Status Report: District Transportation for Students with Disabilities

CAC General Meeting October 18, 2022

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Background:

The SCUSD Community Advisory Committee has previously been informed that the *majority* of the **students with disabilities (SWD)** who receive transportation services are students attending a Special Day Class (SDC) at a site that is NOT their home school.

The district is required to *offer* transportation services to students who receive services at a site that is not their home school.

The Council of Great City Schools reviewed services for students with disabilities in SCUSD in 2017 and found the district over uses Special Day Classes to educate SWD. The report, also known as "the audit," can be found online.

Overview

- Over 6,500 students qualify for special education and related services in the Sacramento City Unified School District (SCUSD).
- Approximately 1,700 students with disabilities receive transportation services as part of their Individualized Education Plans.


