What is the Consolidated Application?

The Consolidated Application (ConApp) is used by the California Department of Education (CDE) to distribute categorical funds from various state and federal programs to county offices, school districts, and direct-funded charter schools and to collect data.

The Consolidated Application is completed in three parts:

<u>Part 1: Spring Release</u> – May-June: Submitted by the District to document participation in categorical programs and provide assurances that the district will comply with the legal requirements of each program. Part I is approved by School Board and DAC. Program entitlements are determined by formulas contained in the laws that created the programs.

<u>Fall Release</u> is submitted in October of each year. This will be an opportunity for the various CDE program offices to collect data that is needed before the Winter Release is due.

<u>Part II: Winter Release</u> – December-January: The application is submitted in January of each year and contains the district entitlements for each funded program. Out of each state and federal program entitlement, districts allocate funds for indirect costs of administration, for programs operated by the district office, and for programs operated at schools.
