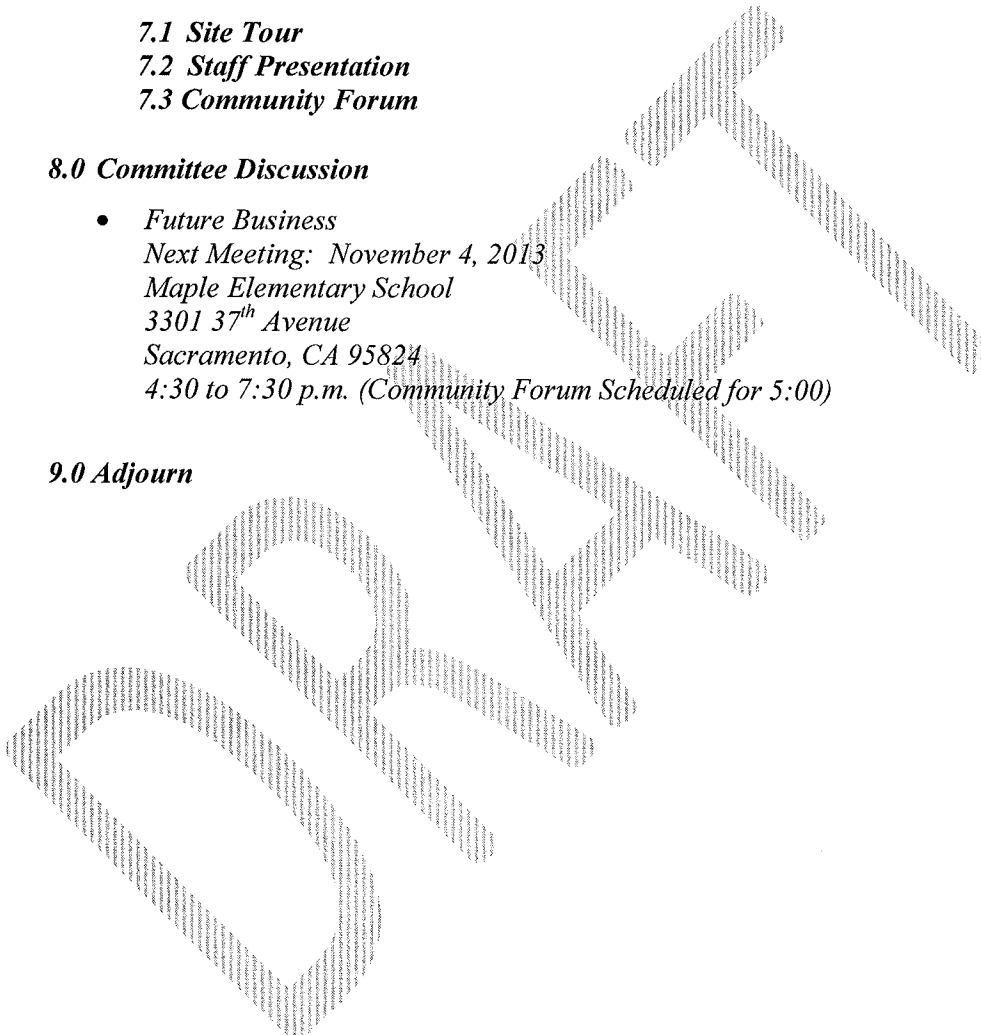

7.0 Community Forum

7.1 The Committee toured the Fruit Ridge site.

7.2 Staff Presentation by Mary Hardin Young from former Fruit Ridge Principal inquiry: *Existing programs and support at Fruit Ridge Elementary: Sacramento State University Symphony and Strings Program, Elderly Christmas Spirit Group, Azteca Group, Active Garden Group.*

Neighborhood interests: Pre-kinder or early kinder classes, pre-school, social services outreach counseling, community care for the garden, music program.

7.3 Public comment from:

- *Doug Macpherson – President of the Sacramento Youth Symphony Music Program at Fruit Ridge. They bring their program to schools. They want to bring their program back to this school but there needs to be a school housed here for their program.*
- *Mandy Carrillo- School Garden. The location should have a school or community center. They are proposing a walking field trip destination. This garden would be a garden hub within the District. They could use one to two classrooms. There is an existing garden on the campus and it is being maintained by the community.*
- *Stephanie Miranda – Wants the school to be re-opened.*
- *Lanae Davis (District employee) – Fruit Ridge living laboratory.*
- *Dr. Sahba – Started the garden program. Wants the living laboratory.*
- *Dr. Dennis Mah – Suggested that there is enough interest in the area that a charter school could be established. He suggested that holding off a year so a petition from an interested charter could be filed. Dr. Mah suggested selling Oakridge to Christian Brothers and use the money to renovate Fruit Ridge.*
- *Arthur Aleman – Wanted the Committee to understand exactly what Stephanie Miranda was saying to the Committee. He wanted to be sure that the message would be taken back to the Board.*

Edward Camargo suggested that there be a Spanish translator at the next 7-11 Committee Meeting week located at Joseph Bonnheim.

Vice Chair Michael Minnick asked if the only way to save the garden would be to not recommend to surplus.

There are no funds at the District level to keep this garden operating.

Cathy Allen stated that the Committee could opt to surplus it then the recommendation could be to lease it to group or a non-profit that could venture into a partnership allowing the garden to stay and be maintained. Proper insurance would be required.

If it is decided to not surplus, then it could be recommended that the District try to find a group that embraces the idea (garden) to partner with to keep the garden going.
