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College Readiness Block Grant Overview

One-time funding:

- Based upon unduplicated students in grades 9-12
- Expires June 30, 2019
- Serves students in grades 9-12
- Focuses on increasing student enrollment in higher education and completion of undergraduate degrees within four years
- Requires a plan that is Board approved and outlines:
 - Alignment to LCAP
 - How needs of unduplicated students will be met
 - How impact will be measured

Measures of Effectiveness

Indicators/Metrics to Monitor

Increase the percent of all students as well as unduplicated students, underrepresented racial and ethnic student groups, and students with disabilities who...

- Successfully complete all 9th grade core classes with a “C” or better
- Passing score on an AP or IB Exam
- Take the SAT exam
- Participate in at least one college visit
- Take at least one AP, IB, or Dual Enrollment course and pass with a “C” or better
- Successfully complete University of California (UC) a-g course requirements
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Enroll in and pass a senior year bridge course with a “C” or better
