The curriculum is made up of three DP core and six subject groups. The three core elements are: Theory of knowledge, in which students reflect on the nature of knowledge and on how we know what we claim to know. The extended essay, which is an independent, self-directed piece of research, finishing with a 4,000-word paper. Creativity, activity, service, in which students complete a project related to those three concepts. The six subject groups are: Studies in language and literature Language acquisition Individuals and societies Sciences Mathematics The arts
STEM FOCUS Project-based Learning	 IB curriculum focuses on STEM as an important perspective from which to consider integrated teaching and learning in concepts and skills related to science, technology, engineering and mathematics. Each year, students engage in at least one collaboratively planned interdisciplinary unit that involves at least two subject groups. Students also complete a long-term project, where they decide what they want to learn about, identify what they already know, discovering what they will need to know to complete the project, and create a proposal or criteria for completing it. 	
COMMUNITY Service	Community service projects encourage students to reflect on their learning and the outcomes of their work – key skills that prepare them for success in further study, the workplace and the community. The community service projects are student-centered and age-appropriate, and they enable students to engage in practical explorations through a cycle of inquiry, action and reflection.

- Students who attend KCIA in 8th grade may continue into our high school by submitting an *Intent to Return* by the end of January.
- Students who attend other schools must complete the specialty application, and provide an essay, transcripts, and two recommendations from educators at their current school and will be admitted based on availability and a review of the documentation.
