School sell or permit to be kept, used, or sold in or about the Facilities any articles which may be prohibited by a standard form policy of fire insurance. The Charter School shall provide adequate and appropriate supervision for Charter School students and employees using the Facilities.

(c) Rights of the District. The Charter School shall not do or permit anything to be done in or about the Facilities that will in any way obstruct or interfere with the rights of the District or injure the District. The Charter School shall not use or allow the Facilities to

be used for any unlawful purpose, nor shall the Charter School cause, maintain or permit any nuisance in or about the Facilities. The Charter School shall not commit or suffer to be committed any waste in or upon the Facilities.

(d) Illegal Uses. The Charter School shall not use the Facilities or permit anything to be done in or about the Facilities that will in any way conflict with any applicable law, statute, ordinance or governmental rule, or regulation. The Charter School agrees to comply with its charter as it relates to District Facilities.

(e) Security Badges. The Charter School will provide identification cards to its staff. The identification cards will be pictured with school name, logo, staff names, and titles. All Charter School staff shall carry and have visible their identification card at all times while at the Site. This will assist District security and other staff to identify Charter School staff as needed. In the event a co-location with a District program occurs, both the Charter Schools' staff and District staff shall carry their respective identification cards at all times that they are at the Site.

(f) Civic Center Act. The Charter School agrees to comply with the provisions of the Civic Center Act (Education Code section 38131, *et seq.*) in making use of the Facilities accessible to members of the community. The Parties understand that the Facilities are to be primarily used for school programs and activities and as such any use of the Facilities by members of the community shall not interfere with school activities. District Board Policy and Administrative Regulations related to the Civic Center Act shall control scheduling, use and collection of fees related to use of the Facilities by members of the public. Consistent with such Board Policy and Administrative Regulations, the District shall be solely responsible for coordinating access to the Facilities under the Civic Center Act and shall require users to provide appropriate proof of insurance related to use of the Facilities and to indemnify and hold harmless the District and Charter School for injury, risk of loss, or damage to property as a result of that access by members of the community. The District agrees to promptly clean and repair, if necessary, any portion of the Facilities used by members of the community immediately following such use. All requests for use of the Facilities made directly to the Charter School shall be forwarded to the District for coordination of use consistent with Board Policy and Administrative Regulations.

(g) Alarms. The Charter School shall have access to activate burglar alarms and intruder alerts corresponding to the Facilities provided at the Site. The Charter School agrees that in the event that any of Charter School's employees, directors, trustees, officers, agents, students, visitors, or contractors, trigger a false alarm at the Site, Charter School shall be responsible for costs incurred. The Charter School agrees to fully pay for the cost of all alarms and services for facilities and related areas that it occupies on district owned property.

9. Furnishings and Equipment. The furnishings and equipment provided, if any, by the District for the Facilities are those furnishings and equipment that exist at the Facilities as of July 1, 2018. The Charter School is responsible for any furnishings and equipment over and above those provided, if any, by the District. The Charter School shall return all

such furniture, fixtures and equipment to the District in like condition at the termination of this Agreement, excepting ordinary wear and tear. Upon return of the furniture, fixtures, and equipment, the District will inspect said items within sixty (60) calendar days. The Charter School shall be responsible for costs to repair or replace furniture, fixtures, and equipment to like condition, excepting ordinary wear and tear. All furniture, fixtures, and equipment that are not the property of the District or are not otherwise reimbursed by the District shall remain the property and under the ownership of the Charter School and shall be disposed of according to the provisions of the approved Charter School charter - petition.

10. Utilities. District agrees to furnish or cause to be furnished to the Facilities necessary utilities. Utilities include, but are not limited to, electrical, natural gas, sewer, waste disposal/recycling and water services. Due to cost containment efforts by the District, the number of bins associated with the Site(s), the bin capacities and the number of removals per week shall not increase during the Term of this Agreement. The District's failure to furnish or cause to be furnished necessary utilities when such failure is caused by (i) Acts of God or other acts beyond the control or fault of the District; (ii) strikes, lockouts, or other labor disturbances or labor disputes of any kind; (iii) any laws, rules, orders, ordinances, directions, regulations, requirements, or any other action by federal, state, county or municipal authority; (iv) inability despite the exercise of reasonable diligence by the District to obtain electricity, water, or natural gas; or (v) any other unavoidable delay, shall not cause the District to be in default, shall not constitute a breach of this Agreement, and shall not result in any liability of the District.

