

SACRAMENTO COUNTY EMERGENCY SHELTER REGISTRATION (Effective 10/2/17)

Families experiencing homelessness can self-register for emergency shelter services by visiting https://dhaservices.saccounty.net/efs and answering a few questions. Families will be contacted within three (3) business days of completing the self-registration process & will be offered interim case management until shelter is available. Shelters will offer onsite kennels for families that include pets. Register on a personal device or at a DHA site below which has on-site computer services & resources:
