The Connect Center will provide social, emotional and health coverage resources and support to SCUSD students, families and staff. The Connect Center will respond to approximately 350 requests for services. Funding to support the academic achievement of Native American Indian students by providing after school tutoring and evening programs with an emphasis on mathematics interventions; language arts and/or writing; family literacy; exam preparation; and Native American Studies for students and families. Funding may also be used for staff professional development.	\$36,694 No Match