The Charter School shall reimburse the District for the cost of utilities at the Site, as charged to the District by its utility providers, pro-rated per square foot, to reflect use by other users of the Site. Thirty (30) days prior to the commencement of the 2018-2019 school year, and every subsequent school year during the Term of this Agreement, the District shall endeavor to notify the Charter School of its estimated monthly charge for utilities. The Charter School shall pay such charge to the District throughout the Term on a monthly basis concurrent with the Charter School's payment of the Facilities Use Fee to the District pursuant to Section 4 of this Agreement. Within one hundred twenty (120) days after the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement, the District shall provide the Charter School with a reconciliation of the Charter School's actual utility usage throughout the Term and the cost thereof. The District shall either refund the Charter School for any overpayment or shall invoice the Charter School for any underpayment. The Charter School shall reimburse the District for such underpayment, if any, within thirty (30) days after receipt of said invoice.

The Charter School shall comply with all District energy conservation policies in regard to use of the Facilities, as amended from time to time, including, but not limited to, Board Policy 3511 and the District's Energy Education program.

11. Custodial Services.

Custodial service will be provided by the Charter School. Custodial Services without District staff is pursuant to the terms and conditions as defined in Exhibit D-2.

12. Signage.

(a) The Charter School shall be allowed to place signage on the exterior of the Facilities. The District will keep its own signage exhibited at the Site, identifying the school as operated or formerly operated by the District. The District shall have final approval over the design, content and location of the Charter School's signage, but shall not unreasonably deny such design, content or location. The Charter School must remove the signage upon termination of this Agreement. The Charter School must restore the Facilities, following removal of the signage, to the condition existing prior to installation of the signage to District's reasonable satisfaction.

(b) The District will ensure that all signage at the Facilities that are required by law or regulation will be posted. The District will install and such signage at the Charter School's sole cost, pursuant to those costs traditionally captured in a work order for the Site.

(c) All signage, including signage contemplated in (a) and (b), above, shall be subject to compliance with all applicable laws at Charter School's sole cost.

13. Operations, Maintenance and Repairs.

(a) The Charter School shall maintain the Facilities in good order, condition, and repair at its sole expense.

(b) The Charter School shall comply with the District's policies regarding the operations and maintenance of the school facility and furnishings and equipment, except to the extent renovation is approved by the District. However, the Charter School need not comply with policies in cases where actual District practice substantially differs from official policies.

(c) Any upgrades or improvements to any wiring/MIS infrastructure shall be the responsibility of the Charter School, in compliance with Section 14 ("Alterations and Additions"). The Charter School is responsible for the cost of internet service provided at the commercial rate.

(d) Upon the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement, Charter School shall surrender the Facilities and furnishings and equipment in the same condition as received, ordinary wear and tear excepted.

14. Alterations and Additions. The Charter School shall only make alterations, additions, or improvements ("Improvements") to the Facilities after obtaining the prior written consent of the District's Superintendent or his designee. Any Improvements to the Facilities made by the Charter School shall be paid for by the Charter School, and shall be contracted for and performed in accordance with federal, state and local law, and all applicable building code standards, including without limitation Title 24 of the California Code of

Regulations, the Field Act, the Americans with Disabilities Act, the Fair Employment and Housing Act and all applicable District policies relating to facilities construction (the "Construction Standards"). The District Superintendent or his designee will identify persons with whom the Charter School can communicate to seek information regarding District policies and to obtain consent for Improvements.

