- SCUSD is planning a return to full time instruction for the 2021-2022 school year. This commitment was made as a part of a <u>Board Resolution</u> passed on April 22, 2021.
- Given the rise in COVID-19 cases over the past few months, concerns are growing around how to safely return together.



Layers of Safety – Return to Health plan

- On August 6th, the Sacramento County Department of Public Health released supplemental school guidance on best practices for schools in Sacramento County.

 - Strong emphasis on vaccination efforts for all age-eligible residents SCUSD continues to host vaccine clinics every Wednesday 4-7pm at the Serna Center https://www.scusd.edu/vaccinations



- Highlights of the Guidance include:
 - Assigned Seating (as much as possible)
 - Music activities must be conducted outdoors when face masking cannot be used.
 - To reduce gathering and close contacts virtual hosting of events like Back to School Night, Open House, Rallies, etc.
 - Mealtime: Outdoor eating is strongly advised and have consistent seating in order to support contact tracing
 - Outdoor Activities: Masks are not required outdoors, however masking outdoors is required during close contact activities, such as passing periods
 - Rapid Testing: SCUSD has rapid antigen testing and PCR testing at all school sites & SERNA Center – families only need to register one time

School sites will conduct as much of the orientation as possible virtually (either pre-recorded or through an email) so that the site visit is targeted and intentional.

If age/developmentally appropriate, students will attend on their own to limit the number of people gathering and limit potential exposure.

Orientations will be largely outside and grouped into physically distanced groups. A parent/guardian will need to attend for a TK/Kinder student, as well as a student with medical needs or disabilities that require care.

For TK or Kinder, sites will use a rotating schedule that allows for site visit throughout a set time period (limiting to just a few visitors at a time).

Health Concerns

For the 2021-2022 School Year, the California Department of Education is requiring that Independent study be offered to students whose health would be put at risk by in-person instruction, as determined by the parent/guardian of the student. This is known as AB 130.

AB 130 does not change the law for students receiving special education services



AB 130

- Identifying whether independent study is an appropriate placement for a special education student is still an IEP team decision
- IEP teams should make determinations on an individualized basis, based on the student's:
 - Present levels of functional performance
 - Areas of educational need
 - Goals
 - Services and supports needed
 - Least restrictive environment

Clearly document the IEP team's determination and the reason for



Process if requesting Independent Study

If a family requests Independent Study for their student (on an IEP), SCUSD will:

- Send a Prior Written Notice (PWN) offering to convene an IEP to discuss request.
- Convene an IEP meeting and clearly document IEP team determination.
- Send a Prior Written Notice (PWN) reiterating IEP team's decision and rationale.



Not Satisfied with IEP team's decision?

- This may be new to many IEP teams. The process of data-based decision making for the purpose of identifying whether a student with a disability can independently make educational benefit through an independent study model may be s stretch.
- As much as possible, SCUSD will work with families through an Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) process to find common ground and an agreeable resolution.
