## **RESOLUTION NO. 2700**

## **RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF STATEWIDE EDUCATION FUNDING INITIATIVES**

**WHEREAS**, two statewide education funding initiatives seek to qualify for the November 6, 2012 general election; and

**WHEREAS**, one initiative, entitled "The Schools and Local Public Safety Protection Act of 2012", is supported by Governor Jerry Brown, the California Federation of Teachers (CFT), and the California Teachers Association (CTA); and

**WHEREAS**, the other initiative, originally entitled "Our Children, Our Future: Local Schools and Early Education Investment Act" and subsequently entitled "Our Children, Our Future: Local Schools and Early Education Investment and Bond Debt Reduction Act", is supported by Molly Munger and the California State Parent Teacher Association (PTA); and

**WHEREAS**, both initiatives would benefit public schools by lessening, but not eliminating, the impacts of drastic budget cuts to school districts throughout the State of California; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board of Education of the Sacramento City Unified School District has been forced to make budget reductions in the amount of \$107 million over the past three school years; and

**WHEREAS**, the District's current budget reductions for the 2012-13 school year will result in numerous personnel reductions, program reductions, and services essential to educating its children, including the increase of class sizes, the elimination of home to school transportation, and the elimination of sports, yearbook, drama, cheerleading, newspaper, speech, debate activities and libraries; and

**WHEREAS**, assuming both initiatives qualify for the November ballot, and based on the fact that either initiative, if passed by the electorate, would serve to mitigate, in part, the drastic budget cuts impacting the District.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Sacramento City Unified School District Board of Education urges voters to support the initiative of their choice to mitigate the continuing budget freefall of California's public education system to the detriment of the District's students for whom the members of the Board of Education are elected to serve and for whom the District's educators and support staff are dedicated to serve.