The District may impose as a condition to the aforesaid consent such requirements as the District may deem necessary in its sole discretion, including without limitation, the manner in which the work is done, a right of approval of the contractor by whom the work is to be performed, and the times during which it is to be accomplished.

Should the Charter School fail to obtain the prior written consent of the District's Superintendent, or the Superintendent's designee, for Improvements, the Charter School shall, upon written request by the District, immediately cease making Improvements until such written consent is obtained, and the Charter School shall bear any costs, expenses and liabilities associated with the work stoppage.

Should the Charter School fail to contract and perform the Improvements in accordance with the Construction Standards or fail to adhere to the conditions on the District's consent as described above, the District may, at its sole option, direct that the Charter School immediately cease making such Improvements, and the District may alter, repair, or improve the Facilities pursuant to paragraph 15 herein, to bring the Facilities into compliance with the Construction Standards and/or the conditions on the District's consent, and the Charter School shall be responsible for all such costs and expenses incurred by the District for such alterations, repairs or improvements. No Improvement shall be made which reduces or otherwise impairs the value of the Facilities. No Improvements shall be commenced until Charter School has first obtained and paid for all required permits and authorizations of all governmental authorities having jurisdiction with respect to such Improvements. All Improvements shall be made in a good workmanlike manner and in compliance with all laws, ordinances, regulations, codes and permits.

Upon written reasonable request of the District prior to the expiration or earlier termination of the Agreement, the Charter School will remove any and all Improvements to the Facilities, at its own cost, that can be done without damage to the Facilities. In the event of charter revocation or closure of the Charter School, all property shall be disposed of in accordance with the provision of the approved Charter School charter. Unless the Parties agree otherwise in writing on an item by item basis, Charter School shall maintain its ownership rights in any Improvements and may be allowed to remove such Improvements at termination of this Agreement and restore the Facilities to their original condition which existed prior to construction or installation of the Improvements. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any Improvements to the Facilities that the Charter School does not remove prior to vacating the Facilities, shall vest in the District at District's sole discretion and election. Otherwise, removal of such Improvements shall be at Charter's expense.

15. Entry by District. The District may enter the Facilities at any time to inspect the Facilities,

to supply any service to be provided by the District to the Charter School hereunder and to alter, improve or repair the Facilities, or in the case of an emergency.

The District may erect scaffolding and other necessary structures where reasonably required by the character of the work to be performed so long as the Charter School operations do not suffer unreasonable interference. The District agrees to use its best efforts at all times to keep any interference to the academic programs at the Charter School to a minimum. The Charter School waives any claim for damages for any inconvenience to or interference with the Charter School's business, any loss or use of quiet enjoyment of the Facilities related to District's entry for the purposes identified in this Section.

16. Employees, Contractors and Independent Contractors. The Charter School and the District, their employees, agents, contractors and subcontractors shall comply with the requirements of Education Code sections 45125.1 and 45125.2 related to access to the Facilities and protection of minor students.
17. Indemnity. The Non-Profit shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the District, its Board of Trustees, the members of its Board of Trustees, officers, employees and agents against and from any and all claims, demands, actions, suits, losses, liabilities, expenses and costs for any injury, death or damage to any person or property arising from the Charter School's use of the Facilities, excepting those claims, demands, actions, suits, losses, liabilities, expenses and costs arising from the negligent or intentional acts of the District, its employees, agents, officers and invitees.

The Non-Profit shall further indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the District, its Board of Trustees, the members of its Board of Trustees, officers, employees and agents against and from any and all claims arising from any breach or default in the performance of any obligation on the Charter School's part to be performed under the terms of this Agreement, and from all costs, attorneys' fees, and liabilities incurred in or about the defense of any such claim or any action or proceeding brought thereon, excepting those claims, demands, actions, suits, losses, liabilities, expenses and costs arising from the negligent or intentional acts of the District, its employees, agents, officers and invitees.

The District shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the Non-Profit, its trustees, officers, and agents against and from any and all claims, demands, actions, suits, losses, liabilities, expenses and costs for any injury, death or damage to any person or property arising from the District's conduct of business at the Facilities, excepting those claims, demands, actions, suits, losses, liabilities, expenses and costs arising from the negligent or intentional acts of the Charter School, its employees, agents, officers and invitees.

