Follow these steps to find out if your student is meeting grade level standards in English Language Arts & Math

STEP 1

Ask your school these questions...

- What are the grade level expectations at this time of year?
- Is my student making adequate progress? How do we know?
- What are my student's strengths and areas where improvement is needed?
- How are you supporting my child to reach grade level standards in Language Arts and/or math? How can I support my child to reach these standards?
- What's the plan to challenge a student already on grade level? How can I help?
- How will we know if our plan is working?
- When will we come together again to check on it?

STEP 2

Monitor your student's results

In addition to checking your student's report cards and progress reports, ask your child's school at least once every trimester (for students in grades K-6) or every quarter (for students in grades 7-12) how your student performed on the following:

Foundational Reading Skills (Grades K-2, as needed)
 English Language Arts District Common Assessment
 Mathematics District Common Assessment

STEP 3

Log-in and check Infinite Campus

What state assessment results you should be looking for	When
English Language Arts & Math Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBAC) / California Alternate Assessment (CAA) for Grades 3-8 & 11	March - May
Physical Fitness (Grades 5, 7 & 9)	Feb - April
California Science Test (CAST) / California Alternate Assessment (CAA) for Grades 5, 8, 11 & 12	March - May
