6:00-6:10	Welcome and Introductions	Teresa Hernandez (DELAC President)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teresa Hernandez, DELAC Chair, welcomed everyone to the 3rd DELAC Meeting of the school year 2015-16. • Everyone in the attendance introduced him/herself and the school(s) he/she is representing. In attendance were parents, teachers, principals and community members. • DELAC Vice President Leo Aguirre has resigned his post and the position is now open. Gabriela Sanchez, a parent, volunteered to be DELAC Vice President. Those in attendance approved of her appointment.
6:10-6:15	Approval of Minutes	Laura Rios (DELAC Secretary)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The minutes from January 20, 2016 were asked to be reviewed by all for approval. A motion was moved to accept the minutes, a 2nd was voiced and thus, the minutes were approved.
6:15-7:15	What is LCAP?	Cathy Morrison (Coordinator, LCAP/Strategic Plan)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The law that was signed by Governor Brown on July 1, 2013 is called Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). With LCFF, districts can choose how to allocate funds based on the needs of the students. • Time was given to each table to discuss on what is needed to be known about LCAP. Questions were posted on the charts by those in attendance. For example: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - How can we get a tutor for homework support? - What kind of programs does the LCAP support? - How the money is generated and how can it be spent? • There are three levels of funding: LCFF Base Funding – all districts received a ‘per head’ amount, based on attendance; LCFF Supplemental Funds – allocated by the number of low income, English Learners, homeless and foster youth; LCFF Concentration Grant – additional amount for districts with over 55% of students receiving free/reduced price meals. • Tables were provided with opportunities to talk about LCAP.
7:15-7:40	Pathways to Success	Paula Hanzel Interim Executive Director, Sacramento Pathways to Success	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sacramento Pathways to Success is a Pre-k to 16 partnership. It focuses on building college and career ready students, ensures that all students are ready for post-secondary learning, provides seamless supports for students Pre k-12, Pre k-14, and Pre k-16, while fulfilling the promise of all students ready for a post-secondary learning experiences. • Paula shared a few of Pathways to Success’ plans and what it has done so far for school districts and its students. She also defined the readiness as well as the eligibility of students. • Cost of college was also explained in regards to finding help through financial aides, scholarships, and loans as a last resort. Next year’s seniors can apply starting in October 2016.