The District shall further indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the Non-Profit against and from any and all claims arising from any breach or default in the performance of any obligation on the District's part to be performed under the terms of this Agreement, and from all costs, attorneys' fees, and liabilities incurred in or about the defense of any such claim or any action or proceeding brought thereon, excepting those claims, demands, actions, suits, losses, liabilities, expenses and costs arising from the negligent or intentional acts of the District, its employees, agents, officers and invitees.

Upon becoming aware of any casualty or accident in or on the Facilities, each Party to this Agreement shall give prompt written notice thereof to the other Party.

In the event of a third party claim or potential claim covered by these provisions, the Parties agree to take all steps reasonable or necessary to cooperate in defending and protecting their joint interests, and in expediting all reasonable or necessary efforts to gain coverage for the Parties under any liability policy or indemnity agreement issued in favor of the Non-Profit, including indemnity rights or agreements existing in contracts between the Non-Profit and any third party (such as contract with a supplier of goods or services), and further including efforts to reduce defense costs (through joint representation whenever possible), expenses and potential liability exposures.

18. Insurance. The Charter School, at the Charter School's sole cost and expense, shall obtain and keep in full force and effect, beginning on or before July 1, 2018, and continuing throughout the Term, the following insurance:

- Liability Insurance. Commercial general liability insurance with respect to the Site and the operations of or on behalf of the Charter School in, on or about the Site, including but not limited to: bodily injury, product liability (if applicable), blanket contractual, broad form property damage liability coverage in an amount not less than Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) in the aggregate, and excess liability coverage on a basis consistent with coverage for schools or a type similar to the Charter School as required by District as a public school district. In addition, the Charter School shall procure, pay for and keep in full force and effect primary automobile liability insurance in an amount not less than Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) per occurrence covering owned, hired and non-owned vehicles used by the Charter School. Such commercial general and automobile policies shall contain (i) severability of interest, (ii) cross liability, and (iii) an endorsement stating "Such insurance as is afforded by this policy for the benefit of Sacramento City Unified School District shall be primary with respect to any liability of claims arising out of the occupancy of the Site by the Charter School, or out of the Charter School's operations, and any insurance carried by Sacramento City Unified School District shall be excess and non-contributory."
- Workers' Compensation, Employer Liability. Workers' Compensation insurance as required by law and Employer's Liability insurance in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000).

If there is any other written agreement or agreements between the District and the Charter School that obligates the Charter School to have different policy limits, then the Charter School shall hold the highest of the policy limits required by the agreements.

Property Insurance: District shall maintain property insurance against fire, vandalism, malicious mischief and such other additional perils as now are or hereafter may be included in a standard "All Risks" coverage, including coverage for earthquake and sprinkler

leakage.

Insurance Policy Criteria: All policies of insurance required to be carried by the Charter School shall be written by responsible insurance companies authorized to do business in the State of California, rated no less than the standard that the District requires for the schools within its boundaries (A.M. Best, A-, VII, or better), or the equivalent provided through a risk-pooling joint powers authority operating pursuant to Government Code section 6500, et seq. Any insurance required of the Charter School hereunder may be furnished by the Charter School pursuant to a blanket policy carried by it or under a separate policy.

A true and exact copy of each paid-up policy evidencing insurance or a certificate of the insurer, certifying that a policy has been issued, providing the coverage required and containing the provisions specified herein, shall be delivered to District prior to July 1, 2018, and upon renewals, not less than thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of such coverage. Any policy provided by the Charter School under this Agreement shall be occurrence based, not "claims made." In addition, District shall be named as an additional insured on the liability policies. District may, at any time and from time to time, upon reasonable notice to the Charter School and at no cost to the Charter School, inspect and/or copy any and all insurance policies required hereunder.

In no event shall the policies required hereunder be considered as limiting the liability of the Charter School under this Agreement.

