# Introduction

- July 1, 2013 Governor Brown signed historic school funding legislation
- As part of Local Control Funding Formula, districts are required to develop, adopt, and **annually update** a three year Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) beginning July 1, 2014. This plan connects districts' goals and actions to plans for spending LCFF dollars
- LCAP is LCFF's vehicle for transparency and engagement

## LCAP: Goal #1



**Goal #1: Increase the percent of students who are on track to graduate college and career ready.**

**79% Overall** agreed, or mostly agreed, that this goal should continue to guide our district.

### **Themes from feedback:**

- More English Language Development instructional time
- Students need intervention, and other academic supports
- Importance of counselors

## LCAP: Goal #2



**Goal #2: Schools will provide students with a clean, healthy, physically and emotionally safe learning environment.**

**88% overall agreed, or mostly agreed that this goal should continue to guide our district.**

### **Themes from Feedback:**

- Need a full-time nurse
- Would like arts back in the classroom

## LCAP: Goal #3

**Goal #3: Parents, family and community stakeholders will become more fully engaged as partners in the education of students in SCUSD.**



**94% overall agreed, or mostly agreed that this goal should continue to guide our district.**

**Theme from feedback:**

- Need training for parents to be able to help students with homework based on the new Common Core [State Standards].

- Rate of teacher mis-assignments
- Student Access to standards-aligned instructional resources and materials
- Facilities

## ★ Parental Involvement

- Efforts to seek parent input
- Promotion of parental participation and leadership

## ★ Implementation of CCSS

- CCSS implementation results for all students, including English learners

## ★ Course Access

- Student access and enrollment in courses of study

## ★ Other Student Outcomes

- Other indicators of student performance in courses of study. May include performance and other exams.

# Expenditures

- Funds are allocated in two ways:
  - on a district-wide basis (called “LEA-wide”)
  - by School Site Councils (called “school-wide”)
- School plans (called Single Plan for Student Achievement or SPSA) are reflected in the LCAP
- The LCAP reflects goals that best fit students at each school site

# Guiding Questions in Reviewing the Plan

- How have the actions/services addressed the needs of all pupils, and all the subgroups of pupils (including but not limited to English Learners, low-income students and foster youth)?
- Did those actions/services result in desired outcomes?
- What progress has been achieved towards the goal?
- What changes might be made as a result of the review of this progress?
