

What is the BPSB x SCUSD Action Plan?

This five-year plan outlines action steps that SCUSD will take to set higher standards for students Individualized Education Programs (IEPs), reduce instances of bullying to foster a culture of acceptance, create inclusive classrooms, improve special education assessments, and reduce the number of students with disabilities, including Black students with disabilities, who are referred for behavioral issues. The Action Plan, developed in collaboration with the Black Parallel School Board and their appointed Independent Monitor, is a living document that may be refined over time based on data collection and analysis.

This Community Report is a condensed version of the Action Plan, and is meant to summarize its contents for parents, guardians, and community members.

Over the next five years, you may receive surveys and information about community engagement events or focus groups designed to collect feedback and ideas to help enhance our practices, align policies, strengthen behavior management, and improve the delivery of special education services in our schools.

Ultimately, this effort aims to build a more equitable educational system within SCUSD, where all students, especially those from historically marginalized groups, receive the support and opportunities they need to succeed.