19. Damage to or Destruction of School Site.

(a) Cost. The cost of restoring the Facilities under this Section shall be borne by the Non-Profit if the cause of the casualty is the negligence or intentional act of the Charter School, its employees, agents, students or invitees. The cost of restoring the Facilities under this Section shall be borne by the District if the cause of the casualty is the negligence or intentional act of the District, its employees, agents, or invitees. The Parties shall tender the cost of restoring the Facilities to their respective insurance carriers if the casualty is caused by a third party.

(b) Partial Damage – Insured. If the Facilities are damaged by any casualty which is covered under fire and extended coverage insurance carried by District, then District may restore such damage provided insurance proceeds are available to pay eighty percent (80%) or more of the cost of restoration and provided such restoration can be completed within ninety (90) days after the commencement of the work in the opinion of a registered architect or engineer appointed by District. In such event, this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect, except that the Non-Profit shall be entitled to a proportionate reduction of Facilities Use Fee payments while such restoration takes place, such proportionate reduction to be based upon the extent to which the restoration efforts interfere with Charter School's business in the Facilities.

(c) Total Destruction. If the Facilities are totally destroyed (defined as the destruction of more than fifty percent (50%) of the usable classroom space) or the Facilities cannot be restored as required herein under applicable laws and regulations, notwithstanding the

availability of insurance proceeds, then this Agreement shall be terminated effective the date of the destruction.

20. Liens. The Non-Profit shall keep the Facilities free from any liens arising out of any work performed, materials furnished or obligations incurred by or on behalf of the Non-Profit or the Charter School. Notwithstanding anything stated herein to the contrary, if the Non-Profit and/or Charter School fails to promptly release and remove any such lien, District, at its sole option, may immediately (but shall not be obligated to) take all action necessary to release and remove such lien, without any duty to investigate the validity thereof, and all sums, costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, incurred by District in connection with such lien shall be immediately due and payable by the Non-Profit and Charter School, each having joint and several liability for the lien amount and all expenses incurred by District in pursuit of satisfaction and removal of the lien, including attorneys' fees and costs.
21. Holding Over. Charter School shall not remain in possession of the Facilities or any part thereof after the expiration of this Agreement or after termination thereof without the express written consent of District. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the Charter School holds over, the Non-Profit and Charter School shall pay the monthly Facilities Use Fee plus all other charges payable required by this Agreement. Any holdover by Charter School requires the Non-Profit and the Charter School to comply with all terms of this Agreement. A holdover by the Charter School shall not trigger any additional term. The District shall have the right to remove the Charter School at any time after the expiration of the Term or termination of this Agreement.
22. Assignment and Subletting. The Non-Profit and Charter School may not assign its or their rights under this Agreement or sublet any portion of the Facilities without the prior written consent of the District.
23. Rules, Regulations and Law. The Charter School and the Charter School's agents, employees, students, visitors and invitees shall observe and comply fully and faithfully with all reasonable and nondiscriminatory policies, rules, and regulations adopted by the District for the care, protection, cleanliness, and operation of the Facilities, and the Facilities' furnishings and equipment, and shall comply with all applicable laws. The District will provide the Non-Profit with copies of the relevant written custodial and maintenance policies. The District will provide any such written policies that are amended during the term of the Agreement.
24. Smoking. Smoking or the consumption of alcohol in any form shall not be allowed in or on District property and Facilities, including but not limited to all courtyards, walkways, and parking areas.
25. Default by Non-Profit. The occurrence of any one or more of the following events shall constitute a default and material breach of this Agreement by the Non-Profit:

- (a) The failure of the Non-Profit to utilize the Facilities for the sole purpose of operating the Charter School.
- (b) The failure of the Non-Profit to make timely payments required under this Agreement.
- (c) The failure of the Non-Profit or the Charter School to observe or perform any of the express covenants, conditions or provisions of this Agreement.
- (d) The revocation or non-renewal of the Charter School's charter, or, voluntary closure of the Charter School. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement shall not be terminated pursuant to this provision provided that the Charter School continues to operate in accordance with the terms of this Agreement and is diligently pursuing a statutory appeal of the revocation or nonrenewal of its charter.

