Announcements:

New PAC member Daisy Gonzales, appointee from Area 1, introduced herself.

Presentation on Guidance and Counseling (Christina Espinosa, Director):

- Looking at the articulated measures of success, subject borderline students are the first priority
- Sacramento Accelerated Academy (satellite site for credit recovery) sends progress reports weekly
 - Online courses are not connected to the Student Information System
 - Ultimate goal is to provide more students access to completing the a-g pathway
- The district wants to get better at responding to student need - so fewer students need to go to credit recovery
- The key is passing 9th grade English and Math classes
- Tier 1 support is feeding into specialty programs

Q: What about kids in the 5th - 8th grades who are behind?

A: Using a Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) and the Early Identification and Intervention System (EIS) can help to identify students earlier.

Q: How are parents advised? It feels like the communication focuses on the deficits.

A: Every student's plan is different - it is customized based on the business process

Q: What about students on an IEP?

A: There is a case manager at every site.

Reasonable accommodation: Parents don't know the process. Discussion about parent outreach, and identification of language capabilities.
