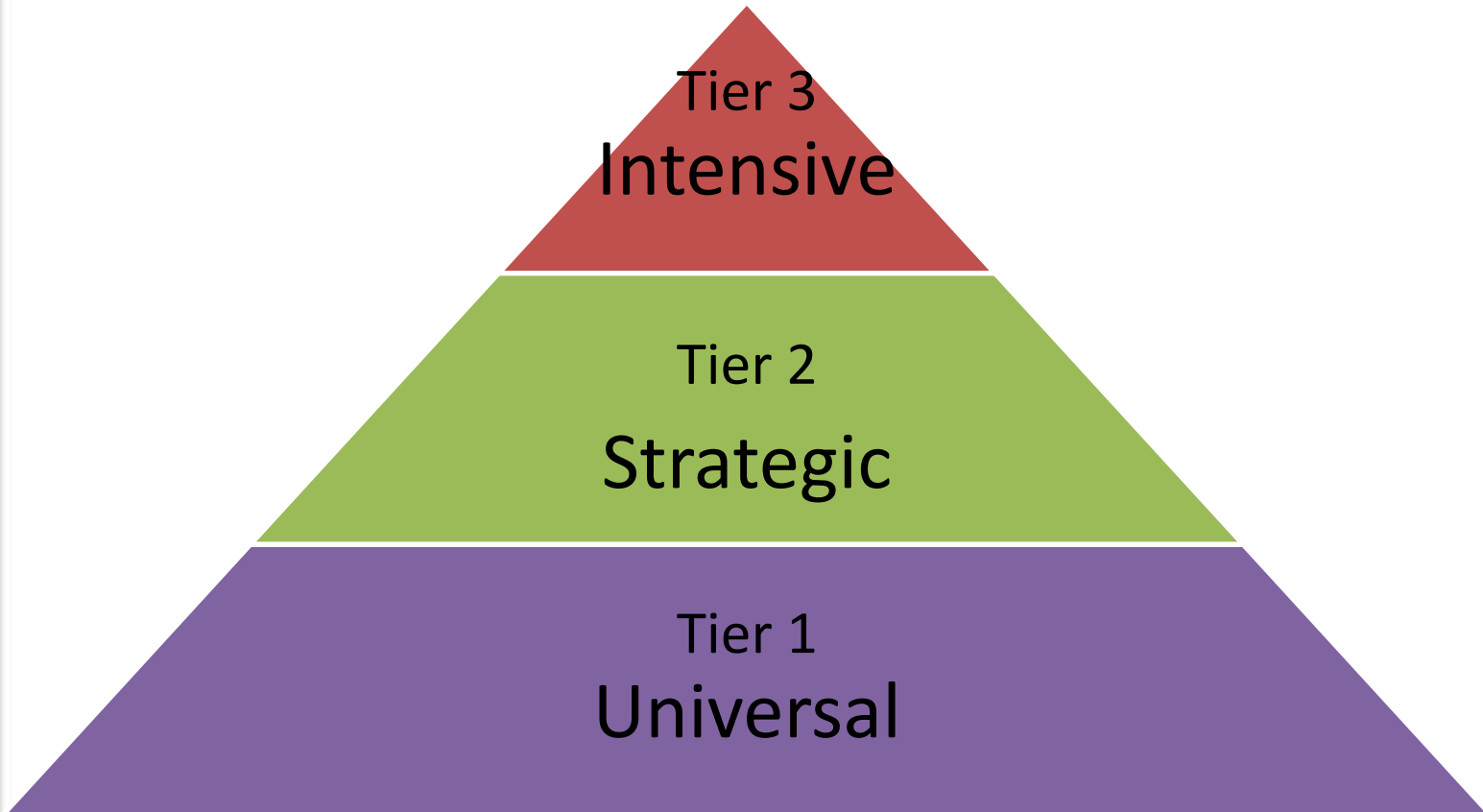


Family and Community Engagement Office

- Build school sites' capacity to provide intervention, prevention and follow-up support for their students and families.

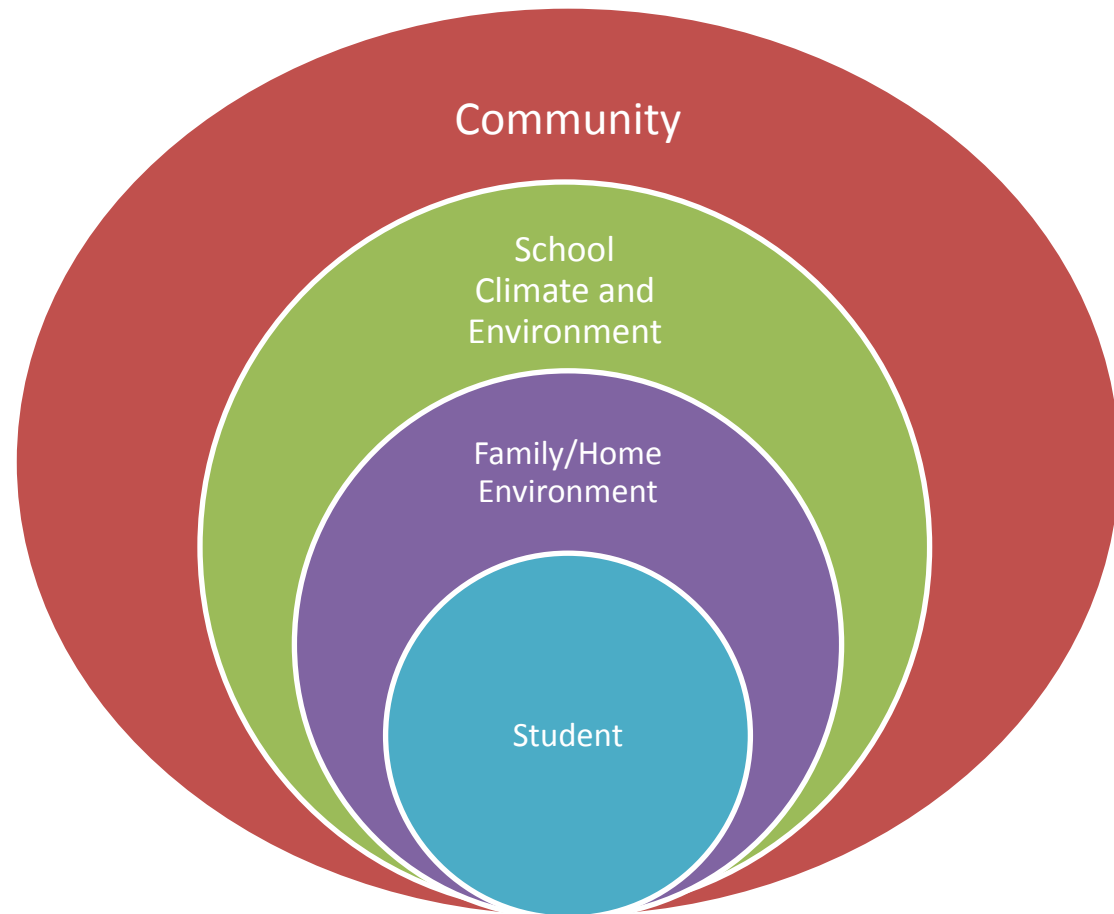

- Expanded from 18 to 47 sites
- 100% of Teachers at Jedediah Smith Elementary School participated in a home visit during the 2010-11 school year