In the event of any material default or breach by Non-Profit, District may, but shall not be obligated to, terminate this Agreement and Non-Profit's right to possession of the Facilities upon thirty (30) days written notice thereof to the Non-Profit if the default is not cured within the thirty (30) day period. If the nature of the default is such that the same cannot reasonably be cured within the thirty (30) day period, the Non-Profit shall not be in default if Non-Profit shall within such thirty (30) day period commence such cure and thereafter, diligently prosecute the same to completion. In no event shall such period to cure exceed sixty (60) days.

Upon termination, District shall retain the right to recover from Non-Profit, without limitation, any amounts due under this Agreement or applicable law. Unpaid Facilities Use Fees shall bear interest from the date due at the maximum legal rate.

26. Default by District.

District shall be in default of this Agreement if District fails to perform any material obligation required by this Agreement. In the event of any default by District, Charter School may perform the action that is the obligation of the District and invoice the District for the reasonable costs thereof. Prior to taking such action, the Non-Profit must provide thirty (30) days written notice thereof to the District if the District has failed to cure the default within thirty (30) days, unless the nature of the default is such that the same cannot reasonably be cured within said thirty (30) day period, in which event District shall not be in default (and Charter School may not terminate this Agreement) if District commences to cure such default within such thirty (30) day period and thereafter, diligently prosecutes the same to completion.

27. Miscellaneous.

- (a) Waiver. The waiver by either Party of any term, covenant or condition herein contained shall not be deemed to be a waiver of such term, covenant or condition or any subsequent breach of the same or any other term, covenant or condition herein contained. The subsequent acceptance of any charge hereunder by the District or payment of any

charge by the Non-Profit shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any preceding default by the Non-Profit or District of any term, covenant or condition of this Agreement, other than the failure of the Non-Profit to pay the particular charge so accepted, regardless of District's knowledge of such preceding default at the time of the acceptance of such charge.

(b) Headings. The marginal headings, captions, and article titles to the articles of this Agreement are not a part of the Agreement and shall have no effect upon the construction or interpretation of any part hereof.

(c) Successors and Assigns. The covenants and conditions herein contained, subject to the provisions as to assignment, apply and bind the heirs, successors, executors, administrators and assigns of the Parties hereto.

(d) Amendment. No provision of this Agreement may be amended or modified except by an agreement in writing signed by the Parties hereto.

(e) Construction. Each of the Parties acknowledges and agrees that this Agreement is to be construed as a whole according to its fair meaning and not in favor of nor against any of the Parties as draftsman or otherwise.

(f) Venue. Any action or proceeding by any Party to enforce the terms of this Agreement shall be brought solely in the Superior Court of the State of California for the County of Sacramento.

(g) Applicable Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted under the laws of the State of California applicable to instruments, persons, transactions and subject matter that have legal contacts and relationships exclusively within the State of California.

(h) Severability. If any provision or any part of this Agreement is for any reason held to be invalid, unenforceable or contrary to public policy, law, or statute and/or ordinance, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby and shall remain valid and fully enforceable.

(I) Prevailing Authority. In the event of a conflict between the law and the terms of this Agreement, the law shall prevail, and any such conflicting terms shall be severed from this Agreement and nullified. In the event of a conflict between the terms of the charter and the terms of this Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall prevail and shall be deemed an amendment to the charter, replacing any conflicting terms therein. In the event of a conflict between the terms of the charter and any other agreement between the Charter School and the District, the terms of this Agreement shall prevail and shall be deemed an amendment to any other such agreement, replacing any conflicting terms therein.

If any terms or provisions within this Agreement conflict or are not consistent with the terms within Exhibit E, herein, then the terms of Exhibit E shall prevail and shall be interpreted as the intention of the Parties over any conflicting or inconsistent terms.

(j) No Admission. Except as expressly agreed herein, nothing contained herein shall constitute an admission of fact or law.

(k) Binding Obligation. If and to the extent that the Non-Profit is a separate legal entity from the District, the Non-Profit expressly agrees that this Agreement is a binding obligation on the Non-Profit and the Charter School and the District agrees that this Agreement is a binding obligation on the District.

(l) Prior Agreements. This Agreement contains all of the agreements of the Parties hereto with respect to any matter covered or mentioned in this Agreement, and no prior agreements or understanding pertaining to any such matters shall be effective for any purpose.

(m) Subject to Approval by Governing Board. This Agreement shall become effective upon ratification by the District's Governing Board.

(n) Notices. All notices and demands that may be or are to be required or permitted to be given by either Party to the other hereunder shall be in writing. All notices and demands by the District to the Non-Profit or the Charter School shall be sent by United States Mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the Non-Profit or the Charter School at the address set forth below. All notices and demands by the Non-Profit and/or Charter School to the District shall be sent by United States Mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the District at the address set forth below.



Exhibit C – Facilities Use Fee

For the 2018- 2019 school year, Non-Profit shall pay District an initial estimated Facilities Use Fee of Fourteen Thousand Four Hundred Forty-Eight Dollars and Zero Cents (\$14,448.00) based on a pro rata Facilities cost estimate of \$2.15 per square foot for the use of approximately Six Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty (6,720) square feet of the Facilities during the Term of the Agreement. The Facilities Use Fee shall be paid out in equal installments of One Thousand Two Hundred Four Dollars and Zero Cents (\$1,204.00) each month throughout the fiscal year. The aforementioned is based on enrollment of 100% of the students from in-district. In the event fewer than 100% of Charter School students are residents of the District, the Facilities Use Fee will be adjusted, for 2018-2019 and every subsequent school year, as follows: multiply Six Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty (6,720) square feet by the percentage of students who are in-District, and multiply this number of square feet by \$2.15 (“In-District Charge”). In addition, multiply Six Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty (6,720) square feet by the percentage of student who are out of District, and multiply this number of square feet by an “Out of District Charge”. The Out of District Charge is based upon a calculation of market rates, as determined by the District. The Out of District Charge will be recalculated every school year. The Out of District Charge for the 2018-2019 school year is ten dollars (\$10.00) per square foot.

The Facilities Use Fee will be the In District Charge and Out of District Charge added together. Beginning on September 1, 2018, payments shall be payable on or in advance on the first day of each month (“Due Date”), without deduction, offset, prior notice or demand, in lawful money of the United States.

The District will re-calculate and adjust these fees annually for the remaining fiscal years for the Term of this Agreement.

In the event that there are adjustments made to the allocation of space, the Facilities Use Fee will be calculated according to the square feet allocated.

Exhibit D1 – Custodial Services: Utilizing District Staff

a. Routine Services. The District shall be responsible for providing the “routine” or regularly scheduled daily or weekly custodial services for the Facilities. The level of said services will be consistent with the District’s standard practices and policies. The District’s standard policies will be provided to the Non-Profit. Said services will be provided by District employees, and the Charter School has the right to report dissatisfaction with the custodial services so that the District will take any corrective action that may be appropriate. The Charter School shall have the right to direct the custodian to perform specific duties that are within the scope of the custodian’s job duties. The Charter School will reimburse the District for the actual costs, including but not limited to time and labor (including, salary, and benefits and payroll taxes), to provide custodial services for the Facilities.

Said reimbursement shall also include all actual costs incurred by the District. The District will invoice the Charter School quarterly for these services. The Charter School will pay each invoice within thirty (30) days of receipt. The Charter School shall provide any cleaning supplies and tools necessary for those District personnel to provide custodial services, including but not limited to toilet paper, soap, and paper towels.

b. “Deep Cleaning” Services. The parties also understand that, from time to time, additional custodial services may be required for “deep cleaning”. These services may occur on a bi-annual, annual or semi-annual basis and include, but are not limited to: high dusting and power washing. The Charter School will reimburse the District for these services in the same manner as “Routine” services as outlined above.

c. Additional Services. Should the Charter School require additional custodial services above the District’s standard practices and policies, or for special events, those costs to the Charter School will be assessed separately as requested.

d. Collective Bargaining Agreements. Utilization of District Staff will include agreement to comply with all of the Collective Bargaining Agreement terms and conditions, if any, of the respective member’s Bargaining Unit. This includes terms and conditions regarding seniority, placement, transfers, and termination.

Exhibit D2 – Custodial Services: Not Utilizing District Staff

- Charter School is responsible for the routine or regularly scheduled custodial services
- Facilities Oversight
 - Charter School staff custodial staff shall participate in all custodial trainings provided by the District
 - Charter School custodial staff to attend two District meetings per school year
 - Standard of care is the District FIT or other agreed upon standard
 - Charter School custodial staff to complete one written FIT report per school year per requirements of the District
 - District staff to have unannounced inspections and visits
 - Cost to Charter School: \$2,000 per school year for training and meetings
- Charter School is responsible for damages and costs incurred due to lack of appropriate routine maintenance
- Charter School agrees to have district staff and utilize Exhibit D1 if it fails to meet the agreed upon standard of care after a remediation period

Recommendation: The Board of Education is requested to approve purchase of *Benchmark Advance's Steps to Advance* for SDC grades 1-6 and *Striving Readers* for SDC Kinder as supporting materials. Additionally, the Board of Education is requested to approve the purchase of "one year packages" of Benchmark Advance Core Materials.

Background/Rationale: SCUSD has adopted new K-6 ELA/ELD instructional materials, *Benchmark Advance* that will be implemented in the 2018-2019 school year. The district has also determined that *Steps to Advance* materials are needed as a curricular materials accommodation for SDC classrooms to support students' growth to grade level standards. The *Steps to Advance* Write-In Student Texts provide gradual steps to complex text. Each week, lessons are designed to scaffold students as they engage with increasingly complex text. The *Kinder Striving Readers* texts are to support SDC Kinder students with accessible leveled texts to support growth.

Steps to Advance and *Striving Readers* materials will serve as a supplemental resource and will provide teachers and students with additional scaffolds that may be needed for students to access the core instructional materials and content standards.

Additionally, purchasing the "one-year grade level packages" will provide core materials to SDC classrooms with a savings coming from not having to purchase the Benchmark Advance "eight year" subscription pricing curriculum which would result in unused consumables in SDC classrooms. The savings for 57 classrooms is approx. \$78,000.

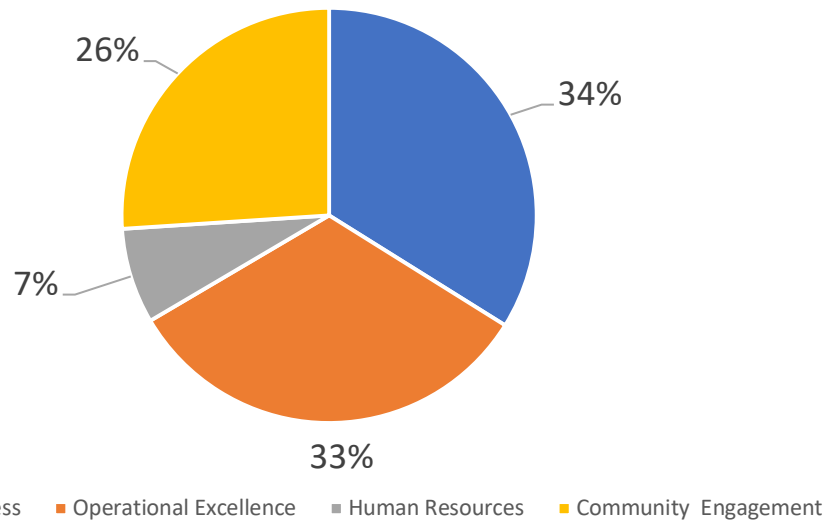
